





NEW ENGLAND EXPLORER

BOSTON - ARRIVAL

Day 1: Arrive at Logan International Airport. Pick up your rental car and proceed to your hotel. Enjoy your evening at leisure.

BOSTON

Day 2: A full day free to explore Boston, the cradle of American liberty. The Revolutionary era comes to life along the Freedom Trail walking route. Visit the haunts of the patriots who stoked the fires of democracy throughout the Colonies.

BOSTON - COASTAL MAINE

Day 3: Along the route north of Boston lies almost four centuries of history, as well as some of the coast's finest beaches and seascapes. First stop is Salem, the location of the infamous witch trials. Then drive along the coast to the charming harbor towns of Gloucester and Rockport. Enjoy the oldtime seaport atmosphere of Portsmouth, New Hampshire and its wealth of historic buildings before crossing into Maine. Pass through Kennebunkport, summer home to Presidents, and enjoy exploring Portland, Maine's largest city. Driving Distance: 115 MI / 185 KM

COASTAL MAINE - WHITE MOUNTAINS

Day 4: Your drive today takes you inland towards the spectacular scenery of the White Mountains, the "rooftop of New England," a landscape dotted with historic villages and enchanting covered bridges. En route, experience breathtaking views of mountain ranges and pristine forests. Driving Distance: 115 mi / 185 km

WHITE MOUNTAINS - STOWE

Day 5: Today, traverse the White Mountains that divide the New England states of New Hampshire and Vermont. The mountains are home to bears, moose, wild turkey, and deer. This route takes you through some of New England's most beautiful scenery. Drive by Lyndonville and see Willey's General Store in Greensboro before continuing through Craftsbury, a Grandma Moses kind of

village, to Stowe. See picture-perfect villages and some of Vermont's famous covered bridges. Driving Distance: 130 mi / 210 km

STOWE - GREEN MOUNTAINS - CONNECTICUT RIVER VALLEY

Day 6: Your drive today takes you alongside the Green Mountains of Vermont, part of the Appalachian Mountain range that stretches from Quebec in the north to Alabama in the south, and through the Connecticut River Valley. Step into Old Sturbridge Village and find yourself transported back in time. In historic households and shops, at waterpowered mills and on working farms, explore the everyday tasks and seasonal celebrations of early 19th-century New England. Driving Distance: 180 mi / 285 km

CONNECTICUT RIVER VALLEY - CAPE COD

Day 7: Journey south towards the Massachusetts coast. Many of America's most prominent families - from the Astors to the Vanderbilts - have summered in Newport. Many of their homes are now preserved and open for tours. Continue along the coast on your way to the Cape. Explore magnificent Cape Cod with its high cliffs, rolling dunes, broad beaches, miles of walking trails, picturesque villages and delicious seafood. This peninsula is a beloved vacation spot for visitors and natives alike. Stop in Plymouth, a living panorama of Pilgrim and Colonial times and see the Mayflower II.

Driving Distance: 188 mi / 300 km







BOSTON - ARRIVAL

Day 1: Arrive at Logan International Airport. Pick up your rental car and proceed to your hotel. Enjoy your evening at leisure, exploring the city.

BOSTON

Day 2: Boston is the largest city in New England and one of the oldest in the United States, founded by Puritan colonists in 1630. Steeped with history from the American Revolution, here you can explore any portion of the 4 km (2.5 miles) Freedom Trail which starts at Boston Common and passes 16 of the city's historic landmarks including: Faneuil Hall (a vibrant marketplace), Paul Revere's home (from which he made his famous "midnight ride"), the Old North Church, and the USS Constitution ("Old Ironsides") in Boston Harbor, the oldest warship of the U.S. Navy. Visit the home of the patriots who claimed this city in the name of freedom fighters.

BOSTON - SALEM - PORTSMOUTH - KENNEBUNKPORT

Day 3: Along the route north of Boston lies almost four centuries of history, as well as some of the coast's finest beaches and seascapes. First stop is Salem, the location of the infamous witch trials. Then drive along the coast to the charming harbor towns of Gloucester and Rockport. Enjoy the oldtime seaport atmosphere of Portsmouth, New Hampshire and its wealth of historic buildings before crossing into Maine. Your destination today is the popular resort of Kennebunkport, a haven for writers and artists. Driving Distance: 90 MI / 150 KM

KENNEBUNKPORT - WISCASSET - BAR HARBOR

Day 4: Travel along the beautiful Maine Coast to Bar Harbor. Along the way you will pass through quaint fishing villages where fisherman mark their grounds with colorful bouys. Don't miss the chance to try a lobster or cup of clam chowder. Driving Distance: 210 MI / 340 KM

BAR HARBOR - ACADIA NATIONAL PARK - BAR HARBOR

Day 5: A full day to explore one of the oldest and most beautiful national parks in America. Discover soaring peaks, dramatic glacier-carved valleys, clear lakes, and the rugged shoreline with the only true fjord on the U.S. Atlantic coast. Witness the area's natural wonders from Park Loop Road or drive to the summit of Cadillac Mountain, at 1,530 feet (466 meters), the highest point on the U.S. Atlantic seaboard.

BAR HARBOR - WHITE MOUNTAINS

Day 6: Your drive today takes you inland towards the spectacular scenery of the White Mountains, the "rooftop of New England," a landscape dotted with historic villages and enchanting covered bridges. En route, experience breathtaking views of mountain ranges and pristine forests. Driving Distance: 230 MI / 370 KM

WHITE MOUNTAINS - VERMONT'S NORTHEAST KINGDOM - STOWE

Day 7: Today, traverse the White Mountains that divide the New England states of New Hampshire and Vermont. The route takes you through some of New England's most beautiful scenery. Drive by Lyndonville and see Willey's General Store in Greensboro before continuing through Craftsbury, a Grandma Moses kind of village, to Stowe.

Driving Distance: 120 MI / 200 KM

STOWE - GREEN MOUNTAINS - THE BERKSHIRES

Day 8: Continue south along Route 100, where you will take in some of the most spectacular scenery in Vermont's Green Mountains. With their dense forests, the mountains are home to bears, moose, wild turkey, and deer. See picture-perfect villages and some of Vermont's famous covered bridges before crossing into Massachusetts' Berkshires, known for their rural beauty and cultural assets. Overnight in the college town of Williamstown.

Driving Distance: 160 MI / 260 KM

THE BERKSHIRES - LENOX - NEWPORT

Day 9: Drive south and pass through a series of wonderful little towns, including Lenox, summer home for the Boston Symphony Orchestra. See Hancock Shaker Village near Pittsfield before continuing to the storied little city of Newport, Rhode Island, once a prosperous colonial seaport. Driving Distance: 180 MI / 290 KM

NEWPORT - CAPE COD

Day 10: America's most prominent families - from the Astors to the Vanderbilts - have summered in Newport. Some of their spectacular vacation homes are open for viewing. After sightseeing, continue along the coast on your way to Cape Cod. Driving Distance: 100 MI / 160 KM

CAPE COD

Day 11: A full day to explore magnificent Cape Cod with its high cliffs, rolling dunes, broad beaches, miles of walking trails, picturesque villages and delicious seafood. This peninsula is a beloved vacation spot for visitors and natives alike. Stop in Plymouth, a living panorama of Pilgrim and Colonial times and see the Mayflower II.

CAPE COD - BOSTON - DEPARTURE

Day 12: Today, leave Cape Cod and drive back to Boston. Return your car at the airport before your departure flight.





LIGHTHOUSES & LOBSTERS: THE NORTHEASTERN EXPLORER

BOSTON - ARRIVAL

Day 1: Explore Boston's Seaport on foot and view the Boston Lighthouse which holds a head light visible for sixteen miles "as a reminder of the inextinguishable American spirit." To take a closer look, there are several guided harbor tours (optional, fees apply) to get you there. Tonight, enjoy dinner at Boston's world famous waterfront. Weather permitting, may we suggest a harborside evening stroll to see the moonlight dancing on the water.

BOSTON - GLOUCESTER - YORK/KENNEBUNKPORT

Day 2: Today travel north to the rocky shores of Gloucester, originally settled shortly after Plymouth Colony, and made famous as the movie setting for the blockbuster "The Perfect Storm" starring George Clooney. Take a stroll on Rocky Neck's Historic Art Trail, relive the legends of artists & authors of the 19th and 20th centuries. Next is Rockport where you may photograph the iconic red fishing shack: "Motif Number One," symbolic of New England maritime life. Here, may we suggest a picnic lunch on Long Beach while gazing upon Thacher Island's Twin Lighthouses made famous by artist Winslow Homer, the only surviving multiple lights of the U.S. Coast. After lunch, cross to York where you can see Maine's southernmost light, Cape Neddick Lighthouse, & gaze at Boon Island Lighthouse just offshore. Your destination today is Kennebunkport, summer home for many U.S. Presidents.

Driving Distance: 128 MI / 206 KM

YORK/KENNEBUNKPORT - PORTLAND - ROCKLAND

Day 3: Today your journey continues along mid-Coastal Maine. A short drive along Main Street brings you to the picturesque fishing village of Cape Porpoise Harbor and view of the Goat Island Lighthouse. Next, Old Orchard Beach awaits. Although its amusement park and famous pier have drawn visitors for centuries, it is best known for its long stretches of soft golden sand. Here, you may wish to pick up a box of locally made sweet salt-water taffy, dip your toes in the cool Atlantic waters, try your luck at a game of chance or take a walk along the boardwalk. Continue to Portland, Maine's largest city, originally a colonial seaport. Stroll cobblestone streets, visit eclectic art galleries and perhaps enjoy a bowl of piping hot New England clam "chow-dah" alongside Casco Bay. Finish your exploration by visiting the Portland Head Lighthouse. To the north, you'll pass through the town of Thomaston and by the aging penitentiary which inspired for the movie "Shawshank Redemption" starring Morgan Freeman. Your drive continues today to the "Lobster Capital of the World," Rockland, Maine. Here you may view Maine landscape paintings made famous by Andrew Wyeth at the Farnsworth Art Museum (optional, fees apply). Enjoy a stroll at peaceful Rockland Harbor and walk along the breakwater path to see Rockland Breakwater Lighthouse.

Driving Distance: 126 MI / 202 KM

ROCKLAND - BAR HARBOR

Day 4: Just north of Rockland, the towns of Rockport and Camden offer some of the best views in the state. Camden, the backdrop for the film "Peyton Place," is a quaint town by the sea. Here, you may wish to take a sightseeing cruise, go kayaking, or take a day sail around Camden Harbor (optional, fees apply) to see Curtis Island Lighthouse. Your destination today is Bar Harbor, on Mt. Desert Island, home to Acadia National Park. Dotting the island's entrance, traditional lobster pounds with huge outdoor boiling cauldrons cook crustaceans to perfection. This evening, may we suggest a stroll along the quaint streets of Bar Harbor, gazing at the small island for which the city was named, Bar Island, accessible by foot, at low tide only, across Frenchman Bay. Driving Distance: 79 MI / 127 KM

ACADIA NATIONAL PARK (ENTRANCE FEES MAY APPLY)

2 NIGHTS | D TOUR CITY

Day 5: Explore the oldest national park east of the Mississippi River. Locals say that in Acadia National Park you can "catch fish with one hand while picking wild blueberries with the other." During select periods of the year, Acadia runs a free shuttle service through the park to see the vast attractions without the hassles of parking. Cadillac Mountain, the highest point on the eastern seaboard north of Brazil, a perfect spot

for sunrises, sunsets & star gazing. Also along Park Loop Road, you may stop at Sand Beach. Proximal Thunder Hole is a small inlet carved out of the rocks where waves rush in & clap like thunder. Additionally worth noting is the Jordan Pond House, located on an original carriage trail. This is a favorite spot to enjoy tea & a world renowned Jordan Pond Popover. Time permitting you may wish to explore the Bass Harbor Lighthouse. Driving Distance: 181 MI / 291 KM

BAR HARBOR - BAY OF FUNDY - ST. ANDREWS, CANADA

Day 6: Today travel to West Quoddy Head where a striking red-and-white striped lighthouse marks the easternmost point in the United States. Drive along the Sunrise Coast, where the first morning light hits the USA and the coastal rim's stunning granite bedrock meets a restless sea. A short drive takes you across the Franklin D. Roosevelt Memorial International Bridge to Canada's Campobello Island, a favorite destination for the U.S.'s 32nd President. Today Campobello Provincial Park holds his expansive residence, estate gardens, walking trails, and provides a refreshing stop. Return to the U.S. for a drive along the spectacular Bay of Fundy, currently in the running to be one of the earth's new seven natural wonders. The Bay hosts the highest tides in the world as the 12-hour tidal period can see changes to the height of a five story building. The Bay of Fundy is also home to many species of rare and endangered whales. Crossing the international border again, you'll reach your final destination: St. Andrews-By-The-Sea. Canada's oldest seaside resort town. Driving Distance: 177 MI / 260 KM

ST. ANDREWS, CANADA - BANGOR

Day 7: Enjoy a leisurely morning in picturesque St. Andrews. You may wish to visit Kingsbrae Horticulture Garden (admission fee applies) or walk along the waterfront. Returning to the international border, you'll pass through the "Chocolate Capital of Canada," St. Stephen. Then, follow "the Airline" to Bangor. The route, formerly the fastest stagecoach trail from the Canadian border, passes through spruce forests and blueberry barrens. This route is one of the most scenic through Maine's inland timberland country. Arriving in Bangor, once the Lumber Capital of the World, a 31-foot-tall statue of lumberjack Paul Bunyan greets you. This afternoon you may visit Cole Land Transportation Museum (optional, fees apply), explore the picturesque 660acre campus of the University of Maine or walk in the footsteps of novelist and movie writer Stephen King, a long-time Bangor resident, whose Victorian mansion home with wrought iron ghouls graces a nearby neighborhood. This evening you may wish to stroll the banks of the tranquil Kenduskeag. Driving Distance: 153 MI / 246 KM

BANGOR - KITTERY - PORTSMOUTH

Day 8: Journey south through Maine's capital, Augusta, to Kittery. The area is known for its many shopping outlet stores; and for its seaport. From historic Fort Foster, enjoy a photo stop on the battery's grassy knoll overlooking Whaleback Lighthouse. Continue south to Portsmouth, New Hampshire, the seacoast's economic center rich with maritime history. Tonight you may wish to enjoy a classic seafood favorite in historic downtown on the banks of Portsmouth's Piscataqua River. Driving Distance: 180 MI / 289 KM

PORTSMOUTH - CAPE COD

Day 9: Today, your journey takes you to Cape Cod to explore its rolling sand dunes, dramatic sea cliffs, and picturesque villages. You may also wish to take the ferry (optional, fee applies) to Martha's Vineyard and step back in time while visiting this Victorian era summer resort island. Alternately, you may wish to visit one of the many of the Cape's famous lighthouses such as the Sandy Neck Lighthouse or the Bass River Lighthouse.

Driving Distance: 127 MI / 204 KM

CAPE COD - BOSTON - DEPARTURE

Today, drive back to Boston. You may wish to stop in Sandwich, formerly one of the largest U.S. producers of glass, and visit one of the numerous glass studios, art galleries, rare book stores and antique shops. Or en route you may visit Plymouth Plantation (admission fees apply), a living panorama of Pilgrim times and see the Mayflower II.

Driving Distance: 80 MI / 128 KM

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
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

Enjoy cycling some (or all) of the 27 mile of Park Loop Road of Acadia National Park and feel the calm ocean waters at Sand Beach. Other observation points you can encounter along the ride include Otter Cliff offering one of the most spectacular sceneries along the North Atlantic Seaboard and Thunder Hole where you can witness the thundering waves go up against the rocky shores. Driving Distance: 174 MI / 280 KM

BAR HARBOR

Day 6: Following your trip to Acadia National Park, experience more at around Bar Harbor by getting a taste of the city's savory cuisine. Restaurants in the city will keep you wanting more with their delicious seafood and farm-to-table dining options.

DRIVE AMERICA

You can also choose to partake in a cooking class and tasting with the Ambrosia Cooking School located a short walk from Bar Harbor Town Pier or take a culinary tour with Maine Foodie Tours providing you with an interactive, entertaining, and education adventure (optional).

BAR HARBOR - WHITE MOUNTAINS

Day 7: After your seafood filled experience at Bar Harbor, you will continue on to Jackson, New Hampshire where you will get the opportunity to enjoy the White Mountains covering about a quarter of the state as well as a portion of Maine. You can spend your day exploring the Pinkham Notch Trailhead on a hiking trip. The trailhead will provide you with access to the East side of the Presidential range as well as scenic stops at the Lost Pond and Square Ledge. **Driving Distance: 234 MI / 377 KM**

WHITE MOUNTAINS

Day 8: Today you have the option to continue your adventures at the White Mountains and experience the summit of Mount Washington. You can choose to make your way with a scenic train ride to the highest peak in the Northeast using the Cog Railway. This ride will have you on the world's first mountain-climbing cog railway train and carry you to the heart of the White Mountains. After your time exploring the stunning White Mountains you can choose from one of the many local restaurants to end your day with an amazing dining experience.

WHITE MOUNTAINS - LAKE GEORGE, NY

Day 9: On this day you will arrive to Lake

George, a town located in New York's protected Adirondack range of mountains. You can continue to feed your hiking needs by strolling along the Adirondack Mountains for an exciting thrill. The area will have you with no shortage of routes offering more than 2,000 scenic trails featuring waterfalls, summits with a birds-eye view, and wide open wilderness. Hiking options can be found for all skill levels and you may also choose to experience some of these trails on a bike. **Driving Distance: 201 MI / 323 KM**

LAKE GEORGE, NY

Day 10: If you did not get enough of the Adirondack Mountains and its exciting trails, you return and take on the Cat Mountain trails where you can enjoy views of nearly the entire lake as well as mountains on its Western and Eastern shores. Alternatively, you can choose to add to your hiking experience at Shelving Rock Summit or wander to the Shelving Rock Falls to discover the Eastern side of Lake George. After your exploration, you can relax and enjoy some fine wine at the Adirondack Winery or grab a beer at The Lake George Brew House in nearby Queensbury.

LAKE GEORGE - GREEN MOUNTAIN AND FINGER LAKES NATIONAL FORESTS/MANCHESTER, VT

Day 11: Today you make your way over to Vermont and experience the Green Mountain and Finger Lakes National Forests region, a backcountry area with waterfalls, cliffs, ponds and plenty trails for hiking and biking. Pay a visit to Hildene – The Lincoln Family Home, where Robert Lincoln – the only child of 16th President of the United States Abraham Lincoln to survive to adulthood – built his Georgian Revival mansion in 1905 (optional).

Driving Distance: 52 MI / 84 KM

GREEN MOUNTAIN AND FINGER LAKES NATIONAL FORESTS/MANCHESTER, VT

Day 12: Before your trip comes to a finish and you make your way back to Boston, you can take your final hike or bike adventure while exploring the Bald Mountain trail to the summit for panoramic views or choose to explore the Southern Vermont Art Center Loop and discover rolling wood roads and attractive hardwoods. End your day by satisfying your taste buds by trying the best mom-and-pop diners to worldclass dining that Vermont has to offer.

MANCHESTER, VT - BOSTON

Day 13: Return to Boston and spend the afternoon exploring more of the city's history with a visit to the Boston Navy Yard, originally called Charlestown Navy Yard and one of the oldest shipbuilding facilities in the United States Navy. If you have not already at the beginning of your trip, make your way over to Faneuil Hall, a former meeting house now a popular marketplace for some local shopping and delicatessens. **Driving Distance: 159 MI / 255 KM**

BOSTON - DEPARTURE

Day 14: Transfer independently to Boston International Airport for your departure flight.

QUAINT NEW ENGLAND TOWNS

BOSTON - ARRIVAL

Day 1: Welcome to Boston, a guintessential blend of colonial history and treasure trove of Americana. Upon arrival, pick-up your rental car and proceed to your hotel. Although many visitors know about Boston's rich history and its role in the Revolutionary War, they may not be aware of the city's world-class museums, numerous universities and abundant shopping opportunities. Begin your exploration of the city on The Freedom Trail with its 16 historic stops, including the famous Old North Church and the Paul Revere House. Spend an afternoon (or a day) enjoying the Museum of Fine Arts' extensive collection or the eye-opening exhibits at the Museum of Science. For a more intimate experience, visit the Isabella Stewart Gardner Museum or the Nichols House Museum. Walk across the Charles River on the Longfellow Bridge or take the "T" (subway) to Cambridge to explore the ivy-trimmed campus of Harvard University and nearby cafes and bookstores. Shoppers will enjoy areas such as Newbury Street in the Back Bay (high-end boutiques in restored brownstone houses), Copley Place (a two-level mall with top brand-name stores) and the famous Faneuil Hall Marketplace (100-plus shops and pushcarts as well as 50 restaurants, pubs and food vendors). Sports fans should plan to watch a Boston Red Sox baseball game (April through October) and take a tour of Fenway Park, the oldest Major League Baseball park in the country. If the weather is nice, stroll through the Boston Common and take a ride on one of the famous Swan Boats in the Public Garden.

BOSTON - KENNEBUNKPORT

Day 2: Head north along the scenic New England coast through Massachusetts. Infamous for the Salem Witch Trials of 1692. Salem is a colorful city with a rich maritime heritage, Victorian architecture and fascinating stories that span nearly 400 years. Continue through Manchester-By-The-Sea, Massachusetts (made famous by the award-winning 2016 movie of the same name) and historic Rockport, Massachusetts, an inspiration to painters since legendary American painter Winslow Homer spent two summers in this area (1873 and 1880). After exploring charming Rockport, head to Portsmouth, New Hampshire. Settled in 1623. Portsmouth's historic past and cultural strengths make it an attractive destination. It's also a gateway to New Castle, one of New Hampshire's smallest towns and home of the Fort Constitution Historic Site. After exploring the fort, depart for Maine, where your first stop is

Ogunquit, named by the Abenaki tribe, meaning 'beautiful place by the sea'. Enjoy the vintage feel of this charming place, stroll among quaint buildings or explore the Marginal Way ocean path. The final stop today is Kennebunkport, Maine, located along the Atlantic Ocean and Kennebunk River. Settled in the 1600s and a long-time ship building center, the city's resident sea captains built fine mansions here; some of these original homes are now lovely inns.

Driving Distance: 90 MI / 144 KM

KENNEBUNKPORT - CAMDEN

Day 3: Today's first stop is Old Orchard Beach. Here, you can enjoy seven miles (11 kilometers) of sandy beach and Old Orchard Beach Pier, stretching more than 500 feet (150 meters) over the Atlantic Ocean. Continue north to the historic seacoast city of Portland with its funky galleries, one-of-a-kind shops, diverse restaurants and many lighthouses (six within 30 minutes' drive of the city - among them, Portland Head Light, one of the most photographed in the USA). Here, take time to explore the Arts District and Old Port historic district. As you continue through the mid-coast region of Maine, past quaint New England cottages and quiet coves, be sure to stop at Pemaguid Point Lighthouse in Bristol. The lighthouse itself is beautiful and the unusual rock formations bordering the structure make this a fabulous photo spot as well. Rockland, known as the 'Gateway to Penobscot Bay', is a classic working harbour town and home to galleries, craft shops, fine dining and the Maine Lighthouse Museum with its fine collection. The final stop today is in Camden, where locals say 'the mountains meet the sea'. A culinary mecca, Camden features charming little streets, huge schooners and locally owned art galleries, making it the perfect destination to overnight. Driving Distance: 122 MI / 196 KM

CAMDEN - BAR HARBOR

Day 4: Follow the scenic shoreline of Penobscot Bay to Lincolnville in the heart of the Maine coast. This off-the-beaten-path place is a perfect spot to enjoy breathtaking views of the bay. Next, visit the picturesque town of Blue Hill to enjoy a laid-back and charming getaway. In addition to its historical architecture and shipbuilding roots, Blue Hill is also a gateway to Acadia National Park. Today's final stop is Bar Harbor on Mount Desert Island, featuring elegant Victorian architecture, and situated between the blue waters of Frenchman Bay and the woodlands of Acadia National Park. Driving Distance: 80 MI / 128 KM

BAR HARBOR - BETHEL

Day 5: Before travelling inland, take the morning to explore Acadia National Park, known for its rugged beauty. Expect to see glorious mountains and abundant wildlife, and hear the thunder of crashing waves. Steep slopes rise above the rocky shore, including Cadillac Mountain, which at 1,529 feet (465 meters) is the highest peak on the U.S. Atlantic Coast. Travel east to Bethel, one of Maine's popular mountain villages, and a hub of outdoor activities from skiing in winter to hiking and biking in summer. The walkable city center has everything visitors need.

Driving Distance: 184 MI / 296 KM

BETHEL - NORTH CONWAY

Day 6: Take a full day to explore the White Mountains of New Hampshire. First, travel to Gorham and join Highway 15 (Three Rivers Scenic Drive) which will take you past Mount Washington and the mountain pass known as Pinkham Notch. (Adventurous visitors will want to stop to take the cog railway or drive to the summit of Mount Washington - known as 'the home of the world's worst weather'. Here, you can visit the weather station and Extreme Mount Washington museum.) Outdoors lovers won't want to miss Pinkham Notch, a stunning natural landmark created by glaciers, erosion and rivers, and separating three mountain ranges. Take the opportunity to hike trails that accommodate all skill levels or relax on a Gondola ride and enjoy the views in Wildcat Mountain Ski Area. The journey ends in North Conway in the heart of Mt. Washington Valley, home to nearly 100 stores, fine art galleries, locally made crafts, restaurants, pubs and live entertainment.

Driving Distance: 50 MI / 80 KM

NORTH CONWAY - LONDONDERRY

Day 7: From North Conway, explore more of the White Mountains, taking the scenic Kancamagus Highway, and planning a photo op at Albany Covered Bridge along the way. Next, stop at Flume Bridge, a covered bridge open to autos, on your way to spectacular Franconia Notch State Park with its many trails, aerial tramway, wildlife watching and other recreational activities. Journey through Hanover, New Hampshire, home to Dartmouth College, and on to Woodstock, Vermont, which is full of quintessential New England charm, with a village green, covered bridge and historic architecture.

Continue to Londonderry at the gateway to the Green Mountains.

Driving Distance: 184 MI / 296 KM

LONDONDERRY - STOCKBRIDGE

Day 8: Today, explore Vermont's Green Mountains National Forest, beautiful in all seasons. Autumn is the most colorful time of year here, due to the brilliance of the changing foliage, but this area has something for outdoor enthusiasts yearround. Enjoy pastoral views as you travel along Route 7a through Manchester and Bennington, Vermont, where you should stop to photograph the beautiful covered bridges before arriving in North Adams, Massachusetts for lunch. Continue to Stockbridge, home to the Norman Rockwell Museum, well worth a visit for its extensive collection of the beloved American illustrator's original works.

Driving Distance: 103 MI / 165 KM

STOCKBRIDGE - MYSTIC

Day 9: From Stockbridge, travel south to the Connecticut coast and Westport. The waterfront has a row of attractive red brick buildings, and the area enjoys some of the prettiest scenery in the state, making this a good stop for a picnic or a stroll through town. Further along the coast, stop at Old Saybrook, famous for being the home of Katharine Hepburn (and now home to The Katharine Hepburn Cultural Arts Center). Filled with impressive architecture and many remarkable buildings (including historic manor houses and the Saybrook Breakwater Lighthouse), this is a perfect stop for lunch. Continue on to Mystic, an attractive seaside village with a rich heritage. Originally one of the area's most important seaports, its history has been preserved at the Mystic Seaport, one of the country's largest maritime museums. Visit Main Street, many delicious seafood restaurants, quaint shops and the famous Mystic Pizza restaurant, made famous in the 1988 movie.

Driving Distance: 137 MI / 220 KM

MYSTIC - CAPE COD

Day 10: Take Highway 1 to Narragansett, Rhode Island, known for its sandy beaches, and then take Highway 1a along the coast and across the Jamestown Bridge to Newport, one of the USA's original playgrounds for the rich and famous. Newport retains a luxurious charm and many of its Gilded Age mansions are open to the public for tours. If you are tennis fan, also check out the International Tennis Hall of Fame in Newport. Next, drive to charming Cape Cod, where your day's journey ends.

Driving Distance: 129 MI / 207 KM


CAPE COD - BOSTON

Day 11: The beach towns of Cape Cod could easily entertain visitors for several weeks or more. Do some research before your trip to determine what community best suits your style, from the bustle and fun of Falmouth on the Lower Cape, to the flower-adorned cottages of Orleans and the dune-swept beaches of Eastham and Truro on the Outer Cape. Busy Provincetown, an LGBTfriendly city at the tip of the Outer Cape, offers eclectic shops, galleries and restaurants, as well as natural beaches and stellar whale watching. The Cape's scenic out islands - Martha's Vinevard and Nantucket - can be reached via ferry or small plane. Summer is high season on Cape Cod, and the shoulder seasons of spring and autumn offer quieter experiences. After your visit to Cape Cod, drive to Plymouth, 'America's hometown', where the Pilgrims landed in 1620 in search of a home and religious freedom. Plimoth Plantation is a must-visit - a fascinating, interactive view of the life of the early American colonists in a harsh land. Depart Plymouth and continue to Boston, where your journey will end.

Driving Distance: 82 MI / 131 KM

CHARLESTON - SAVANNAH

Day 9: After leaving historic Charleston, many people choose to visit the Magnolia Plantation and Gardens. Drive south to the port city of Savannah. The historic district of Old Savannah has been beautifully restored, recreating the gracious atmosphere of the Antebellum South. Driving Distance: 105 MI / 166 KM

SAVANNAH - ST. AUGUSTINE

Day 10: Follow the lush, semi-tropical coastline of Georgia, and see the influence of 18th century English settlers in the charming architecture of Brunswick. Join them this morning or explore the Spanish heritage of the city before driving south along the coast to Orlando. Driving Distance: 120 MI / 200 KM

ORLANDO

Day 12: Enjoy a full day exploring the entertainment complex of Walt Disney World Resort - home to the Magic Kingdom Park, Epcot, and Disney -MGM Studios, or experience Disney's wildest adventure yet, Disney's Animal Kingdom Theme Park. (Admissions not included)

ORLANDO - SARASOTA

Day 13: Make the short drive to the western shores of Florida and Tampa Bay which sheltered the pirates and buccaneers of a bygone era. The stunning natural beauty of Sarasota is enhanced by the barrier islands, known as "Keys," lying just offshore.

Driving Distance: 150 MI / 240 KM

SARASOTA - VENICE - EVERGLADES NATIONAL PARK - MIAMI

CIVIL WAR BATTLEGROUNDS

WASHINGTON, D.C. - ARRIVAL

Day 1: Welcome to Washington, D.C., America's front yard filled with monuments, memorials and eclectic neighborhoods. Upon arrival, pickup your rental car and proceed to your hotel. It is unthinkable to begin any journey learning about Civil War history without first exploring Washington, D.C. At the western end of the National Mall is the Lincoln Memorial, which honors the memory of Abraham Lincoln, the 16th U.S. president. Arlington National Cemetery was established during the 1861-1865 Civil War on the grounds of Arlington House, once the estate of Confederate General Robert E. Lee's wife, and has been a military cemetery ever since.

WASHINGTON, D.C. - RICHMOND

Day 2: After leaving Washington, D.C., the next stop is Manassas National Battlefield Park, north of Manassas, Virginia. The site commemorates two battles, one in 1861 and the other a year later, between the Union and Confederate armies. This is where Confederate Gen. Thomas Jackson earned the nickname 'Stonewall'. South of Manassas is Fredericksburg and Spotsylvania National Military Park, known as 'Americas Battleground', where four Civil War battles were fought and the war came to its climax. A key city in the Civil War was Richmond, Virginia, the capital of the Confederate States of America for much of the war. The Richmond National Battlefield Park commemorates the many battles fought and the defense of the city.

Driving Distance: 135 MI / 217 KM

RICHMOND - SHENANDOAH

Day 3: Do not leave Richmond before visiting the Maggie L. Walker National Historic Site, which celebrates the life of Walker, who was born to a former slave and later became the first African-American woman to charter a bank in the USA. A civil rights activist, she devoted her life to helping African-Americans. Take a respite from Civil War history to explore the beauty of the Blue Ridge Mountains and Shenandoah National Park. Travel the spectacular Skyline Drive, then take a hike on over 500 miles (805 km) of trails to experience lush forests, waterfalls, incredible views and wildlife.

Driving Distance: 125 MI / 201 KM

SHENANDOAH - GETTYSBURG

Day 4: Leave Shenandoah National Park and take a step back in time at Harpers Ferry National Historical Park, site of the famous abolitionist uprising of 1859 led by John Brown. Tour this historic community and find battlefields, museums, a variety of hiking trails, and oldfashioned taverns and shops. Now, travel to Gettysburg National Military Park, site of the 1863 Battle of Gettysburg, a turning point for the Union in the Civil War and the inspiration for Lincoln's Gettysburg Address.


Driving Distance: 159 MI / 255 KM

GETTYSBURG - WASHINGTON, D.C.

Day 5: Return to Washington, D.C., to continue to explore the USA capital. The African-American Civil War Memorial honors the African-American soldiers and sailors who fought for freedom from slavery during the Civil War. A must-stop is Ford's Theater; tour the museum that tells the story of the fateful night in 1865 when Lincoln was assassinated. Driving Distance: 108 MI / 173 KM



APPALACHIAN ADVENTURE

PITTSBURGH - ARRIVAL

Day 1: Welcome to Pittsburgh, which is the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's second largest city. The cultural and commercial capital of the region, Pittsburgh is often referred to as the "Paris of Appalachia." Located at the convergence of the Allegheny, Monongahela, and Ohio rivers, Pittsburgh is also known as the "City of Bridges" as its uniquely situated status necessitates some 446 bridges. Pittsburgh is perhaps most well known as the "Steel City" for its more than 300 steel-related businesses and its deeply linked history as the center of the American steel industry. Hence, it is home to the famed American Football team the Pittsburgh Steelers, which has won more Super Bowls than any other team in history. The history of steel and the industry that it engendered throughout the region permeates the city. Founded by steel industrialist Andrew Carnegie in 1900, Carnegie Mellon University is now one of the top universities in the United States. The city is also the birthplace of famed American Pop artist Andy Warhol as well as the irreplaceable Heinz Ketchup recipe.

PITTSBURGH - MILL RUN (FALLINGWATER) - GETTYSBURG

Day 2: Seize the day by departing the city and heading Southeast toward one of the most stunning architectural homes of the 20th century, Frank Lloyd Wright's Falling water. Built in 1935 and cantilevered over a natural waterfall, the home was designed as a weekend getaway for the Kaufmann family, which owned the then popular Kaufman Department Store. Today it is a museum preserved in its original state and is ranked on the Smithsonian's Life List of 28 places to visit before you die. The American Institute of Architects has named Fallingwater the best all time work of American Architecture. Continue your journey traversing the scenic hill country of the Maryland panhandle toward one of the most consequential landmarks of American history, Gettysburg. The site of perhaps the most pivotal battle of the American Civil War as well as the subsequent historic address by President Abraham Lincoln, the hallowed grounds of Gettysburg Battlefield have been well preserved and unforgettable. Driving Distance: 200 MI / 300 KM

GETTYSBURG - HARPERS FERRY - WASHINGTON, D.C.

Day 3: Spend the morning at the Gettysburg National Battlefield before heading south across the Mason-Dixon Line passing through Frederick, Maryland to one of the most historic towns of the region, Harpers Ferry, West Virginia. With a population of less than 300 people, Harpers Ferry is best known as the location of abolitionist John Brown's raid on the United States Armory in 1859, which was one of the events that historians point to as starting the Civil War. Located at the intersection of two rivers (Potomac and Shenandoah) and three states, West Virginia, Maryland, and Virginia, Harpers Ferry is one of only a few towns to be located on the Appalachian Trail. Tour the National Historic Park and if you are feeling adventurous hike to the top of the Maryland Heights Overlook to view the scenic hamlet from above before heading southeast along the Potomac toward the nation's Capital.

Driving Distance: 100 MI / 170 KM

WASHINGTON, D.C.

Day 4: A full day to explore the many sights of Washington, D.C.

WASHINGTON, D.C. - FREDERICKSBURG - CHARLOTTESVILLE

Day 5: Depart D.C. heading south through northern Virginia, which is one of the fastest growing areas of the United States. The huge population influx into the suburbs south of Washington have changed the demographic makeup of the entire state of Virginia, which, once the Capital of the Confederacy, in some places no longer seems to be part of the American south at all. Travel through Fredericksburg, which, located halfway between the capitals of the Union and the Confederacy, played host to several pivotal Civil War battles. Continue on to one of the most charming cities America, Thomas Jefferson's hometown in of Charlottesville. One of America's Founding Fathers, our Third President, and the author of our Declaration of Independence, Thomas Jefferson was a man of many talents. His architectural prowess is on full display in Charlottesville, with the University of Virginia, which he founded and designed as a showcase. But it is the masterpiece of Monticello, his home and plantation that cannot be missed. The history of the man is as fascinating and complex as his many inventions, including the dumbwaiter, the predecessor to the modern elevator and which is featured at Monticello. Driving Distance: 100 MI / 170 KM

CHARLOTTESVILLE - WHITE SULPHUR SPRINGS - CHARLESTON

Day 6: Today you will embark on a scenic drive over the Blue Ridge Mountains toward the Allegheny Range, both part of the vast Appalachian Mountain Range. One of the hidden historical treasures of America is located in these mountains near White Sulphur Springs, West Virginia. The Greenbrier Resort was originally established around the restorative sulphur waters of the area, which had been attracting visitors looking to cure their rheumatism since the 18th century. The resort has hosted 26 American Presidents and its current facilities make it one of the leading Grand hotels of America. Most interestingly, during the Cold War the Greenbrier became the site of a massive underground bunker that was meant to serve as an emergency shelter to Congress in the event of a nuclear attack. Code named "Project Greek Island," today the bunker can now be toured. Driving Distance: 350 MI / 480 KM

CHARLESTON - COLUMBUS

Day 7: Having now been well versed in different eras of American history, but particularly the Civil War, it is interesting to note that West Virginia became a state by separating from Virginia during that war. The state is noted for its mountains, rolling hills, and historically significant Coal industry, which has been in decline in recent decades due to changes in energy and technology. In the morning visit the West Virginia State Museum and the beautiful State Capitol building. Peruse the Capitol Market to get a better sense of the local flavors before departing West Virginia by crossing over the mighty Ohio River into the Buckeye state's capital and largest city Columbus. Upon arrival in Columbus, enjoy the evening in the Short North Arts District, which is the known as "the art and soul of Columbus."

Driving Distance: 170 MI / 300 KM

COLUMBUS - CLEVELAND

Day 8: This morning experience a little more of what Columbus has to offer exploring the German Village. Columbus' downtown neighborhood and one of the preeminent historic districts in the United States, there are many notable shops to enjoy, not least of which is the famous Book





Loft. The Botanical Gardens and Columbus Zoo are also highlights of this charming city that has certainly hit its stride. In the late afternoon, head north toward Cleveland. Located on the southern shore of Lake Erie, Cleveland was originally a manufacturing center that was well connected to numerous rail and canal lines. In more recent years as many manufacturers moved offshore, Cleveland's economy has diversified into financial services, healthcare, and biomedical. Cleveland is home to several major league sports teams, all of which inspire very dedicated fans, as well as the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame, which should not be missed.

Driving Distance: 150 MI / 240 KM

CLEVELAND - YOUNGSTOWN - PITTSBURGH

Day 9: Before departing Cleveland, make sure to explore at least one of the dynamic neighborhoods surrounding downtown. Ohio City, Tremont, and University Circle each exhibit their own local flavor. Heading back toward Pittsburgh, you will travel through Youngstown, which is a city that is emblematic of the declining economic conditions across the region that became known as the Rust Belt. As you may have noticed by now, many of the urban centers across the region have diversified in a way that more rural areas could not. This dynamic and this region are at the center of an ongoing shift within the American economy and play a central role in shaping American politics. Driving Distance: 150 MI / 240 KM

PITTSBURGH

Day 10: With your remaining time enjoy what you missed of Pittsburgh when you began this tour. If you have time before departing for home, perhaps you can explore one of the charming boroughs surrounding the city, like Sewickley, which will leave you with a lasting impression of "Main Street USA."

PITTSBURGH - DEPARTURE

Day 11: Return your car at the airport before your departure flight.

This "living" museum presents one of the largest collections of early airplanes in the world, as well as automobiles, motorcycles, early engines and memorabilia spanning the period from 1900-1939. June-October consider taking to the skies with a biplane ride any day of the week and enjoy weekend air shows.

HUDSON VALLEY

Later, embark on Buffalo Bites Food Tours three-hour guided



walking and dining tour of Elmwood Village. It's the perfect combo – eat delicious samples from local eateries, explore the neighborhood and enjoy entertaining history. Continue to enjoy the outdoors this evening by visiting one or more of Buffalo's craft breweries. In fact, pick up Buffalo's Brewcation Passport to guide you through the city's brewery landscape. Alternatively, visit The Buffalo Zoo or famous Albright Knox Art Gallery rounding out your day in and around the Elmwood Village area.



NEW YORK - ARRIVAL - CORNING

CHICAGO - ARRIVAL

Day 1: Welcome to Chicago. The "Windy City" as it is often called, lies along the shores of Lake Michigan and is known for its vibrant arts scene, cultural attractions, shopping, and stunning architecture. Upon arrival, transfer independently to your hotel.

CHICAGO

Day 2: Chicago's music history is firmly rooted in Jazz and Blues, but the diverse music scene offers a variety of genres as well as a thriving musical theater hub and the famous annual Lollapalooza and Pitchfork festivals. Continuing a tradition that began in 1907, take in a Jazz or Big Band performance at the Green Mill Cocktail Lounge. Muddy Waters and Buddy Guy were among musicians who developed the legendary Chicago Blues style; see Guy still performing every January in his Legends club. A big city, of course, needs big venues for touring shows; top acts fill up the United Center, Allstate Arena and the Chicago Theatre. The city is a melting pot, and the pedigrees are reflected on local stages. See eclectic lineups and up-and-coming performers on small stages in the Wicker Park, Bucktown, Lincoln Park and Logan Square neighborhoods.

CHICAGO - DETROIT

Day 3: This morning, pick-up your rental car and follow the spectacular shoreline of Lake Michigan into Indiana to South Bend, home of the University of Notre Dame, where a mustdo tour includes the spectacular Basilica of the Sacred Heart. Departing South Bend, you'll enter Michigan and proceed to the vibrant university town of Ann Arbor, where its Main Street is considered to be one of the most picturesque in the USA. See local acts performing live at The Ark or Kerrytown Concert House. Proceed to Detroit, where revitalizations in the city center brought trendy restaurants, shops and cultural venues to a destination known both as "Motor City" and the birthplace of Motown music. At the Motown Museum, view artifacts and see where music

icons such as Stevie Wonder, the Supremes and Marvin Gaye recorded hits in the 1960s heyday. Other acts with Detroit roots include Alice Cooper, Eminem and Jack White. Jazz lovers can hear live music nightly at Cliff Bell's, a legendary, restored art-deco nightclub. From tunes by established Hip-Hop artists to the classic sounds of the Detroit Symphony Orchestra, a variety of first-rate music is played in Detroit.

Driving Distance: 307 MI / 494 KM

DETROIT - CLEVELAND

Day 4 and Day 5: Follow the shores of Lake Erie, one of the Great Lakes, to Toledo, Ohio, where a stop to view masterworks and the Glass Pavilion at the Toledo Museum of Art will not disappoint. For a more daring outing, drive about an hour to Cedar Point Amusement Park for thrill rides on nearly 20 roller coasters. Continue on to Cleveland, where the phrase "rock 'n' roll" was coined by a radio disc jockey. Spot the distinct I.M. Pei-designed pyramid-shaped building on the Lake Erie waterfront and go inside the Rock & Roll Hall of Fame. Wander through several floors to see permanent and temporary exhibits and learn about the biggest Rock music acts. While Cleveland has an amazing tale of musical history, it also has a vibrant music scene today at venues such as Beachland Ballroom & Tavern and the Music Box Supper Club.

Driving Distance: 182 MI / 292 KM

CLEVELAND - PITTSBURGH

Day 6: It is fitting that this trip includes Pittsburgh, where Stephen Foster was born in 1826. Known as the "father of American music," he composed more than 200 popular songs and sold them on sheet music. In the Hill District, a center for African-American culture, Jazz performers like singers Lena Horne and Billy Eckstine and drummer Kenny Clark made their mark in the mid-1900s at places like the Belmont, Loendi Club and Crawford Grill; Horne was among the first to be inducted to the Pittsburgh Jazz Hall of Fame. Fast-forward to the 1960s, when

Bobby Vinton, the Lettermen, the Del Vikings and others started singing Doo Wop, again putting Pittsburgh on the musical map. The Pop, Rock and Rap genres also have roots in the city with Christina Aguilera, Chris Frantz of the Talking Heads, Bret Michaels and Wiz Khalifa. Venues to see Pittsburgh's newest up-and-comers include Brillobox, Park House and Club Cafe. For bigger shows, check out Stage AE, Heinz Hall or PPG Paints Arena.

Driving Distance: 158 MI / 254 KM

PITTSBURGH - PHILADELPHIA

Day 7 and Day 8: From Pittsburgh, travel through the Pennsylvania Amish Country for a glimpse into the horse-and-buggy lifestyle before arriving in bustling Philadelphia, known as the birthplace of the USA because that's where the Declaration of Independence and U.S. Constitution were signed. Among the most iconic of the city's performance venues is the Academy of Music, established in 1857. Since 1924, composers and performers from throughout the world, including Leonard Bernstein and Samuel Barber, have trained at the Curtis Institute of Music in Rittenhouse Square. When you enjoy a Philadelphia Orchestra concert, take note that half of its musicians graduated from Curtis. Philadelphia singers such as Frankie Avalon and Chubby Checker put the city at the forefront in the early years of rock 'n' roll, and Dick Clark exposed Philadelphia as a cutting-edge music city through the TV show "American Bandstand" that aired for nearly 40 years. Hum the melody of Elton John's 1975 song "Philadelphia Freedom"

as you view some of the 4,000 murals throughout the city, then attend a free concert at the outdoor Piazza at Schmidts in the Northern Liberties downtown neighborhood near the Delaware River. Immerse yourself in local culture at one of the many outdoor festivals, including the summer concert series at the Great Plaza at Penn's Landing on the riverfront, or the Made in America Festival the first weekend in September on the Benjamin Franklin Parkway. Prefer the indoors? Venues large and small continue the centuriesold tradition of making great music in a variety of genres.

Driving Distance: 351 MI / 564 KM

PHILADELPHIA - NEW YORK CITY

Day 9 and Day 10: Travel north to the Big Apple, New York City, where some of the most iconic American music originated. Brooklyn native Aaron Copland composed some of the most famous film scores, operas, ballets and band music of the 20th century, and other legendary musicians followed to forge the city's music history. Whether you prefer dimly lit underground clubs in Greenwich Village, the elegance of Carnegie Hall or Radio City Music Hall, or mainstream venues like Madison Square Garden or Broadway theaters, you can find it in New York City. Credited for being the origin of genres like Punk, Hip-Hop and Disco as well the legacies of JAY-Z, Cyndi Lauper, Blondie, Lady Gaga, the Talking Heads and Burt Bacharach, people the world over go to New York City to sample the variety of the music scene whether it is for Blues, Jazz, Salsa, Rap or Electronic beats. In the five culturally diverse boroughs, see singer-





songwriters getting their start in neighborhood cafes, rising stars commanding the stages in standing-room-only clubs into the wee hours and legends headlining sold-out concerts. You'll never find yourself lacking in live music options at places like the Lincoln Center for the Performing Arts, Beacon Theatre and The Town Hall. Before you leave town, pay homage to John Lennon at Strawberry Fields near the Dakota Apartments, where he died in 1980, and visit the Apollo Theater, the world-famous venue in Harlem that opened in 1914 for African-American patrons and continues to draw fans eager to hear the next big star. **Driving Distance: 106 MI / 170 KM**


NEW YORK CITY - BOSTON

Day 11 and Day 12: In a city that played a prominent role in the birth of the USA in the 1700s, historic buildings dot the Boston cityscape, but there is nothing old-fashioned about the music scene. Look to the power era of the 1960s through the 1990s that set the pace with several Boston acts creeping to national prominence - James Taylor, Joan Baez, Donna Summer, Boston, The Cars, Aerosmith, New Edition and New Kids on the Block. The heart of New England pulses with pumped-up volume in the established Punk, Metal and Hard-Core scenes. With 35 colleges, universities and community colleges in Boston, there's always an audience to hear emerging new artists in a variety of genres. Some of those musicians might be students at Berklee College of Music performing at intimate venues like Atwood's Tavern, Great Scott or the Lizard Lounge. Venture to the waterfront Seaport District for dining, lodging, breweries and a plethora of bars and pubs featuring live music. Catch big-name touring acts at the Bank of American Pavilion at the Boston Harbor or the Comcast Center amphitheater in Mansfield. Tone it down with a classy night enjoying the Boston Symphony Orchestra or Boston Lyric Opera. Kick it up a notch and head to the Hatch Shell along the Charles River for Fourth of July festivities and to see fireworks synchronized to the music of the Boston Pops Orchestra. Driving Distance: 226 MI / 363 KM

Pass through the ancestral homeland of the Cherokee Indians en route to Columbia, considered one of the country's most beautiful state capitals. Arrive in historic Charleston in the afternoon. Charleston is a city built for walking. Take a leisurely stroll through the historic district with its unsurpassed antebellum architecture.

Driving Distance: 268 MI / 429 KM

CHARLESTON - SAVANNAH

Day 12: After leaving historic Charleston, a popular place to visit is the Magnolia Plantation and Gardens. Then drive south to the port city of Savannah, where the city's 24 green shade squares form the foundation for one of the largest urban historic landmark districts in the country. Driving Distance: 104 MI / 167 KM

SAVANNAH - JACKSONVILLE - ST. AUGUSTINE

Day 13: Continue south and return to the Sunshine State of Florida. In Jacksonville, stroll along the River-walk on the south bank of the St. Johns River before heading south to the oldest town in North America, St. Augustine. Narrow lanes and houses built in the Spanish style with their typical inner courtyards, balconies, and wrought-iron screens add to the Spanish ambiance of St. Augustine.

Driving Distance: 182 MI / 292 KM

ST. AUGUSTINE - DAYTONA BEACH - KENNEDY SPACE CENTER - ORLANDO

Day 14: Depart early for Daytona Beach, a meeting place for motor-sports fans from all over the world, and on to Cape Canaveral. Visit NASA's Kennedy Space Center, home of America's space program, before returning to Orlando. Driving Distance: 168 MI / 269 KM



THE CIVIL RIGHTS HISTORY TRAIL

NASHVILLE - ARRIVAL

Day 1: The Civil Rights Trail stretches across 14 U.S. states, encompasses more than 100 locations and highlights the USA's civil rights story. Our story starts at Woolworth on 5th, a restaurant that pays homage to the Nashville sit-ins - nonviolent protests against segregated public places in the city in 1960. One of the sitins targeted the lunch counter in the Woolworth store, where the restaurant operates today in a meticulously restored building. Learn more about the era by sitting at a symbolic lunch counter to read the sit-in protesters' Ten Rules of Conduct and other historical accounts in the Civil Rights Room at the Nashville Public Library. Visit the Davidson County Courthouse, where a peaceful march ended with then-Mayor Ben West conceding that segregation was immoral, the first step toward the city's desegregation of public facilities. Next to the courthouse are the Witness Walls, concrete murals featuring events, including Freedom Rides, marches and sit-ins that spurred desegregation in Nashville.

NASHVILLE- HENNING- MEMPHIS

Day 2: Depart Nashville, drive for an hour and stop in Henning to visit the Alex Haley Museum and Interpretive Center. The museum - the childhood home of the "Roots" author - is dedicated to African-American history and contains a life-size replica of a slave ship. Continue an hour more to reach downtown Memphis, set on the Mississippi River. Go to the Burkle Estate, known as the Slave Haven Underground Railroad Museum, once part of the Underground Railroad network, which helped people escape slavery. Exhibits include displays of slave auction advertisements, information about slave trade history and artifacts highlighting racial profiling of the time. The main feature is the dark cellar, where men and women hid for hours or days until riverboats were available to take them to safety and freedom in northern states.

Driving Distance: 222 MI / 357 KM

MEMPHIS

Day 3: To explore the civil rights history of Memphis, start at the National Civil Rights Museum, constructed around the Lorraine Motel. Learn about key milestones in civil rights history, including Rosa Parks' refusal to give up her seat on a segregated bus, Jim Crow segregation laws, the murder of 14-year-old Emmett Till and marches in Selma, Alabama. Appropriately, the final exhibit is Room 306 of the Lorraine Motel, recreated from 1968, when civil rights leader Martin Luther King Jr. was assassinated there on April 4 on the balcony outside his room. It's impossible to visit Memphis and not include Beale Street, at one time the heart and soul of the citv's African-American culture, and now the entertainment hub for live music and great dining. The Stax Museum of American Soul Music is a celebration of everything from church Gospel music to uplifting anthems that were the backbone of marches, giving hope to those fighting for civil rights. Stax

Recording Studios was among the first to employ African-American artists, including Otis Redding and Isaac Hayes, giving a voice to Blues and Gospel music and becoming famous for launching their careers. Other must-see places on a tour of civil rights history in Memphis include the historic Beale Street Baptist Church, built by and for freed slaves in the late 1800s and a key meeting place for civil rights leaders through the ages. At The Four Way, order some hearty soul food - perhaps country fried steak, a catfish sandwich and turnip areens followed by sweet potato pie. Beginning in the 1940s, the restaurant was a meeting spot for civil rights activists as well as famous musicians such as B.B. King and Aretha Franklin due to its location near Stax Recording Studios.

MEMPHIS - OXFORD - SUMNER - MONEY - JACKSON

Day 4: About 90 minutes south of Memphis, stop at the Oxford campus of the University of Mississippi and seek out the civil rights monument created by Oxford resident Rod Moorhead. The statue portrays James Meredith, the first African-American student to be admitted to the university, after his racial discrimination case was supported by the U.S. Supreme Court in 1962. President John F. Kennedy deployed 31,000 troops to quell protests and protect Meredith when he arrived at the school. Meredith graduated the following year with a Bachelor of Science degree. The drive to Jackson follows the 1966 "March Against Fear" route Meredith planned to walk alone to protest racism and the fear that kept black people from registering to vote. Near Hernando, a historical marker documents where he was shot three times by a white sniper on the second day. Over 15,000 supporters had joined the march by the time Meredith recovered and met them 20 days later in the state capital. In Money, all that remains of Bryant's Grocery & Meat Market is the ruin of the storefront, but this is where Emmett Till, a 14-year-old from Chicago, Illinois, who was visiting relatives, came to purchase candy in 1955 and was accused of whistling at Carolyn Bryant, the 21-year-old white shopkeeper. Bryant's husband and his half-brother abducted Emmett, beat and shot him, then threw his body into the Tallahatchie River. Emmett's mother insisted on an open coffin at his funeral to highlight the savagery of the attack. The ensuing public outcry is credited with igniting the civil rights movement. Go to Sumner to see the Tallahatchie Courthouse, where the murder trial took place; both men were acquitted. Then drive about two hours south to reach Jackson. Driving Distance: 245 MI / 394 KM

JACKSON

Day 5: Discover a wealth of civil rights history in Jackson. Start at the Mississippi Civil Rights Museum, opened in 2017, which details civil rights struggles in Mississippi. See archive film of protests and demonstrations as well as artifacts such as the rifle used to murder Medgar Evers at his home in 1963. The NAACP field secretary's house has

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been restored and is now the Medgar Evers Home Museum. North of Jackson, visit Tougaloo College. The historically black college was a hub of support for the civil rights movement, leading to the boycott of many Jackson businesses, protests against segregation and peaceful sit-ins. The Greyhound bus station on Lamar Street, which has since been restored, was the catalyst for the Freedom Rides throughout the South after the arrests in 1961 of 27 riders who challenged racial segregation.

JACKSON - PHILADELPHIA - TUSCALOOSA

Day 6: Drive northeast for about 90 minutes to Philadelphia, site of the 1964 killings of three civil rights activists, one African-American man and two white men, which became known as the Mississippi Burning murders. The national headlines provided the final push to pass the 1964 Civil Rights Act. Continue to Tuscaloosa, where then-Alabama Gov. George C. Wallace stood at the entrance of the University of Alabama in 1963 to block the admission of two black students, determined to keep his promise for the university to remain segregated. President John F. Kennedy intervened, dispatching troops to protect the students, allowing them to enroll and sending a message to segregationists across the South. Known as the site of the "Stand in the Schoolhouse Door" incident, the universities' Foster Auditorium became a National Historic Landmark in 2005. Driving Distance: 232 MI / 373 KM

TUSCALOOSE - SELMA - MONTGOMERY

Day 7: Drive 90 minutes south to reach Selma, the starting point of three 1965 right-to-vote marches. On March 7, about 600 marchers were met with violence from local law enforcement and vigilante gangs. News broadcasts countrywide of "Bloody Sunday," coupled with the death of an activist after a march two days later, led to thousands of supporters converging on Selma. President Lyndon B. Johnson pledged support to the marchers on national TV and expedited the Voting Rights Act. On March 21, troops protected 8,000 marchers as they set out along U.S. Route 80, arriving three days later in Montgomery, where they were greeted by over 50,000 supporters. The path of their journey became a National Historic Trail in 1966. Montgomery had been thrust into the public conscience in 1955 by one African-American woman's refusal to give up her seat on a segregated bus, and visitors can see a 1955 city bus at the Rosa Parks Museum. Montgomery stayed at the forefront of the civil rights movement. It's home to the Dexter Avenue King Memorial Baptist Church, where Martin Luther King Jr. preached and organized the Montgomery Bus Boycott. A mural in the church's basement depicts King's life, beginning with his crusade for racial equality in Montgomery and ending in his untimely death in 1968 in Memphis, Tennessee. Driving Distance: 130 MI / 209 KM

MONTGOMERY - TUSKEGEE - ALBANY

Day 8: From Montgomery, travel 40 minutes east to Tuskegee, home of the Tuskegee Airmen, the

country's first African-American military aviators, who fought in World II. Visit the Butler Chapel AME Zion Church, a 1950s meeting place for people fighting for voting equality in Alabama, and arrange for a tour of the museum in the church's basement. The Tuskegee History Center traces the region's civil rights crusade and multicultural roots. Continue southeast about two and a half hours to reach Albany, home of the Albany Movement, a group fighting for voters' rights and desegregation, and the first mass movement in the civil rights era to fight for the desegregation of an entire community. Martin Luther King Jr. lent his support, was arrested and said the campaign failed, but residents said many lessons learned led to successful campaigns elsewhere. Learn more about this historic time at the interactive exhibits at the Albany Civil Rights Institute, where the Freedom Singers give monthly concerts. Driving Distance: 168 MI / 270 KM

ALBANY - MIDWAY - SAVANNAH

Day 9: Enjoy views of the Georgia countryside on the drive east to the Atlantic Ocean coast. After about four hours, stop in Midway to visit the museum at Historic Dorchester Academy, a key site where the Southern Christian Leadership Conference trained its teachers and leaders, who then took the message to their home communities. The final stop today is Savannah, home of the Ralph Mark Gilbert Civil Rights Museum, which tells the story of local African-American history and the Savannah Protest Movement, where students staged sit-ins at downtown lunch counters in 1960, resulting in a boycott of businesses and leading to desegregation. It's housed in the building that once was the area's largest bank for blacks. Stroll around lovely and historic Savannah, so charming with its cobblestone streets, pretty parks and squares, boutiques and trendy restaurants. Driving Distance: 248 MI / 399 KM

SAVANNAH - ATLANTA

Day 10: Drive inland for about four hours to the birthplace of Martin Luther King Jr. in Atlanta and his final resting place at The King Center. Upon arrival, visit the new Center for Civil and Human Rights, a suitable place to begin your discovery of Atlanta's civil rights history, which includes the Martin Luther King Jr. Collections as well as exhibits about today's human rights issues. While you're downtown, must-see attractions include the Georgia Aquarium, World of Coca-Cola and Centennial Olympic Park. This cosmopolitan city brims with great restaurants and lively nightlife hotspots.

Driving Distance: 248 MI / 399 KM

ATLANTA

Day 11: Explore the wealth of civil rights history in Atlanta, starting at The King Center, which includes an exhibition hall and the home where Martin Luther King Jr. was born, and Fire Station No. 6, which was one of the first firehouses in the South to be desegregated. Listen to some of King's sermons and speeches at Ebenezer Baptist Church, and then enjoy quiet contemplation at the nearby World Peace Rose Garden and reflecting pool, home to the "Behold" monument. Visit the Eternal Flame and the crypts of King and his wife, Coretta, and explore the International Civil Rights Hall of Fame, where you can tread in the footprints of civil rights leaders and pioneers. Spend time in the Sweet Auburn District at the APEX Museum, which traces the African-American experience through videos, photographs and artifacts.

ATLANTA - ANNISTON - BIRMINGHAM

Day 12: Departing Atlanta, follow the westward route of members of the Congress of Racial Equality who boarded a Greyhound bus in 1961 to challenge segregated seating as part of the Freedom Rides movement. In Anniston, Alabama, an angry mob attacked the bus and slashed its tires, forcing it to stop outside of town. The bus was set on fire, and the fleeing riders were beaten. The site is marked with the Freedom Riders National Monument. Drive about an hour west to the next stop, Birmingham, a city at the heart of the civil rights movement, most famously Project C, better known as the Birmingham Campaign. Peaceful lunch counter sit-ins, boycotts and marches were met with such violence that they're widely accepted as key turning points in the civil rights movement. Today, the Birmingham Civil Rights Institute tells the story of the city's role in the struggle for equality. Across the street, in Kelly Ingram Park, fire hoses and dogs were turned on peaceful protesters; it's now a site honoring leaders of the civil rights movement with statues and monuments. The nearby Civil Rights National Monument was established in 2017 to commemorate this important time in U.S. history. Further explore the city, set in the beautiful Appalachian foothills, where outdoor recreation and dining and entertainment options abound. Driving Distance: 179 MI / 288 KM

BIRMINGHAM - SCOTTSBORO - NASHVILLE

Day 13: The next stop, Scottsboro, is a two-hour drive north. This is where nine black teenagers were falsely accused of the sexual assault of two white girls aboard a Southern Railroad freight train from Chattanooga to Memphis, Tennessee, in 1931. The ensuing trials, convictions, retrials, verdicts, appeals and blatant injustice accorded the boys was the basis for much legal reform for the right to a fair trial. Visit the Scottsboro Boys Museum & Cultural Center in the 133-year-old former Joyce Chapel United Methodist Church - it contains documents and other artifacts that support the trial as the beginning of the civil rights movement. Your journey ends today where it began nearly two weeks ago; make the three-hour drive back to Nashville.

Driving Distance: 242 MI / 389 KM





COASTS AND MOUNTAINS OF THE SOUTH

ATLANTA - ARRIVAL

Day 1: Welcome to Atlanta, the capital of Georgia and one of the most influential cities in the Southern United States. Upon arrival, pickup your rental car and proceed to your hotel. In Atlanta, spend a fun day touring the impressive Georgia Aquarium and World of Coca-Cola (be sure to enjoy free samples of Coke's beverages from around the world). Explore the city's rich history at places such as the National Center for Civil and Human Rights, filled with artifacts from the Civil Rights movement. Relax at an evening concert at one of the city's many live music venues, from major concert halls to intimate clubs. Refuel with 'hash brown' potatoes, and waffles at the iconic Atlanta-based diner chain Waffle House. Burn off the calories with a tour around the lush Atlanta Botanical Garden, a sprawling oasis of smaller gardens.

ATLANTA - ASHEVILLE

Day 2: Travel north across the state line into Tennessee, then North Carolina, to visit Great Smoky Mountains National Park. This is the most visited national park in the USA, and it is known world-wide for its rich Southern Appalachian culture as well as the beauty of the mountains in every season. Visitors will find activities for all skill and fitness levels. Some choose scenic drives such as the Roaring Fork Motor Nature Trail in Gatlinburg, Tennessee, where you can see waterfalls from your car. Others embark on more active adventures, enjoying hikes to spectacular waterfalls. Discover scenic Little River Road, with its many worthwhile stops, including the Sinks waterfall, which is an easy hike from the main road. It was formed where the river makes an S-turn; the natural pools here are surrounded by enormous boulders. Later, head to Asheville, North Carolina, which is an ideal place to access the Blue Ridge Parkway, one of the USA's most scenic drives. Visitors will discover beautiful mountain views, as well as opportunities to go hiking, biking and horseback riding amidst lovely scenery. The Parkway connects several Asheville-area attractions, including the Biltmore Estate, a French Renaissance-style chateau with its accompanying gardens and winery. Nearby, Asheville's city centre is ideal for experiencing a vibrant food and beverage culture, with locally owned cafes (many emphasising organic ingredients), tucked between galleries and craft breweries. Driving Distance: 229 MI / 368 KM

ASHEVILLE - CHARLOTTE

Day 3: Experience a pit stop simulation at the NASCAR Hall of Fame, in Charlotte, North Carolina, then watch a race, or drive a race car at nearby Charlotte Motor Speedway. Sports fans also can enjoy Carolina Panthers football, Charlotte Hornets basketball and Charlotte Knights baseball. For adventure seekers, visit the U.S. National Whitewater Center, and select your choice of activities from white-water rafting, zip-lining and rock climbing. Charlotte also offers cultural opportunities such as the international Craft + Design collection at the Mint Museum Uptown, or the oral histories and other thought-provoking exhibits at the Levine Museum of the New South. Driving Distance: 303 MI / 487 KM

CHARLOTTE - MYRTLE BEACH

Day 4: In the classic beach town of Myrtle Beach, South Carolina, explore the golden sands of the Atlantic coast for seashells, then visit Broadway at the Beach, a diverse selection of open-air shops and restaurants specializing in local flavours. Activities include a water park, helicopter tours and Ripley's Aquarium, where you can glide through a tank filled with stingrays and sharks. Take one of the many tours to experience wildlife in a natural setting, such as dolphin watching cruises and wetland tours offering the possibility of alligator and bird sightings. Visitors may want to plan to stay several nights to enjoy this beachside resort area and the many activities it has to offer. Driving Distance: 180 M / 289 KM

MYRTLE BEACH - CHARLESTON

Day 5: Depart Myrtle Beach and head 30 minutes south along the coast to the southern end of the Grand Strand. Here, you'll arrive at friendly, tranquil Pawley's Island. Famous for its cypress wood cottages, and home to large expanses of marshland, rivers, and oceanfront state parks, this is a perfect destination for outdoor enthusiasts. Continue south along the pristine coastline through Francis Marion National Forest until you arrive in Charleston, with its signature antebellum mansions painted in a rainbow of colours and featuring elaborate ironwork. Join a walking tour for the best view of these homes, their gardens and the Battery, Charleston's historic waterfront promenade. Shop at City Market for souvenirs, including sweetgrass baskets, an essential tool on former rice plantations. Tour a plantation at Middleton Place, featuring the 18th century House Museum and Stable yards. History also comes alive at Fort Sumter National Monument, where the American Civil War began. The site looks over Folly Beach and Sullivan's Island with wide beaches, locally owned restaurants and activities such as surfing and kayaking.

Driving Distance: 120 MI / 193 KM

CHARLESTON - SAVANNAH

Day 6: Travelling south from Charleston to Savannah, golf enthusiasts may wish to add a night or two at either Kiawah Island or Hilton Head Island, both in South Carolina. Kiawah Island is just 21 miles (34 kilometres) from Charleston, and it is known for its tranquility and natural beauty. Here, five championship courses challenge golfers. About a two-hour drive from Charleston, Hilton Head

Island offers pretty beaches, more than 20 world class golf courses and more than 300 tennis courts. Savannah's historic district is a collection of pretty town squares and preserved architecture. Join a history or ghost tour to acquaint yourself. Later, linger at landmarks such as Forsyth Park, where residents and visitors have gathered for generations around a spectacular fountain. Heading toward the Savannah River, pause for a self-guided tour of the Cathedral of St. John the Baptist; its towering twin steeples are a fixture on the Savannah skyline. Continue to City Market's, courtyards and squares with restaurants, shops and galleries. For a side trip, visit Tybee Island for a lighthouse tour, paddling excursion or charter cruise.

Driving Distance: 152 MI / 244 KM

SAVANNAH - ATLANTA

Day 7: Head east today to Macon, Georgia to visit the Tubman Museum, named for Harriet Tubman, one of the USA's most famous abolitionists and a "conductor" on the Underground Railroad, which helped slaves find freedom in the pre-Civil War era. MUSICAL ROOTS OF THE SOUTH

DALLAS - ARRIVAL

Day 1: Welcome to Dallas. The "Big D" is a glittering city of skyscrapers with a past and present rich in the stuff that American legends are made of. From barbecue and steaks to cowboy boots, country music and the nostalgia of the old west - "big things happen here." Upon arrival, pick-up your rental car and proceed to your hotel.

DALLAS

Day 2: Today, make a beeline to historic Deep Ellum, where more than 30 live music venues in the multi-block area make the entertainment district one of the largest in Texas. It's a place where you can see big-name singers in the massive Bomb Factory, request a favorite song at a dueling piano bar, admire street art and dine al fresco in a neighborhood cafe. It all began in the 1920s, when Deep Ellum was known as a mecca for Blues and Jazz, patronized by fans of icons such as Blind Lemon Jefferson, Huddie "Lead Belly" Ledbetter and Bessie Smith. By the 1970s, the area was in economic decline with vacant storefronts, but the music scene reignited in the 1980s. The opening of the Trees concert venue in the 1990s further invigorated the area by attracting popular bands like Nirvana, Pearl Jam and Radiohead. Today, the internationally known district draws people eager to listen to music, engage with local artists, shop and eat. Experience the area at its finest during the Deep Ellum Arts Festival, a three-day street party in April.

DALLAS - AUSTIN

Day 3 and Day 4: Arrive in Austin on any night of the week and you're guaranteed to find a spot to listen to live music in a variety of genres, including Country, Blues and Rock. With more than 2,000 musicians contributing to the diversity of the city's soundtrack, you'll soon learn why Austin is nicknamed the "Live Music Capital of the World." The TV show "Austin City Limits" debuted in the mid-1970s and continues to bring attention to a destination where acts like Janis Joplin, Jamestown Revival and Stevie Ray Vaughan gained popularity. Since 1987, the annual South by Southwest music festival has drawn thousands of talented musicians and fans from throughout the world. Austin is home to large venues, such as the Paramount Theatre, which books headline acts on world tours, and also to classic venues, such as the Continental Club, Sahara Lounge and The Nook Amphitheater, where you can catch local bands. Popular entertainment districts include Rainey Street, Sixth Street and the South Congress neighborhood.

Driving Distance: 211 MI / 339 KM

AUSTIN - SAN ANTONIO - HOUSTON

Day 5: En route to Houston, stop in San Antonio to experience its vivid and diverse music scene. The city, known for its Tejano and Heavy Metal genres, also has deep Jazz roots at places like the Shadowland Ballroom and the Plaza Hotel. Major venues for famous touring acts include AT&T Center and The Paper Tiger, but smaller clubs in the urban oasis host nightly live music for all tastes. Continue to Houston, famous for launching the careers of artists as diverse as Lyle Lovett, ZZ Top and Destiny's Child. The live music scene includes such venues as the Continental Club, which started in Austin, and now has a major presence on Main Street, a popular spot to finish the night. The historic Fitzgerald's, once a Polish dance hall a century ago, hosts an open microphone night for budding musicians on Wednesdays, and established bands play live Fridays and Saturdays. One of the newest destinations in Houston is White Oak Music Hall. which has booked top bands like The Lumineers since opening in 2016. Choose from three stages, both indoors and outdoors, that offer spectacular views of downtown and the Little White Oak Bayou.

HOUSTON - PORT ARTHUR - LAFAYETTE - NEW ORLEANS

Day 6 and Day 7: While driving along the Gulf of Mexico coastline, stop in Port Arthur to visit the Museum of the Gulf Coast, home to a hall of fame that enshrined native Janis Joplin and other Gulf Coast icons such as Clarence "Gatemouth" Brown, ZZ Top, and Edgar and Johnny Winter. Continue to Lafavette, a vibrant south central Louisiana city settled by French Canadians in the 18th century that is known as the capital of Cajun Country. See bands playing Cajun tunes and Zydeco music at local venues, or time your visit to one of the many cultural festivals. Your final destination is New Orleans, where musical roots run deep. In clubs and on street corners, you're likely to hear everything from Jazz and Afro-Cuban to Dixieland, Rhythm and Blues, and Zvdeco. At Preservation Hall, a rotating lineup of fabulous musicians play traditional New Orleans Jazz in the most intimate environment; arrive early for standing-room-only space or buy in advance one of the venue's limited seats. Another hub for live music. Frenchmen Street, is lined with venues such as The Spotted Cat Music Club, which features as many as three Jazz bands nightly. Visit the New Orleans Jazz National Historical Park for insight on the city that is known as the birthplace of Jazz. Cuisine and the cocktail culture

are vital to the New Orleans experience. From open-air cafes to fine-dining restaurants, you'll find countless interpretations of local signature dishes, such as sugar-dusted beignets, aromatic jambalaya, and spiced, smoked Andouille sausage. Plan your journey to coincide with the Jazz & Heritage Festival or Mardi Gras. Driving Distance: 348 MI / 560 KM

DAY 8: NEW ORLEANS - BATON ROUGE - NATCHEZ - INDIANOLA

Day 8: Follow the Mississippi River north along the Mississippi Blues Trail. Stop in Baton Rouge, the capital of Louisiana, a perfect hub to explore the eclectic culture of the state. Baton Rouge houses over 300 years of history, much of which can be tasted in the delectable food, seen in the distinct architecture and learned through the unique culture. Continue on the Mississippi Blues Trail through Natchez, Vicksburg and Indianola, the region known as the Mississippi Delta. In Indianola, learn about the history of Blues music as told at the B.B. King Museum, dedicated to the legendary singer and guitar player. Visitors will learn how African-Americans created the genre while working in cotton fields and playing at juke joints. Driving Distance: 298 MI / 479 KM

INDIANOLA - TUPELO - BIRMINGHAM

Day 9: Departing Indianola, take a slight detour north along the Mississippi Blues Trail to Dockery Farms in Cleveland to continue learning about the advent of Blues music. African-Americans working there in the early 1900s included Blues pioneer Charlie Patton. At the next stop, Tupelo, spend some time at the birthplace of Elvis Presley. The home where the "King of Rock 'n' Roll" was born is part of an attraction that includes a chapel, museum and park. Continue to Birmingham, where Jazz is still very much alive in downtown nightclubs, such as Ona's Music Room, where you may be lucky enough to catch a performance by owner Ona Watson, the voungest person inducted into the Alabama Jazz Hall of Fame. For an authentic experience, visit one of the last juke joints in existence, and hear known artists and locals play Saturday nights at Gip's Place in nearby Bessemer. Driving Distance: 280 MI / 450 KM

BIRMINGHAM - CHATTANOOGA

Day 10: Before leaving Birmingham, stop by the art-deco building housing the Alabama Jazz Hall of Fame, a museum honoring Jazz artists with links to Alabama. Inside, visit the Carver Theatre, where many of the greats performed. You will enjoy a Jazz music history tour of legends such as Nat King Cole, Lionel Hampton and Duke Ellington. On the two-hour drive north, cross the Georgia state line before arriving in Chattanooga, where Bessie Smith was born and Usher was

from the 1920s through the 1970s. Driving Distance: 166 MI / 267 KM CHATTANOOGA - GATLINBURG

> Day 11 and Day 12: Tennessee is known for its great music destinations and history, and Gatlinburg will not disappoint. Every summer, artists and music fans converge on Gatlinburg for the Smoky Mountain Songwriter's Festival. Top songwriters in the music industry vie for awards. In addition to great music, Gatlinburg also offers venues, including distilleries, where you can hear live music while sipping spirits. Make time for a down-home meal at Atrium Pancakes, which serves breakfast and brunch; try the baked apple pancake or country-fried steak and gravy. Cap off a trip by visiting the Dollywood theme park in Pigeon Forge. Spend time exploring the grounds and water park, and take in the many shows and attractions. The park also offers onsite accommodations for anyone looking to stay a little longer. To welcome Country star Dolly Parton home, join the crowd at the annual Dolly's Homecoming Parade. Music lovers will want to plan a visit to coincide with the annual Dollywood Barbeque and Bluegrass Festival.

Straddling the border of Tennessee and North Carolina, the park offers hiking trails through forests and wildflower meadows, along streams and rivers with waterfalls and spectacular viewpoints. After leaving the Great Smokies, go to Georgia for the college town vibe of Athens, forever linked to bands like the B-52s and R.E.M. A variety of shows still grace the stage of the Morton Theatre, which opened as a vaudeville theater in 1910, and where music icons Duke Ellington and Louis Armstrong once performed. Continue to Atlanta, a destination famous for contemporary Hip-Hop and Rhythm and Blues. Little Five Points has long been a hotspot, and the Variety Playhouse is a great venue to catch live music and events.

ATLANTA - CHARLESTON

Day 15: Charleston's signature is its antebellum mansions painted in a rainbow of colors and featuring elaborate ironwork. Do not miss the opportunity to join a walking tour along cobblestone streets for the best view of these homes, their gardens and the Battery, Charleston's historic waterfront promenade. Perhaps the name Charleston is familiar to you because of the city's namesake dance popular in the Ragtime era in the early 1900s and by those grooving to Jazz beats in the 1920s. Grammy Award-winning singer Darius Rucker, a native of the city, even named one of his albums "Charleston, SC 1966." The renovation in the 1990s of the Charleston Music Hall, also known as The Tower Depot, provided the city with a top-notch live music venue. For a low-key evening, step inside historic downtown bars or beach taverns to see a host of talented musicians on stage.



CHICAGO - ARRIVAL

Day 1: Welcome to Chicago. The "Windy City" as it is often called, lies along the shores of Lake Michigan and is known for its vibrant arts scene, cultural attractions, shopping, and stunning architecture. Upon arrival, transfer independently to your hotel. Start with a visit to some of Chicago's iconic attractions such as the Cloud Gate sculpture (a.k.a The Bean) at Millennium Park, the Ledge glass balcony at Skydeck Chicago off the 103rd floor of Willis Tower, and the new Centennial Wheel at Navy Pier. Interactive, educational museums abound in Chicago, from The Field Museum and Shedd Aquarium to the Art Institute of Chicago. Rock out at the annual Chicago Blues Festival or at clubs such as Buddy Guy's Legends - no matter your musical taste, you'll find it live in Chicago every night of the week. In Chicago, you'll be able to choose from more than 200 live music venues and clubs - with everything from intimate musical experiences to major concert venues and historic music halls. Enjoy a deep dish pizza at Gino's East or Lou Malnati's, or enjoy a Chicago hot dog at locations throughout the city. Delve into Chicago's thriving craft brewery scene with a tour and a pint at a neighborhood brewery such as Half Acre.

CHICAGO - SPRINGFIELD

Day 2: This morning, pick-up your rental car and head out on historic Route 66 for a true slice of Americana. Day 3: Enjoy a root beer float or a giant banana split at Doc's Soda Fountain in Girard, Illinois on Route 66 (just about 30 minutes from Springfield) on the way to St. Louis, where you can visit the Gateway Arch, the tallest man-made monument in the USA. The arch has welcomed visitors for 50 years with its iconic shape. The vision of renowned architect Eero Saarinen, the Gateway Arch commemorates Thomas Jefferson's vision and St. Louis' role in the westward expansion of the United States. St. Louis is also renowned for its diverse music scene. Visit the Soulard neighborhood for stellar live music, enjoy a delicious meal and music at a trendy suburban bistro, or spend an evening exploring the Loop, with its music clubs, ethnic restaurants and unique boutiques. Take time to visit Blueberry Hill (where Chuck Berry played regularly) or The Beale on Broadway to see live Blues, Soul and R&B, and do not miss the National Blues Museum. Driving Distance: 117 MI / 188 KM

ST. LOUIS - NASHVILLE

Day 4: No music tour would be complete without a visit to Nashville, Tennessee, home to Country music. At the Country Music Hall of Fame and Museum, recordings, touch screens and memorabilia trace Country music from its roots to the present. The museum also offers tours of RCA Studio B, where artists such as Dolly Parton recorded songs. The Grand Ole Opry is the place to see today's Country music stars perform. For a variety of genres, catch a concert at the Ryman Auditorium, the historic church building that was once the home of the Opry. Nearby, new art flows regularly into the Frist Center for the Visual Arts (its Art Deco architecture is worth a stop for its own sake). Hungry? NASHVILLE - MEMPHIS

Day 5: Head back to the Great River Road and the Mississippi River toward Memphis, Tennessee. In this pilgrimage city for musiclovers, tour Sun Studio to stand where Blues and Rock legends such as B.B. King and Elvis Presley recorded some of their earliest hits. For an intimate look at Presley's life, tour his Graceland estate. At the Stax Museum of American Soul Music, the rhythm shifts to Soul and Gospel. View memorabilia from Stax artists including Otis

Redding and Isaac Hayes, whose goldplated Cadillac is displayed. For a sampling of Memphis' contemporary sounds, walk Beale Street, where live music seems to drift from every open door. The aroma of barbecue fills the air, too. Savor local specialties that include dry-rubbed ribs and smoked pulled-pork sandwiches.

Driving Distance: 257 MI / 413 KM

MEMPHIS - CLEVELAND

Day 6: Follow the Mississippi Blues Trail to Clarksdale, Mississippi, located at the intersection of highways 61 and 49 ('the crossroads'). Clarksdale and the surrounding Delta region are known as 'the land where the blues began', making this the perfect home to the Delta Blues Museum. Continue south to Cleveland, Mississippi, home to Dockery Farms, which was established in 1895 to produce cotton. Charley Patton was among the African Americans who worked here; he later contributed to a culture that inspired the Blues, a true American art form. Also in Cleveland is the GRAMMY Museum Mississippi.

Driving Distance: 151 MI / 243 KM

CLEVELAND - NATCHEZ

Day 7: En route to joining the Natchez Trace Parkway, stop at Indianola, Mississippi. Visit the B.B. King Museum to learn about the map who helped popularize the Blues, a truly American art form. Join the Natchez Trace Parkway as you continue your journey to Natchez, Mississippi, the oldest settlement in Mississippi. The journey will take you past bygone plantations and restored





antebellum mansions. Take time to explore some of these incredible homes that tell the stories of the South.

Driving Distance: 204 MI / 328 KM

NATCHEZ - NEW ORLEANS

Day 8: The last leg of your road trip will take you to New Orleans, Louisiana where the mighty Mississippi River empties into the Gulf of Mexico. Along the way, make a stop in Baton Rouge, Louisiana's capital city and the hub of all things Louisiana. Baton Rouge is the perfect place to explore the eclectic culture of this amazing state. The city has more than 300 years of history, much of which can be seen in distinct architecture, tasted in delectable food, and learned through its unique culture. After visiting Baton Rouge, head to New Orleans. With its centuries-old cottages and elaborate, historic cemeteries, the city is a photographer's delight. RHYTHMS OF THE RIVER OPTION 2 MINNEAPOLIS START

MINNEAPOLIS - ARRIVAL

Day 1: Follow the Mississippi River to the Gulf of Mexico, exploring a rich and diverse music culture along the way. In Minneapolis, Minnesota, immerse yourself in the music of Prince at First Avenue, a former Greyhound Bus depot, and now the hub of the city's live music scene (it's also the place where Prince performed regularly, experimenting with his eccentric new sounds). In 1983, the album version of the song Purple Rain was recorded here, and it was also the backdrop for his movie of the same name. Paisley Park is where you'll find Prince's recording studio and residence, now offering daily tours where visitors can see his iconic outfits, awards and other memorabilia. Don't miss the mural at 26th and Hennepin, painted by artist Rock "Cyfi" Martinez after Prince's death. Extend your stay in Minneapolis to follow a Bob Dylan Tour along Highway 61. Visit Dylan's birthplace in Duluth, Minnesota as well as his boyhood home in Hibbing, and then continue on to venues near the University of Minnesota campus where Dylan's unmistakable sound was developed. Finish the day at The Armory Arts & Music Centre, which marks the end of Duluth's Bob Dylan Way, a 1.8mile (nearly 3-kilometre) cultural pathway through the city center of Duluth.

MINNEAPOLIS - DUBUQUE

Day 2: Follow the Great River Road to La Crosse, Wisconsin. Here, enjoy majestic views at Grandad Bluff, with its 600-foot (183-metre) bluff overlooking the Mississippi River Valley; visitors can see Wisconsin, Minnesota and Iowa from this impressive location. Enjoy historic and beautiful Prairie du Chien, Wisconsin, the second-oldest community in Wisconsin and home to the Prairie Dog Blues Festival in late July. Cross the river to visit Effigy Mounds National Monument, Iowa, located in one of the most picturesque sections of the Upper Mississippi River Valley, and preserving more than 200 prehistoric mounds built by Native Americans. Travelers will enjoy seeing the mounds, many of which take the form of birds and bears. Continue to Dubuque, Iowa's oldest city, to see how the community has remade its Mississippi Riverwalk area into a lively destination. Experience The Smithsonian-affiliated National Mississippi River Museum and Aquarium and, in summer, hear live music at the riverside amphitheater. Driving Distance: 314 MI / 505 KM

DUBUQUE - HANNIBAL

Day 3: Continue south to Hannibal, Missouri. Explore this historic river town where famous American writer Mark Twain lived in his youth. First, explore the world-famous Mark Twain Cave and The Mark Twain Boyhood Home & Museum, then catch a show, take a ghost tour and explore unique art galleries. Embark on a riverboat dinner cruise and experience the mighty Mississippi, just as Twain did.

Driving Distance: 239 MI / 384 KM

HANNIBAL - ST. LOUIS

Day 4: The Gateway Arch in St. Louis is the tallest man-made monument in the USA, welcoming visitors to the city for 50 years with its iconic shape. The vision of renowned architect Eero Saarinen, the Gateway Arch commemorates Thomas Jefferson's vision and St. Louis' role in the westward expansion of the United States. St. Louis is also renowned for its diverse music scene. Visit the Soulard neighborhood for stellar live music, enjoy a delicious meal and music at a trendy suburban bistro, or spend an evening exploring the Loop, with its music clubs, ethnic restaurants and unique boutiques. Take time to visit Blueberry Hill (where Chuck Berry played regularly) or The Beale on Broadway to see live Blues, Soul and R&B, and do not miss the National Blues Museum.



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

TO THE OUTER BANKS AND BEYOND

CHARLOTTE - ARRIVAL - DURHAM

Day 1: Today, arrive in Charlotte, NC, pick up your rental car and drive the Blue Star Memorial Highway north to the triangle cities of Chapel Hill, Durham and Raleigh. Overnight in Durham, home to Research Triangle Park, a vibrant "tech scene" that contains some of the USA's largest technology companies. Day 3: Follow Virginia's eastern shore across the Chesapeake Bridge Tunnel for a scenic ride to the "Outer Banks", the easternmost shores of the southeastern USA. Lined with quaint towns and quiet fishing villages, upon arrival you may wish to explore Kitty Hawk, the spot where Wilber and Orville Wright made their first and historic flight. The peaceful sandy beaches and abundant

park areas are pleasant spots to picnic. Nature remains the ruler of this beautiful area where marsh grasses sway in the breezes, wildflowers abound, sea birds soar, wild horses roam and the surfers, kayakers and nature lovers frolic along the shores.

Driving Distance: 78 MI / 126 KM

THE OUTER BANKS - SWANSBORO

Day 4: Arise with the sun to get an early start to a breathtaking and full day. Your route takes you along the Outer Banks including its barrier islands. Stop at one of the four famous lighthouses en route whose beacons light turbulent waters, the "graveyard of the Atlantic", where many ships met their demise in rough seas. Drive to Ocracoke Island home to the oldest and shortest lighthouse on the Banks. Then, catch the auto ferry (daytime operations only, advance reservations recommended, fee applies) for a breathtaking journey across Pamlico Sound to Cedar Island. Continue by car to your destination for the evening, the historic town of Swansboro. Driving Distance: 100 MI / 161 KM

SWANSBORO - MYRTLE BEACH

Day 5: Your destination is Myrtle Beach, a vibrant and colorful beach city on the Grand Strand coastline. Stroll the Myrtle Beach Boardwalk or take a ride on the Myrtle Beach Skywheel, with its glass gondolas that overlook the Atlantic. Feast on local seafood and consider a visit to a Sea Captain's home. Dip your toes in the sea and take in the beauty of this day.

Driving Distance – 149 MI / 240KM

MYRTLE BEACH - GEORGETOWN - CHARLESTON

Day 6: Depart the Grand Strand beaches, then drop into Georgetown, heritage home of colonial days. Step back in time by visiting Georgetown's preserved theaters, homes and specialty shops downtown. Back on the road, continue through the lowlands and saltwater marshes to Charleston, rich with Civil War History and known for its architecture. Acclaimed for its quality of design, Market Hall is the starting point for the Charleston City Market, a historic market complex that stretches four full city blocks. Watch an artisan weave a sweet grass basket from winnow rice, step into a gallery to view the local plantation-era artwork, or take a horse-drawn carriage ride outside, reflecting on the days of yore.

Driving Distance: 96 MI / 155 KM

CHARLESTON - SAVANNAH

Day 7: Today, travel to Savannah, Georgia's oldest city and a strategic port during the American Revolution and the Civil War. Historians, nature lovers and food/wine enthusiasts alike enjoy this rich city. In this city "made for walking", take a leisurely stroll alongside the Savannah River, or through the beautifully restored Old Savannah, or the City Market. Local breweries, chocolatiers and even its own "Queen of Southern Cuisine",



Paula Deen, all take pride in this charming jewel of the south that sparkles both by day as well as evening with beautiful gardens, Antebellum architecture, and a vibrant nighttime scene. Driving Distance: 106 Miles / 171 KM

SAVANNAH - CHARLOTTE



Do not miss visiting The Ernest Hemingway Home & Museum or reading inventive inscriptions on gravestones in the Key West Cemetery.

Driving Distance: 99 MI / 160 KM

KEY WEST - MIAMI

Day 12: Heading back to Miami, enjoy driving over the many bridges connecting all Florida Keys to each other and to the mainland. Arriving in

Miami, explore the Little Havana neighborhood to taste traditional Cuban dishes, sip café con leche and watch a lively dominoes game in a public park. The city's many museums, such as Vizcaya Museum & Gardens and Wynwood Walls, and the Miami Beach Botanical Garden, are great sightseeing stops. Head to famous South Beach, tour Art Deco landmarks and enjoy some of the USA's best nightlife.



the Stax Museum of American Soul Music, the Gibson Guitar Factory, or Sun Studio where musicians such as B.B. King, Elvis Presley, and Jerry Lee Lewis recorded their rock'n'roll hits.

MEMPHIS

Day 4: Dive deeper in the birthplace of the blues by taking in a performance in one of the entertaining Beale Street blues bars. Drive out for a tour of Elvis Presley's home Graceland; see the original bomber, Memphis Belle; or monorail to unique Mud Island.

MEMPHIS - TUPELO - MUSCLE SHOALS

Day 5: Travel to Tupelo. Mississippi for a day trip to see the modest birthplace of Elvis. The most significant landmark of Tupelo's modern history is a modest, two-room house where the King of Rock & Roll was born on January 8, 1935. From this humble beginning, Elvis Presley began his swift rise to become the world's most popular entertainer. The house, built by his father with \$180, draws over 50,000 visitors each year from across the world and is part of the 15-acre Elvis Presley Park. The home is a Mississippi landmark and the centerpiece of the park which includes, among many other exhibits, the popular photoop "Elvis at 13" statue and Elvis' childhood church. Travel to Muscle Shoals.

RIVE AMERICA | ROCK 'N' ROLL, ROCKETS

Day 6: Tour the "Hit Record Capital of the World", Muscle Shoals, Alabama to spend the night. Rolling Stone's guitarist Keith Richards called this location "Rock-N-Roll Heaven". Visit historic FAME and Muscle Shoals Sound Studio, Rattlesnake Saloon, and see "The Father of the Blues," W. C. Handy's birthplace and museum.

MUSCLE SHOALS - NASHVILLE

Day 7: Travel to Nashville, often called music city where you can tour Music Row and visit historic RCA Studio B and Country Music Hall of Fame. For nighttime entertainment, visit some of the intimate clubs in town including The Listening Room Café and the famous Bluebird Café.

NASHVILLE

Day 8: Soak up the sounds in the country music capital by visiting the Grand Ole Opry. Experience the South's tumultuous history at the Tennessee State Museum. A full day to discover the variety of attractions Nashville has to offer, such as the Grand Ole Opry, Opryland U.S.A. and world-famous Printer's Alley.

NASHVILLE - LYNCHBURG - HUNTSVILLE

Day 9: Travel to Lynchburg Tennessee where small town values and perfect Americana living are alive and well in Lynchburg, It might be small, but it's home to one LARGE industry – the Jack Daniels Distillery – which is the oldest registered distillery in the United States and averages over 250,000 visitors every year. Every ounce of Jack Daniels Tennessee Whiskey is produced here, fed by the pure, iron-free cave water springs nearby. Travel to Huntsville.

HUNTSVILLE

Day 10: In Huntsville see the largest space museum in the world, the U.S. Space & Rocket Center. The museum has one of the most extensive collections of space artifacts and displays more than 1,500 rockets, engines, spacecraft, simulators, and handson exhibits. It is also home to Space Camp.

HUNTSVILLE - ATLANTA

Day 11: Travel to Atlanta for your trip out. Arrive in Atlanta and overnight. While in the South's gateway city, visit the home of the world's largest aquarium, the Georgia Aquarium and the World of Coca-Cola.

ATLANTA


Day 12: Enjoy a day in Atlanta, which started as railroad junction in the 1830s and quickly became the transport hub of the South. Its strategic importance was a large part of the reason it made such an inviting target for General Sherman' Union Army, which razed it during the Civil War. Visit Fairlie-Poplar, the African American Panoramic Experience, Grant Park or the Atlanta History Center.

Every year thousands of people come to Natchez for the pilgrimages that offer visits of the many Antebellum homes in the area. The gracious citizens open their homes, which have been lovingly restored, so that visitors can get a alimpse of the southern prosperous life. You can also visit Vicksburg National Military Park which commemorates the campaign, siege, and defense of Vicksburg in 1863. There are over 1,300 monuments, markers and plaques, a 16-mile tour road and a national cemetery, the nation's largest burial site of Civil War Union soldiers and sailors with graves totaling over 17,000.

VICKSBURG - NATCHITOCHES

Day 6: Vicksburg perfectly blends Southern culture and heritage with exciting modern-day attractions. Described as the "Key to the South" by Abraham Lincoln, this Southern town carries a history unlike any other Civil War city. Founded in 1811, Vicksburg grew as a vital river port city. Today, Vicksburg is a popular spot for tourists to learn about the battles of the city, taste the cuisine, visit the many museums, and pick out the perfect souvenir.

NATCHITOCHES - ALEXANDRIA - LAFAYETTE





MEMPHIS - VICKSBURG

Follow the banks of the Mississippi River along Hwy 1, and take the opportunity to roll the dice in one of the many Mississippi casinos; they never close! Driving Distance: 146 MI / 234 KM

VICKSBURG - NEW ORLEANS

Day 7: On to the Big Easy! New Orleans is a jazz lover's paradise, and the familiar backdrop in a string of successful movies. The jazz & blues clubs are too numerous to mention, but there are two days in New Orleans to check them out! Driving Distance: 294 MI / 470 KM

NEW ORLEANS

Day 8: Continue to explore this city of riverboats, jazz, and Creole cuisine. Take time to visit the beautiful botanical garden or journey out to the levees to see how they protect the city from the waters of the Gulf of Mexico. This evening why not board a paddle steamer for a dinner cruise on the mighty Mississippi River (optional).

NEW ORLEANS - BIRMINGHAM

Day 9: Sweet Home Alabama! Today, we head to Birmingham, Alabama. For music fans, the highlight would be a visit to the Alabama Jazz Hall

of Fame. Entrance to this exhibition is free and inside you'll find a wonderful tribute to jazz greats with ties to Alabama. While in Tennessee, don't miss the opportunity to try a "moon pie", a favorite Southern snack since the early 1900s. Driving Distance: 148 MI / 238 KM

CHATTANOOGA - NASHVILLE

Day 11: Nashville, "Music City USA", is the destination today. Visit the Country Music Hall of Fame, a multimedia music shrine including movie theatres, costumes, instruments and other

artifacts detailing country music's colorful history. Don't miss a visit to the Ryman Auditorium and a night at the Grand Ole Opry. Driving Distance: 133 MI / 213 KM

NASHVILLE - LOUISVILLE

New Orleans Jazz Fest

Day 12: From Blue Grass to Brass Bands, Kentucky has popular music for every listener. Today's destination is Louisville, Kentucky, home of the famous Kentucky Derby which takes place at Churchill Downs the first Saturday each May. Recently featured in the movie Sea Biscuit. Churchill Downs is the mecca of American horse racing and home of the Kentucky Derby Museum. Take a short side trip to Bards town and visit My Old Kentucky Home State Park, the inspiration for Stephen Foster's anthem of the same name which is sung by the crowds every year at the Kentucky Derby. No visit to Kentucky would be complete without a visit to a bourbon distillery, but remember that many Kentucky counties are "dry," so often there are no tastings. Baseball fans should ensure they fit in a visit to the Louisville Slugger Museum, an interactive museum honoring many of baseball's greats.



Day 7: Crossing the Mackinac Bridge that connects Michigan's Upper and Lower Peninsula over the Straits of Mackinac, make your way south through Petoskey, one of the most beautiful regions in the state, and Charlevoix, to the Cherry Capital of the U.S - Traverse City. From here it's on to the "Motor City." Once known as the "Paris of the West," Detroit acquired the nickname "Motor City" as a result of its longstanding recognition as the historic heart of the American automotive industry.

Driving Distance: 300 MI / 480 KM

DETROIT

Day 8: Whether you want to spend your day inside at a museum or play all day on the lake, there's plenty of things to do in Detroit. At the Ford Piquette Avenue Plant, visitors have the opportunity to take a step back in time and gain a first-hand look at the birthplace of the 1909 Model T automobile. At The Henry Ford, you'll discover America - its culture, inventions, people and can-do spirit. There's also a Riverwalk, awesome art galleries, Motown's first recording studio, beautiful beaches, shopping meccas and dining to die for.

DETROIT - TORONTO

Day 9: Today, crossing the U.S./Canada border into Ontario, your destination is Toronto. The capital of Ontario and the country's largest city, Toronto sits at the tip of Lake Ontario, the most eastern of the Great Lakes. Home to a dynamic mix of attractions - from museums and galleries to the world famous CN Tower and, just off shore, Toronto Islands - Toronto has everything you would expect from a world class city. Driving Distance: 250 MI / 350 KM

TORONTO

Day 10: Spend the day exploring Toronto's top attractions. Enjoy spectacular views from the top of the CN Tower. Delve into the depths of The Royal Ontario Museum, the biggest museum of world cultures and natural history in Canada, or stroll through The Distillery Historic District. Step back in time to a period of European elegance and splendor with a visit to Casa Loma, or hop on a ferry and embark on a journey to the Toronto Islands where along the water you'll find awesome beaches, summer cottages from the 1920s, a maze to test your wits, a haunted lighthouse that tests your courage, and much more.

TORONTO - NIAGARA FALLS

Day 11: Just an hour-and-a half drive from Toronto one of the Seven Wonders of the World awaits. Packed with attractions, dining and adventure, Niagara Falls offers a vast array of activities. Zip to the top of Skylon Tower for the best view around, and in the evening get a different view of the Falls with the nightly illumination and seasonal fireworks.

Driving Distance: 100 MI / 160 KM

NIAGARA FALLS

Day 12: Today, spend a full day experiencing the mighty Falls themselves. See the American and Horseshoe Falls from the sidelines, or get up close with a boat ride to the foot of the Falls for a wet and wild view from below. For a completely different sensation, journey behind the Falls where you'll hear sounds like thunder as you descend to observation decks literally behind the Falls. The sheer array of adventures that await makes any visit to Niagara a memorable one.

NIAGARA FALLS - CLEVELAND

Day 13: If you a want little beach while en route to Cleveland, we recommend stopping at Presque

Isle State Park. As Pennsylvania's only "seashore," this 3,200-acre sandy peninsula offers beautiful coastline views and nearly 14 miles of scenic trail along Presque Isle Bay and Lake Erie. A culturally diverse city on the shores of Lake Erie, Cleveland has all the attractions and excitement needed for a fun-filled adventure. Rock and Roll with legends of music, allow your imagination to flourish at the Great Lakes Science Center, and enjoy the culinary delicacies of cultures from around the world at one of the city's amazing restaurants. Driving Distance: 200 MI / 320 KM

CLEVELAND - CHICAGO

The choice is yours, but we recommend taking the scenic route. Upon arrival in Chicago, head to Navy Pier for an evening of dining and entertainment. This is the perfect spot to spend your last evening overlooking Lake Michigan.

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

ON THE SHORES OF THE GREAT LAKES

CHICAGO - ARRIVAL

Day 1: Welcome to Chicago. Upon arrival, transfer independently to your hotel. Chicago, Illinois, the Midwest's cultural capital, is a familyfriendly destination. Millennium Park is a mustvisit for year-round events and world-class public art, and the Navy Pier offers amusement park rides, shopping and dining. The Field Museum of Natural History and the Shedd Aquarium are among the largest museums of their kind in the world. Art aficionados can peruse a collection of more than 300,000 objects at the Art Institute of Chicago. Visitors can take a boat cruise along the Chicago River and into Lake Michigan to view the spectacular skyline, or get a panoramic perspective at 360 Chicago, on the 94th floor of the John Hancock Center. The bravest of souls can experience TILT, a glass observation cubicle that leans out at a 30-degree angle high above Michigan Avenue.

CHICAGO - MADISON

Day 2: This morning, pick-up your rental car and Drive to Madison, Wisconsin's state capital and an active and outdoors-focused city. Walk, bike, snowshoe or ski along scenic trails at the University of Wisconsin-Madison Arboretum. Visit Taliesin, famed architect Frank Lloyd Wright's masterpiece in Spring Green. Get a taste of Madison's burgeoning beer scene on a brewery tour, then savor a meal at a waterfront restaurant along Lake Mendota or Lake Monona. Finish the trip with time on the water by hiring a standup paddleboard, paddleboat or kayak, or just relaxing on a boat tour.

Driving Distance: 167 MI / 268 KM

MADISON - MINNEAPOLIS/ST. PAUL

Day 3: Continue your travels northwest across Wisconsin, heading to the Twin Cities of Minneapolis and St. Paul in Minnesota. Along the way visit Wisconsin Dells and see the Wisconsin River. Discover the spectacular views of the Lower and Upper Dells from a boat tour. Upon arrival in the Twin Cities, put on your walking shoes and explore Minneapolis' stunning Chain of Lakes area, which includes scenic walking trails around Lake Calhoun, Lake Harriet and others. Rehydrate with a pint at one of the city's many breweries such as Fulton Brewery (one of the area's most popular craft breweries). Enjoy dinner at a downtown Minneapolis restaurant before taking in a performance at the awardwinning Guthrie Theater. Driving Distance: 299 MI / 481 KM

MINNEAPOLIS/ST. PAUL

Day 4: Start with a stroll through the Minneapolis Sculpture Garden (don't miss the iconic Spoonbridge and Cherry sculpture) and visit the Walker Art Center. Root for the home team at a Minnesota Twins baseball game at Target Field or set aside a day to tour the Mall of America, a huge shopping mall packed with 400-plus shops, restaurants and entertainment venues, including an aquarium and indoor amusement park. Cross the Mississippi River to Minneapolis' 'twin', St. Paul, to see Minnesota's Capitol Building, festooned with golden horses, then walk along Summit Avenue to see the city's historic mansions. While there, save time to explore the well-curated, interactive Science Museum of Minnesota. Driving Distance: 16 MI / 25 KM

MINNEAPOLIS/ST. PAUL - GRAND RAPIDS

Day 5: Travel north through Minnesota, known as the 'Land of 10,000 Lakes', to Grand Rapids. Here you'll find small-town charm surrounded by Minnesota's nature. You'll discover a truly unique north woods experience, filled with abundant outdoor adventures, scenic beauty, preserved heritage and vibrant arts and entertainment. The Grand Rapids area offers a wide variety of dining and boutique shopping opportunities. Driving Distance: 290 MI / 466 KM

GRAND RAPIDS - BAYFIELD

Day 6: Return to Wisconsin by way of Bayfield, gateway to Apostle Islands National Lakeshore and one of the Midwest's best-kept secrets. The Apostle Islands in Lake Superior are a haven for outdoors enthusiasts. Join a boat tour or guided paddling tour to see sculpted rock formations, abundant wildlife, lighthouses and sea caves - or linger on an island to hike and camp. If winter is especially cold, the lake may freeze enough for visitors to take an ice sled tour or drive their cars across the ice, and lucky visitors may have an opportunity to see amazing ice cliffs and caves. In warmer weather, regular ferry service delivers travelers to the quaint small town of La Pointe on Madeline Island.

Driving Distance: 196 MI / 315 KM

BAYFIELD - MARQUETTE

Day 7: Head to Michigan and explore the picturesque Keweenaw Peninsula, located along the shores of Lake Superior. Visit the Delaware Mine in Delaware and Fort Wilkins Historic State Park in Copper Harbor. A stop en route at The Jampot, located in Eagle Harbor, is a must. Operated by the monks of Holy Transfiguration Skete, this bakery and gift shop offers preserves, fruitcakes and fresh bakery confections. Continue past the L'Anse Indian Reservation to Marquette, Michigan. Driving Distance: 278 MI / 447 KM

MARQUETTE - ST. IGNACE

Day 8: Follow Scenic State Road 28 to Munising, Michigan. Take a cruise on Lake Michigan along Pictured Rocks National Lakeshore. Although less well-known than other national parks, Pictured Rocks is among the country's most spectacular natural treasures. The lakeshore earned its name from the colorful streaks of minerals layered in the sandstone cliffs. In winter, the lake water freezes, often transforming itself into awesome ice formations against the cliffs. Take time to visit the historic lighthouse at Au Sable Light Station on the way to Tahquamenon Falls State Park near Newberry to see two striking waterfalls on the Tahquamenon River before arriving at St. Ignace. Driving Distance: 177 MI / 284 KM

ST. IGNACE - MACKINAC ISLAND - ST. IGNACE

Day 9: Tucked between Michigan's upper and lower peninsulas, the entirety of Mackinac Island is a National Historic Landmark, nearly all of it protected as a state park. The ferry that runs from the mainland operates on a seasonal schedule, with limited service in the winter. Slow down and experience this destination, which takes visitors back in time. The Victorian architecture, absence of chain hotels and island-wide ban on cars makes it feel like a throwback to a simpler era. Walk, bike or take a horse-drawn carriage to get around.

ST. IGNACE - DETROIT

Day 10: Head south to Detroit, where the city centre of the 'Motor City' has been revitalized with trendy restaurants, shops and cultural venues. The must-see Henry Ford Museum of American

Mackinac Island

Innovation, just outside of Detroit in Dearborn, Michigan, houses cars, planes and rare items such as former President John F. Kennedy's limousine and the Rosa Parks bus. See where music icons including Stevie Wonder, the Supremes and Marvin Gaye recorded hits at the Motown Museum. View the works of artistic masters at the Detroit Institute of Arts, best known for its frescoes by Diego Rivera. Explore the aquarium, zoo, museum, beach and other areas of Belle Isle Park; admission to most of the attractions is free with park admission. Nightlife abounds in the city, with gaming at three hotel-casinos and live Jazz at Cliff Bell's legendary nightclub.

Driving Distance: 296 MI / 476 KM

DETROIT - SAUGATUCK

Day 11: Head west to Ann Arbor, home of the University of Michigan and beautiful views of the Huron River. Ann Arbor's Main Street is considered among the best in the USA, attracting visitors throughout the year. Your next stop will be Grand Rapids, gateway to Michigan's 'Gold Coast' and calling itself 'America's best beer town', with more than 40 breweries on its Beer City Ale Trail. The final stop today is Saugatuck, a charming artists' colony and tourist destination since the 1800s. Take a stroll to the harbor, stopping in the art galleries and shops of this historic lakeside town.

Driving Distance: 210 MI / 337 KM

SAUGATUCK - MILWAUKEE

Day 12: Travel north along the Michigan lakeshore to the resort city of Muskegon, and then take

the Lake Express Ferry across Lake Michigan to Milwaukee, Wisconsin. Wisconsin's largest city, Milwaukee continues to celebrate its beer brewing heritage while expanding its appeal with a powerhouse arts scene, big-city attractions, revitalized historic districts and a vibrant farmto-table culinary scene. Calling itself the 'City of Festivals', Milwaukee is home to many summer festivals, including Summerfest, the world's largest music festival. Explore one-of-a-kind attractions such as the Milwaukee Art Museum, Miller Park and the Harley-Davidson Museum. Experience the city's brewing heritage on tours offered by MillerCoors and local microbreweries such as the Lakefront Brewery, Milwaukee Brewing Company and Sprecher Brewing Company (also a great option for children, thanks to their craft sodas). Driving Distance: 239 MI / 384 KM

MILWAUKEE - CHICAGO

Day 13: Return to Chicago along the Lake Michigan shoreline to further explore this amazing city. Visit some of Chicago's iconic attractions such as the Cloud Gate sculpture (aka, 'The Bean') and enjoy deep-dish pizza at Gino's East or Lou Malnati's or a Chicago hot dog at locations throughout the city. Delve into Chicago's thriving craft-brewery scene with a tour and a pint at a neighborhood brewery such as Half Acre Beer Company. Driving Distance: 102 MI / 164 KM

ROCKY MOUNTAINS & THE GREAT PLAINS

DENVER - ARRIVAL

Day 1: After arrival at the airport, pick up your rental car and proceed to your hotel. Denver is the perfect blend of outdoor beauty and big-city charm. It was also one of the first U.S. cities to embrace the craft brewing movement. Discover the Denver Beer Trail, home to some 20 craft breweries, including the city's oldest microbrewery, Wynkoop Brewing Company. Denver's Larimer Square, now a bustling hub of shops, restaurants, bars and clubs, was the city's first block, founded before Colorado became a territory.

DENVER - CAÑON CITY

Day 2: Driving south toward Cañon City plan for a stop in Colorado Springs at Garden of the Gods Park, which features dramatic sandstone formations set against the breathtaking backdrop of Pikes Peak. Another must-see stop is Seven Falls, a series of waterfalls cascading 181 feet through a box canyon. Go to the fabulous Broadmoor luxury resort for lunch before continuing to Royal Gorge Bridge & Park just outside Cañon City. See one of the world's highest suspension bridges, take in the stunning scenery and experience some amazing thrill rides.

Driving Distance: 121 MI / 195 KM

CAÑON CITY - VAIL

Day 3: Depart Canon City via the Gold Belt Byway, and experience spectacular views of deep canyons and lush parklands. Stop and enjoy lunch in the charming ski destination of Breckenridge, once a mining town and now home to unique boutiques and restaurants in quaint historic buildings. Continue to Vail, where you will overnight in the upscale resort town at the base of Vail Mountain. Get ready to browse hundreds of boutiques and galleries in this pedestrian-friendly city.

Driving Distance: 132 MI / 214 KM

VAIL - GRAND JUNCTION

Day 4: Drive an hour west to scenic Glenwood Springs, known for its hot springs and caves. Springs such as Glenwood Hot Springs Pool and Iron Mountain Hot Springs are said to have healing powers. Find even more fun activities at Glenwood Caverns Adventure Park, where there are cave tours, thrill rides and numerous restaurants. Drive an hour west to Grand Junction, where you will overnight and can enjoy a truly immersive food and beverage experience. Grand Junction has been Colorado's fruit-growing hub since the late 1800s. Stroll through local vineyards and stay for a wine tasting. Outside the city, take in the stunning, panoramic views of the red rock canyons at Colorado National Monument on the 23-mile Rim Rock Drive.

Driving Distance: 149 MI / 240 KM

GRAND JUNCTION - ROCK SPRINGS

Day 5: Head north and take Dinosaur Prehistoric Highway. Stop at Dinosaur National Monument, where you can visit the quarry and see dinosaur bones and fossils encased in rock. Continue northwest with a stop at Flaming Gorge National Recreation Area, where many lookout points provide spectacular views of its crystal reservoir and red rocks, before reaching the historic mining town of Rock Springs. Arrive in time to visit the Bureau of Land Management wild horse viewing area. Driving Distance: 249 MI / 401 KM

ROCK SPRINGS - YELLOWSTONE NATIONAL PARK

Day 6: Continue north to the Jackson Hole valley and stop for lunch in the small town of Jackson, which embraces a pioneer sensibility, evident in stagecoach tours, rodeos and heritage tours. The Town Square is famous for four large arches made from elk antlers collected at the nearby National Elk Refuge. Continue through Grand Teton National Park to Yellowstone National Park along the John D. Rockefeller Memorial Highway. Driving Distance: 257 MI / 415 KM

YELLOWSTONE NATIONAL PARK

Day 7: Stretching more than 3,500 square miles (9,605 square km) and three states, Yellowstone National Park is the USA's first national park. It sits atop a volcanic hot spot that creates impressive geothermal activity. Bring a picnic and eat while you wait for the next eruption of Old Faithful, a

geyser that spews hot water high into the sky throughout the day. Do not miss a visit to the historic Old Faithful Inn, believed to be the world's largest log structure. Experience the many other natural wonders Yellowstone has to offer and spot great wildlife in the Park.

YELLOWSTONE NATIONAL PARK - BILLINGS

Day 8: Head north out of Yellowstone, through Gardiner toward the eclectic railroad town of Livingston. Stop at this picturesque destination for lunch, browse art galleries and visit Livingston Depot Center to learn about railroad history. Follow the Yellowstone River Valley east to Billings, the state's largest city. Surrounded by seven mountain ranges, you can explore the Montana wilderness and discover a wealth of wildlife. Do not miss a chance to visit the Moss Mansion; the architect also designed the Waldorf Astoria and Plaza hotels in New York City. Driving Distance: 200 MI / 323 KM

BILLINGS - MEDORA

Day 9: On the way east to Medora, take a slight detour to visit the Little Bighorn Battlefield National Monument, site of the famous 1876 battle. Explore the visitor center and Custer National Cemetery before continuing the journey northeast into North Dakota to the Theodore Roosevelt National Park. Take the Scenic Loop Drive to experience the Northern Great Plains and the Badlands, where bison still roam.

Driving Distance: approx. 280 MI / 452 KM

MEDORA - RAPID CITY

Day 10: Drive east to the Painted Canyon Visitors Center to take in spectacular views of the Badlands from its scenic overlook before traveling south into South Dakota. Go through Spearfish Canyon, then head to the historic mining town of Deadwood, site of one of the Old West's most famous gold rushes. Stop at Mount Moriah Cemetery before continuing through the stunning scenery of the Black Hills to Sturgis, home of the famous Sturgis Motorcycle Rally and the Sturgis Motorcycle Museum & Hall of Fame. In Rapid City visit Main Street Square, view life-size bronze statues of past U.S. presidents and enjoy dinner at one of the many restaurants.

Driving Distance: 239 MI / 385 KM

RAPID CITY - HOT SPRINGS

Day 11: For a great experience depart early for Keystone to see the sun rising over Mount Rushmore National Memorial. The hand-carved monument depicts the faces of four past U.S. Presidents. Continue to Crazy Horse Memorial, before visiting Custer State Park, famous for its buffalo herds and scenic drives and the state's largest. Arriving in Hot Springs, a must-stop place is Evans Plunge Mineral Springs, the town's oldest attraction. Do not miss the Mammoth Site, an ancient sinkhole, featuring the fossilized remains of more than 61 mammoths. Driving Distance: 57 MI / 92 KM

HOT SPRINGS - SCOTTSBLUFF

Day 12: Travel south to Nebraska, where your first stop is Chadron to tour the Museum of the

Fur Trade at the James Bordeaux Trading Post. Continue to Fort Robinson State Park, where Crazy Horse died in 1877 and the Chevenne Outbreak happened in 1879. Enjoy the spectacular scenery and herds of longhorn and buffalo. At Scotts Bluff National Monument walk on parts of the original Oregon Trail. Drive to the summit of the bluff for breathtaking valley views of the North Platte River. Driving Distance: 145 MI / 234 KM

SCOTTSBLUFF - ESTES PARK

Day 13: Travel southwest to Chevenne, Wyoming's capital, which is filled with Old West character. Visit the Cheyenne Depot, a 19th century railroad station that now houses a visitor center and interactive museum. Continue with a walking tour of downtown, making sure to stop at one of the many western wear shops to try on cowboy boots and hats. Have lunch before departing for Estes Park, gateway to Rocky Mountain National Park. Driving Distance: 188 MI / 303 KM

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



NASHVILLE - ARRIVAL

Nashville has many places to hear bluegrass music while you are in town. Pair your musical experiences with a tour of Nelson's Green Brier Distillery. Learn about the distillerv's German founder and taste some of the hand-crafted Tennessee whiskey.

NASHVILLE - TULLAHOMA

Day 2: Depart Nashville for Jack Daniel's Distillery in Lynchburg. Miss Mary Bobo's Boarding House and Restaurant is a chance to eat down-home cooking and at the Lynchburg Hardware General Store you can see memorabilia. On your way to Tullahoma, take a detour to Short Springs Natural Area featuring lush scenery and lively waterfalls. It is only a short drive to Tullahoma. Cascade Hollow Distilling Co. is where George Dickel Tennessee Whiskey is handmade.

Driving Distance: 70 MI / 114 KM

TULLAHOMA - PIGEON FORGE

Day 3: On the way to Pigeon Forge consider to make a stop in Knoxville to watch a live radio performance at Knoxville Visitor Center. The WDVX Blue Plate Special is always free and has broadcast everything from blues and bluegrass to Celtic and funk. Pigeon Forge is the home of Dollywood and Dollywood's Splash Country, an Appalachian-inspired theme park founded by singer and songwriter Dolly Parton. The park holds music-centered events throughout the year and dinner shows that showcase horses and country music.

Driving Distance: 203 MI / 328 KM

PIGEON FORGE - LEXINGTON

Day 4: Bluegrass and bourbon are both inextricably tied to the land. Explore the natural beauty that inspired bluegrass musicians with a detour through the Daniel Boone National Forest and visit the Kentucky Music Hall of Fame and Museum in Mount Vernon. An hour north from Mount Vernon is Lexington, Kentucky's horse capital, where you will spend two days. Driving Distance: 231 MI / 372 KM

LEXINGTON

Day 5-Day 7: Today you will meet thoroughbred horses at Darley at Jonabell Farm, where Kentucky Derby winning stallions have been bred. Visit Keeneland, the internationally renowned racecourse. At Blue Door Smokehouse you can enjoy a house-smoked barbecue. Continue your journey in horse country at Claiborne Farm covering more than 100 years of thoroughbred racing history and see some of today's champion racehorses. Driving Distance: 70 MI / 114 KM

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LEXINGTON - VERSAILLES

Day 8: The beauty of horse country unfolds on this half-hour drive to Versailles. Stop at WinStar Farm, home to award-winning stallions. Then visit Lane's End Farm before considering lunch at Melissa's Cottage Café and continuing to Lawrenceburg's Wild Turkey distillery. One of

VERSAILLES - CINCINNATI

Day 9: Take a break from bourbon and drive for two hours to Cincinnati. Walk across the "Purple People Bridge," a pedestrian walkway that connects Cincinnati, Ohio to Newport, Kentucky, being the longest connector of its kind in the USA. The riverfronts of the two cities are linked with options for entertainment, dining, nightlife, festivals, parks and attractions. New Riff Distilling offers a range of craft whiskeys and hosts a 60-foottall, 24-inch-diameter copper still. Driving Distance: 98 MI / 158 KM

CINCINNATI - INDIANAPOLIS

Day 10: Explore more of the new urban craft distillery scene when you get to Indianapolis. The 12.05 Distillery is named for the date prohibition was repealed. Next up on your bourbon trail is West Fork Whiskey Co. producing spirits in its own fashion with ingredients from Indiana. Continue your tour at Hotel Tango artisan distillery, the first artisan distillery in Indianapolis since Prohibition, located in the historic Fletcher Place neighborhood of downtown Indianapolis. For dinner, you might consider Bluebeard. Driving Distance: 114 MI / 185 KM

INDIANAPOLIS - LOUISVILLE

Day 11: Today you will explore the mecca of American horse racing in Louisville, Kentucky. Churchill Downs is the home of the famous Kentucky Derby horse race. See the iconic twin spires that sit atop the grandstands and visit the Kentucky Derby Museum. Experience the Stitzel-Weller Distillery close to downtown Louisville. It opened on a derby day in 1935 and is home to the Bulleit Bourbon brand. Doc Crow's, located in the historic Whiskey Row of downtown Louisville is an option for dinner.

Driving Distance: 114 MI / 185 KM

LOUISVILLE - OWENSBORO

Day 12: Drive south to the rolling foothills of Clermont, home of the Jim Beam American Stillhouse. For lunch, grab a meal at bourboninspired café, Fred's Smokehouse. Next up is the Oscar Getz Museum of Whiskey History. This museum has a collection of rare whiskey artifacts. Drive south to visit the Maker's Mark distillery in Loretto, which is considered the oldest working distillery on its original site. The grounds of this distillery are also an arboretum. In the evening you will reach Owensboro. Driving Distance: 109 MI / 177 KM

OWENSBORO

Day 13: Get ready for more bluegrass history and visit the Bluegrass Music Hall of Fame & Museum. Wrap up the day with a visit to the O.Z. Tyler Distillery. The distillery has around 130 years of history in Owensboro.

Driving Distance: 13 MI / 21 KM

OWENSBORO - NASHVILLE

Day 14: On your way back to Nashville, make a stop in Rosine to tour the Bill Monroe Museum, home to the legacy of Bill Monroe, the "father of bluegrass." It will be a two-hour drive back to Nashville. Driving Distance: 128 MI / 206 KM

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

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

GREAT PLAINS ADVENTURE

TULSA - ARRIVAL

Day 1: Tulsa is a distinctive mix of influences offering Southern charm, Eastern elegance and Western Flair. You will experience Native American ancestors, cowboy culture, and the wealth from the oil tycoons of the 1900s. The Brady Arts district is anchored with the Philbrook Museum Downtown, the Woody Guthrie Center, and public music events every weekend. Cherry Street is another eclectic music, art and food district to look for. - Overnight Tulsa, OK. Driving Distance: 10 MI / 16 KM (Local)

TULSA - TAHLEQUAH - FORT GIBSON - MUSKOGEE - TULSA

Fort Gibson is the first army post in the Indian Territory that was in operation from 1824 to 1890. Return to Tulsa. Overnight Tulsa, OK.

Day 3: Known as the "Mother Road" follow historic Route 66 and enjoy the eclectic towns of Sapulpa, Bristow, Stroud, and Chandler. Oklahoma City is Oklahoma's largest city. Overnight Oklahoma City, OK. Driving Distance: 20 MI / 32 KM (local)

OKLAHOMA CITY - SULPHUR - OKLAHOMA CITY

Day 5: Native American culture is the focus of today's itinerary, with a visit to the Chickasaw Nation through exhibits, demonstrations and other outreach projects. PONCA CITY - WICHITA

Day 7: Wichita, Kansas' largest city is the heart of the United States. Wichita's colorful history is featured on the Guided Trolley Tour. Immerse yourself in the 1870s and experience Wichita as a Wild West settler at Old Cowtown Museum. The Prairie Rose Chuckwagon Supper is a good bet for western entertainment with Chuckwagon inspired BBQ dinners. Also, within the 'Museums on the River District' is the Wichita Art Museum, the renowned Botanica Wichita Gardens and the Mid-America All Indian Center. Walk to the iconic 44-foot-tall Keeper of the Plains statue placed on the sacred ground of the confluence of the Big and Little Arkansas River. Old town is the place to spend your evening with a large selection of GREAT restaurants and diverse clubs offering live music & entertainment. Overnight Wichita, KS. Driving Distance: 30 MI / 48 KM

WICHITA - YODER - HUTCHINSON

Day 8: The Gallery of Nations, which surrounds the museum, contains flags that represent all of the American Indian nations. The quaint Amish village of Yoder is home to the unique Carriage Crossing Restaurant. Browse Country Traditions Store for handmade Amish quilts. Spend your afternoon in Hutchinson Kansas Cosmosphere and Space Center, featuring the largest collection of U.S. space artifacts outside of the National Air and Space Museum and the largest collection of Russian space artifacts in the Western world. Overnight Hutchinson, KS.

Driving Distance: 50 MI / 80 KM

HUTCHINSON - MCPHERSON/CANTON - LINDSBORG - SALINA

Day 9: Hedrick's Exotic Animal Farm has animal adventures not typically found in Kansas. Visit Strataca an underground adventure 650 feet below the Kansas prairie, the only salt mine tour of its kind in North America. Head north toward McPherson/Canton to the Maxwell Wildlife Refuge. Next to Lindsborg to enjoy a unique Swedish community offering street shops, museums, galleries, studios, and cultural events. A few of the must see galleries and studios include Birger Sandzen Memorial Gallery, Elizabeth's, Hemslojd, Inc., Old Mill Museum, and the Red Barn Studio. Overnight Salina, KS. 

Fort Leavenworth played an important role in keeping the peace among the various Indian tribes and the increasing number of invading settlers heading west. 

MINNEAPOLIS - ARRIVAL

Day 1: Welcome to Minneapolis. Nestled in the upper Midwest, Minneapolis is the perfect blend of natural beauty and urban sophistication. No other American city has a chain of lakes, the mighty Mississippi, and 200 miles of walking, biking and cross country ski trails within its city limits. Minneapolis is also home to one of the most vibrant arts and music scenes outside New York City, some of the nation's finest museums, and the longest continuous skyway system in the world. Upon arrival, pick-up your rental car and transfer independently to your hotel.

MINNEAPOLIS - SIOUX FALLS

Day 2: Traveling through a series of small towns, your journey today takes you to South Dakota's largest city and the "Heart of America," Sioux Falls. Conveniently located on the banks of the Big Sioux River, Sioux Falls is chock full of attractions, fine cuisine and culture. Falls of the Big Sioux River is the natural beauty that gave the city its name, and, like a lot of places in South Dakota, it has a long history. At Falls Park visitors can see the city's namesake, some of the first buildings built in Sioux Falls, and enjoy the sites of the waterfalls which dump 7,400 gallons of water over the 100-foot course each second.





Day 3: Venture off the beaten path today and on to US-281 enabling you to explore some charming Texas towns en route to Austin. This scenic route will add a little time to your journey, but it assures minimal traffic and maximum fun. The capital of Texas and "Live Music Capital of the World," Austin is a stage. With 250+ music venues representing every style, fitting a quintessential musical experience into your visit is an absolute must-do. So when you head out this evening, be sure to bring your sense of adventure and wear comfy shoes along with your dancing pants.

AUSTIN

Day 4: In order to claim you've actually experienced Austin's food culture, we recommend starting your day with an iconic breakfast taco served in restaurants throughout the city. After you've fueled up, take a guided tour of the Texas State Capitol. Built in 1888 and the city's most visible manmade attraction, this pink granite building stands as a symbol of the legendary spirit of Texas. Visit the LBJ Presidential Library for a glimpse into the life, work, and legacy of America's 36th President. The Lady Bird Johnson Wildflower Center on the outskirts of town makes for a great afternoon outing and has numerous trails and plantings that keep the original flora of the state flourishing. If you want to get a sense of Austin's vibrant outdoor life, there may be no better place than Lady Bird Lake. And, for a truly fascinating experience, head to the Congress Avenue Bridge at dusk to witness the city's 1.5 million Mexican Free-Tailed Bats emerge from underneath the bridge from April through October.

AUSTIN - SAN ANTONIO

Day 5: Today we recommend heading west and joining TX-165 so you can revel in all that's beautiful about Hill Country ... rolling hills, wildflowers, majestic live oaks, and lots of twolane road. Rejoin US-281 and arrive in San Antonio, quite possibly Texas's most beautiful city. Remember the Alamo - the city's most widely recognized landmark? It's here, sitting in a plaza right downtown. A symbol of Texas' fight for independence, the Alamo is treated not as a museum or an attraction, but as a shrine: men are asked to remove their hats and voices are expected to be hushed. It's a power feeling that you must experience for yourself.

SAN ANTONIO

Day 6: The Alamo is by no means the only thing to see in San Antonio. In fact, the Mission Trail is a great place to explore centuries of history and culture with visits to the four other missions of San Antonio, all now UNESCO World Heritage Sites. The heart of the visitor area, however, is the River Walk. This festive, almost magical place, winds through downtown at 20-feet below street level providing scenic pathways and waterways for the city's cultural and historic sites as well as a picturesque link between restaurants, hotels and shops. For a taste of Mexican culture, you can head a few blocks over from the River Walk to Historic Market Square where you can peruse shops selling crafts and jewelry, dine on Tex-Mex food and enjoy Spanish music and mariachi bands.

SAN ANTONIO - GALVESTON

Day 7: Today it's on to the Texas Gulf Coast for some island time. Sitting on a barrier island near the northern end of Texas coastline, Galveston is a sandy playground heralded in Victorian times as the "Playground of the South." With more than 30 miles of shoreline, this is where you will find sun-drenched historic charm that encourages lingering. Moody Gardens and its iconic pyramidal structures provide a fun place to spend the day. This vast compound includes an aquarium, beachfront waterpark, rainforest habitat, science museum and more.

GALVESTON

Day 8: Kick off your day with a stroll through The Strand Historic District. A shopping area defined by the architecture of its 19th-century buildings, this is where antique lovers, art aficionados and shoppers of all kinds will discover beautiful and interesting objects. Relax with your toes in the sand or ride along the shore by horseback at East Beach. Walk back in history at the Bishop's Palace where massive front doors open to reveal an interior of equally impressive beauty, or visit The Bryan Museum which houses the largest collection of its kind in the world. Once the sun dips down, one of the hottest places on the

island is Pleasure Pier which features a myriad of attractions for all ages.

GALVESTON - HOUSTON

Day 9: Today, en route to Houston, we suggest a stop at Space Center Houston where you can go behind the scenes of America's exciting space program at NASA Johnson Space Center. See the original Mission Control, the actual facilities where astronauts train, and consider spending time with a NASA astronaut while enjoying a delicious lunch. Continue to Houston, the fourth largest city in the U.S. chock-full of exciting things to do.

HOUSTON

Day 10: Spend the day exploring this unique city. Take a stroll through the historic Heights District rich with character-filled architecture, funky boutiques and delightful restaurants. If it's culture you're looking for, the pedestrian-friendly Museum District houses 19 cultural institutions in a beautiful park-like neighborhood. Make your way through the River Oaks area which contains some of the most coveted (and expensive) real estate in the city. This evening, grab a bite in one of the many award-winning restaurants, or if you're looking for a safe way to hit the nightlife scene, check out the Wave, a service that shuttles folks around the city's primary nightlife areas.

HOUSTON - DALLAS

Day 11: From Houston, it's on to the "Big D" where you'll be met with a hearty helping of Texas hospitality. The city of Dallas has something for everyone. From glittering skyscrapers and a past rich in the stuff that American legends are made, to prize-winning architecture and the best shopping in the Southwest, "big things happen here."

DALLAS

Day 12: Dallas' many neighborhoods and entertainment districts have everything you can imagine for an exciting and diverse visit. Explore the life of President John F. Kennedy at The Sixth Floor Museum. Get an in-depth look at 8 years of presidential history at the George W. Bush Presidential Library & Museum. Stand amongst massive bronze longhorn sculptures at Pioneer Plaza. Meander through time at Dallas Heritage Village. Enjoy world-class architecture as you wander through the Dallas Arts District, step into the Dallas Museum of Art, or experience breathtaking 360-degree views of Dallas from 470 feet up at the Reunion Tower's GeO-Deck. The choice is yours.

DALLAS - DEPARTURE

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

ROUTE 66 AND TEXAS HILL COUNTRY

DALLAS - ARRIVAL

Day 1: Welcome to Dallas. The "Big D" is a glittering city of skyscrapers with a past and present rich in the stuff that American legends are made of. From barbecue and steaks to cowboy boots, country music and the nostalgia of the old west - "big things happen here." Upon arrival, pick-up your rental car and proceed to your hotel. Get your bearings in the city with a trip 470 feet (143 meters) up to the Reunion Tower GeO-Deck to enjoy 360-degree views of Dallas. Stay for dinner in the elegant Five Sixty Restaurant, which is 50 stories up. See the city with a free ride on one of the vintage M-Line trolleys, available at 40 stops around Dallas and running through Uptown and Downtown (watch for the vintage advertisements on the trolley). Set aside time to explore the Dallas Museum of Art, one of the largest art museums in the USA and featuring some 22,000 works from around the globe. Expand your cultural adventure with a stroll through the Bishop Arts District, home to more than 60 independent shops, galleries, restaurants, bars and coffee shops.

DALLAS - OKLAHOMA CITY

Day 2: Two and a half hours north of Dallas is the serene and unspoiled Chickasaw National Recreation Area in Sulphur, Oklahoma. The area draws nature lovers and fishermen who enjoy outdoor recreation in the streams, springs and lakes here. Nearby, at the Chickasaw Cultural Center, learn about Native American culture and history in an expansive, interactive museum dedicated to Chickasaw life. The cafe serves traditional foods such as grape dumplings and fry bread. From Sulphur, head about 90 minutes north to Oklahoma City to browse through the National Cowboy & Western Heritage Museum, filled with Old West artefacts, or go modern with a trip to the Oklahoma City Museum of Art, home to one of the largest collections of Chihuly glass sculptures in the world. In spring, grab a seat at the National Circuit Finals Rodeo, one of the biggest events of the professional rodeo season. Driving Distance: 233 MI / 374 KM

OKLAHOMA CITY - AMARILLO

Day 3: Historic Route 66 winds past the majestic Capitol Building in Oklahoma City, where you can take a guided tour or explore the building on your own. Worthy of note, this is the only capitol building in the world that's surrounded by working oil wells. Stop for a home-style lunch of chickenfried steak, Oklahoma's signature dish, at Ann's Chicken Fry House (look for the pink Cadillac and vintage police car parked outside). Stay on Route 66 to Hydro, Texas, and visit Lucille's Service Station. Built in 1929, this is one of only a few historic service stations remaining on Route 66 in Oklahoma. This popular sightseeing stop has been restored to its original condition; however, it's no longer an operating service station. Continue along Route 66 to the Oklahoma Route 66 Museum in Clinton. Here, you can see exhibits depicting the history and legends of the most famous highway in the USA. Visitors will also learn about a devastating period in American history when, in the 1930s, the Midwest states became known as the 'Dust Bowl'; more than two million people were eventually displaced by dust storms, poverty and lack of opportunity. Many headed west, away from drought and despair, and toward the hope of a brighter future. As you cross the state line into Texas, en route to Amarillo, Texas, this stretch of Route 66 is home to several vintage Mother Road icons, as well as glimpses of the Wild West. Long stretches of the old road remain, with the original concrete in many spots. Driving Distance: 280 MI / 450 KM

AMARILLO - SANTA FE

Day 4: Continue west along Route 66 to Adrian, Texas, and make a stop at the Midpoint Cafe. This is the midpoint of Route 66, where it's 1,139 miles (1,833 km) east to Chicago, Illinois, and 1,139 miles (1,833 km) west to Los Angeles, California. Cross into New Mexico and drive to Tucumcari to stop at one of the last remaining curio shops in New Mexico. Tee Pee Curios is not only a unique sight from outside, but inside too, with its Route 66 souvenirs, shirts and jewelry. Head west, then north on Route 84, which was also old Route 66, on the way to Santa Fe, where the scenery changes into desert with mountains and mesas. Driving Distance: 233 MI / 374 KM

SANTA FE

Day 5: Enjoy a full day of leisure in Santa Fe. Start at the famous Canyon Road galleries, a collection of more than 100 art galleries, shops and restaurants. Continue to the Georgia O'Keeffe Museum to see the colorful work of this important American artist. Take a break with a meal at one of Santa Fe's many restaurants celebrating the most well-known local product, New Mexico chili peppers. Save time to explore the Museum of International Folk Art, home to more than 125,000 objects from 100 countries, the largest collection of its kind in the world. Explore the ancient lives of the Puebloan people at Bandelier National Monument, where petroglyphs and cave dwellings can still be seen in the rock face. Driving Distance: 299 MI / 481 KM

SANTA FE - CARLSBAD

Day 6: Head south to Carlsbad, with a stop along the way at Roswell. It's the site of the 1947 Roswell Incident, which put Roswell on the map as the location of a possible UFO landing - and now home to the UFO Museum, attractions and shops. Continue to Carlsbad Caverns National Park, tucked beneath the scenic and rugged Chihuahuan Desert, in the rocky slopes and deep canyons of the Guadalupe Mountain range. The world's most-famous cave system has huge underground chambers filled with spectacular, varied cave formations, viewable on a self-guided tour. Visitors may choose to hike along the steep 1.25-mile (2 km) paved trail, entering through the cave's Natural Entrance, which leads them into the spectacular 1.25-mile (2 km) Big Room Trail. Or, simply take an elevator ride from the visitor center directly to the Big Room Trail. Driving Distance: 300 MI/ 482 KM

CARLSBAD - FREDERICKSBURG

Day 7: Get an early start and head into Texas Hill Country to Fredericksburg, where walking tours illuminate the area's German heritage. Afterwards, sample local culinary favorites and brewing at the town's bistros, bakeries and beer gardens. Hill Country also takes pride in its barbecue tradition, with mesquite coals lending a signature flavor to meat, including tender brisket. Seek out an iconic barbecue restaurant such as Backwoods BBQ. Driving Distance: 400 MI / 643 KM

FREDERICKSBURG - SAN ANTONIO

Day 8: Drive Scenic Highway 16 from Fredericksburg to Kerrville, the unofficial capital of Texas Hill Country. Take time to visit its excellent museums, galleries and shops before continuing on to San Antonio. Explore San Antonio's 18thcentury Spanish Catholic missions, including Mission San Antonio de Valero (known as The Alamo), which collectively were named a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Nearby, the River Walk is a paved path along the city's namesake river. Follow it to restaurants with open-air patios, or take a boat tour. In this gateway to Latin America, Mexican-made clothing and artisan wares make unique souvenirs, and the cuisine is in a class of its own. Tex-Mex, as it's called, blends Mexican and American culinary traditions. Sample tasty enchiladas at a family-owned restaurant or fresh fish tacos from a small taqueria.

Driving Distance: 85 MI / 136 KM

SAN ANTONIO - AUSTIN

Day 9: Today, take more time to explore Texas Hill Country on the way to Austin. Pause to cool off in the area's natural springs: Krause Springs, Blue Hole and Hamilton Pool are local favorites. Austin earns its reputation as a live music capital with some 250 venues. Slip into a retro bar such as The Continental Club for Rockabilly, Country and Swing shows, or get tickets to Austin City Limits Live at The Moody Theater, a venue that hosts concerts of all genres and the taping of Austin City Limits, the USA's longest-running televised music series. You may know Austin for its springtime South by Southwest Music Festival. However, you can find music festivals almost any time of the year, so listen up when you're in town. From breakfast tacos stuffed with farm fresh eggs and avocados to top-shelf margaritas, Austin is also revered for its take on Tex-Mex. Try ordering from one of the city's popular food trucks or trailers. Driving Distance: 100 MI / 160 KM

AUSTIN - FORT WORTH


Day 10: Depart Austin and head to Fort Worth, an easy 30-minute drive west of Dallas, Texas, and a modern city that honors its cowboy roots. Start at the always-bustling Stockyards National Historic District for Old West shops selling cowboy boots and hats, many saloons offering live entertainment, and lots of barbecue and other dining options. Learn about the strong women who shaped the American West with a visit to the National Cowgirl Museum and Hall of Fame, which is packed with artwork and stories from women such as artist Georgia O'Keeffe and singer Patsy Cline. Take a walk around the 35 blocks of Sundance Square downtown, a large shopping, dining and entertainment district. Driving Distance: 200 MI / 321 KM



HISTORIC ROUTE 66

CHICAGO - ARRIVAL

Day 1: Arrive at Chicago's O'Hare International Airport and transfer independently to your hotel.

CHICAGO

Day 2: Step outside today and experience mile after magnificent mile of the Windy City. Stand on the corner of Michigan and Adams, marked as the starting point of Historic Route 66. Enjoy coffee and a big breakfast at Lou Mitchell's, a Chicago institution since 1923 and a must for Route 66 travelers. Stroll the lakefront, peruse the shops, bike the parks, grab a Chicago Dog, or explore the city's incredible sights and architectural treasures including Willis Tower, one of the tallest buildings in North America.

CHICAGO - ST. LOUIS

Day 3: This morning, pick up your rental car and get ready for an unforgettable journey into the then and now of America along Historic Route 66. This legendary old road passes through a variety of pure Americana landscapes and takes in some of the country's biggest, oldest and most peculiar sites along the way. Begin your journey by following the traditional east-to-west path of Route 66 from Chicago to St. Louis, Missouri, cruising through endless cornfields and flat prairies. En route, don't miss Wilmington's most photographed "citizen", the larger-than-life green Gemini Giant, and Atlanta's Bunyan Giant, a 19foot statue of Paul Bunyan holding a giant hot dog. In Springfield, stop at the Cozy Dog Drive-In, the birthplace of the corn dog, and explore the legacy of Abraham Lincoln with a visit to the Lincoln Home National Historic Site. Once in St. Louis, the largest city along Route 66, you can follow in the footsteps of legendary explorers by visiting the historic sites found throughout the city, including the Gateway Arch, the nation's tallest monument.

Driving Distance: 300 MI / 480 KM

ST. LOUIS - SPRINGFIELD

Day 4: Continue through the Ozark Highlands of southern Missouri to Springfield, recognized as the birthplace of Route 66. En route, stop at Meramec Caverns, an extensive set of natural limestone caves whose formations and colors are as unique as they are beautiful. Adding to the pleasure of exploring the caves is learning that Jesse James used them as a hideout and took advantage of the underground river to escape through the "back door".

Driving Distance: 210 MI / 340 KM

SPRINGFIELD - TULSA - OKLAHOMA CITY

Day 5: This morning, cut through the southeastern corner of Kansas on your way to Oklahoma City. The Oklahoma section of Route 66 contains more driveable miles than any other state as well as several miles of the original 9-foot road segment that served Oklahoman families headed west in search of better opportunities during the

1930's. En route to Oklahoma City, stop to view the beloved 20-foot tall cement Blue Whale in Catoosa, a landmark along Route 66, and the Cyrus Avery Route 66 Memorial Bridge in Tulsa honoring the "Father of Route 66's" memory and connection to the historic highway. Once in Oklahoma City, the state's capital, be sure to check out the old Route 66 motels, gas stations and numerous vintage buildings. Driving Distance: 310 MI / 520 KM

OKLAHOMA CITY - AMARILLO

Day 6: Continue to Amarillo, located in the pancake-flat plains of the Texas Panhandle. This area of Texas was once the buffalo-rich grasslands of the Great Plains, inhabited by bands of Kiowa and Comanche Indians. Stop at the Route 66 Museum in Clinton where you experience six decades of Route 66 history. See Shamrock's Tower Station and the U-Drop Inn Cafe whose towering spire is still a reminder of the booming business it once saw. See the first restored Phillips 66 gas station in McLean and in Groom, the leaning water tower and a 150-foot tall stainless steel cross. Once in Amarillo, be sure to stop at Big Texas Steak Ranch where you can attempt their 72oz. steak challenge.

Driving Distance: 260 MI / 420 KM

AMARILLO - ALBUQUERQUE

Day 7: Before leaving Amarillo be sure to visit Cadillac Ranch. This unique display of art features a row of ten colorfully painted Cadillac cars buried grille first in the ground. Continue to the MidPoint Café in Adrian famous for its "ugly crust" pies. From Adrian you'll follow Route 66 to Albuquerque, New Mexico for a great taste of the Land of Enchantment. Driving Distance: 270 MI / 450 KM

ALBUQUERQUE

Day 8: The state's largest city, Albuquerque spreads north and south along the banks of the Rio Grande. Spend the day exploring Downtown Albuquerque's Central Avenue, a treasure trove of Route 66 landmarks. Historic Old Town offers a taste of New Mexico's Spanish colonial past while the Indian Pueblo Cultural Center, owned by the state's 19 different Pueblo communities, traces the history of the region's Native American cultures.

ALBUQUERQUE - SANTA FE - ALBUQUERQUE

Day 9: To get a true sense of the Old Route 66, today you will detour to New Mexico's state capital, Santa Fe. Founded on the ruins of an abandoned Indian village and steeped in history. Santa Fe is the oldest capital in the U.S., and although it lost its place on Route 66 in 1938, it remains one of the most picturesque cities in the state. At one time this was the end of the old Santa Fe Trail, the earliest trade route linking the American frontier back east with the far west. Plan to visit one of Santa Fe's famous art galleries, art markets, or museums full of traditional and contemporary art, including works by their own

RIVE AMERICA

Georgia O'Keeffe, or shop for authentic creations you just won't find anywhere else. Driving Distance: 116 MI / 186 KM

ALBUQUERQUE - HOLBROOK

Day 10: This morning, the state of Arizona welcomes Route 66 travelers with an overwhelming display of trading posts. View huge concrete tepees that stand at the foot of brilliant red-rock mesas en route to Petrified Forest National Park, the only park in the National Park System containing a section of Historic Route 66. Here you will come faceto-face with over 13,000 years of human history and one of the world's largest and most colorful assemblies of petrified wood, historic structures and archeological sites. Catch a sunset over the Painted Desert from the park's Kachina Point before heading to Holbrook. Once in Holbrook, stop at the Wigwam Motel whose steel and concrete teepees featuring modern conveniences have welcomed quests since the 1950's.

Driving Distance: 260 MI / 420 KM

HOLBROOK - GRAND CANYON/WILLIAMS

Day 11: Continue to Meteor City, a true vintage trading post whose distinctive dome can be seen for miles along this stretch of Route 66. Pass through Flagstaff and Williams en route to Grand Canyon National Park, a natural wonder that you simply have to see to believe. Spend the day discovering the distinct South Rim of the Canyon. Stop at one of the numerous overlooks, walk part of the Rim Trail or along the historic Hermit Road. Visit a Photo Hot Spot, or climb to the top of a stone Watchtower for panoramic views that extend over 100 miles on clear days. Driving Distance: 180 MI / 290 KM

Day 13: Enjoy a full day Las Vegas style. Walk the famous Strip lined with mega-resorts and flashing neon lights, place a bet at one of the many casinos, dine at world-class restaurants, catch the latest must-see show, shop designer boutiques, ride a rollercoaster, lay by the pool ... the list goes on. CANYON ADVENTURE

LAS VEGAS - ARRIVAL

Day 1: Arrive in Las Vegas, pick up your car at the airport and proceed to your hotel. Las Vegas Today experience the fun, attractions and the atmosphere of this glittering "Entertainment Capital of the World." Try your luck at gambling or see one of the famous Las Vegas shows.

LAS VEGAS

LAS VEGAS - ZION NATIONAL PARK - BRYCE CANYON

The stunning sandstone cliffs surround you as you explore the majesty of the park. Visitors to Zion park at the Visitor Center and then ride environmentally friendly shuttles through the most scenic areas of the park. There are many hiking trails that allow you to explore at your own pace. Continue to the equally impressive Bryce Canyon where wind and rain have carved spires from the red rocks. This evening we suggest stargazing from your hotel.

Day 5: Explore the canyons of Canyonlands National Park which took over 300 million years to form. At Mesa Verde National Park see some of the world's best preserved Native American cliff dwellings. Driving Distance: 143 MI / 229 KM

MESA VERDE NATIONAL PARK - MONUMENT VALLEY - GRAND CANYON

Day 6: Drive to famous Monument Valley to see its red sandstone spires and monoliths. Continue to the trading post of Cameron and through the Navajo Indian Reservation to the incredible Grand Canyon. Driving Distance: 310 MI / 498 KM


GRAND CANYON - LAS VEGAS

Day 7: A full day at leisure to see one of the great natural wonders of the world, the spectacular Grand Canyon, on an optional day trip by air. In form, color, and geological significance, the Grand Canyon of the Colorado River is unsurpassed. The canyon is 277 miles long, averaging 10 miles in width from rim to rim and is 5,700 feet deep. Enjoy more spectacular impressions of the Grand Canyon before returning via the gigantic Hoover Dam to Las Vegas.



CANYONS, MESAS AND HOODOOS

LAS VEGAS - ARRIVAL

Day 1: Welcome to Las Vegas. Upon arrival, pick-up your rental car and proceed to your hotel. Begin your adventure under the neon lights of Las Vegas, an oasis in the desert of southern Nevada. You'll lose track of time along the Strip, where resorts with elaborate themes offer an array of options, including 24-hour casinos, innovative dining options from big-name chefs, and variety shows and concerts starring legendary headliners. Whether you choose to stay in a luxury resort or in more modest accommodation, excitement is in store. If you like high-end shopping, prepare to stroll through The Forum Shops at Caesars or The Shops at Crystals and Via Bellagio. For budget-friendly shopping, head to the north end of the Strip to the Fashion Show Mall or to the Las Vegas Premium Outlets. For a unique experience, visit the Downtown Container Park, an openair center with boutiques, restaurants, bars and live music. Less than an hour from the glitz and glamour of Las Vegas, Valley of Fire State Park features spectacular attractions of a very different sort. At the oldest state park in Nevada, you'll see magnificent sandstone formations that are 150 million years old, ancient petroglyphs and abundant wildlife. Many of the park's animals, including bobcats, jackrabbits and coyotes, are nocturnal, giving a different meaning to 'nightlife'.

LAS VEGAS - BRYCE CANYON

Day 2: Today, travel to Bryce Canyon National Park through Virgin River Gorge and the natural amphitheater of Cedar Breaks National Monument. Once in Bryce Canyon, take the park's 38-mile (61 km) scenic drive to acclimate yourself and select where to return to sightsee or hike. Do not miss a hike to the expansive Bryce Amphitheater. This impressive natural landscape sits below the Rim Trail hiking path and is filled with hoodoos, which are brightly colored, tall, thin rock spires. Plan to spend several days at the park so you can experience both sunrise and sunset, photographing the views from overlooks such as Sunrise Point, Sunset Point, Inspiration Point and Bryce Point. Stay after dark to see the vast, star-filled night sky.

Driving Distance: 259 MI / 416 KM

BRYCE CANYON - MOAB

Day 3: Travel through Capitol Reef National Park, famous for its white sandstone domes and the towering monoliths of 'Cathedral Valley'. Arches National Park is the site of more than 2,000 natural arches, many accessible through a variety of hiking trails that accommodate all levels. Moab is at the confluence of the Colorado and Green rivers and is an epicenter of river rafting, so you may wish to stay longer and explore. Driving Distance: 440 MI / 708 KM

MOAB - PAGE/LAKE POWELL

Day 4: Today, explore Canyonlands National Park, carved by the Colorado River and featuring a dramatic desert landscape of mesas and canyons, before visiting Natural Bridges National Monument with three natural bridges viewable from Bridge View Drive or from hiking trails

to the bridges themselves. Monument Valley Navajo Tribal Park is known for its towering sandstone buttes and has been the location for many Hollywood movies. The nearby town of Page, Arizona, straddling the border of Utah and Arizona, is the gateway to Lake Powell, popular for houseboating, fishing, kayaking and rafting. Plan to visit Antelope and Navajo canyons, Rainbow Bridge National Monument and Horseshoe Bend, one of the most photographed curves in the Colorado River. For a truly memorable experience, take a helicopter or hot-air balloon ride to see it all from above. Extend your stay here to enjoy the many activities available.

Driving Distance: 273 MI / 439 KM

PAGE/LAKE POWELL - ZION

Day 5: Zion National Park is famous for its steep red cliffs, canyons and towering rock formations


as well as cascading waterfalls and rivers. A hike along the Virgin River to explore its waterfalls and hanging gardens is a must-do as well as a hike through water in the narrowest section of Zion Canyon, with walls 1,000 feet tall (300 meters) and the river just 20 to 30 feet (six to nine meters) wide. This area is a favorite for photographers of all levels due to its amazing light and structure. If you are lucky, you may get to view some of the park's wildlife, including California condors, mountain lions and bighorn sheep. A five-mile (eight km) scenic drive along the Kolob Canyons Road allows visitors to experience the crimson canyons and view the dramatic overlooks. Driving Distance: 104 MI / 167 KM

ZION - LAS VEGAS



WESTERN TREASURES

SAN FRANCISCO - ARRIVAL

Day 1: Arrive at San Francisco International Airport, pick up your car and proceed into the City by the Bay.

SAN FRANCISCO - MONTEREY/CARMEL

Day 2: Begin your drive this morning via Castroville to Monterey. Visit Cannery Row (brought to fame by John Steinbeck's novel) and the quaint village of Carmel. Enjoy stunning views of the rugged coastline and the Pacific Ocean on 17-Mile Drive, then continue to your hotel for your overnight stay.

Driving Distance: 130 MI / 210KM

MONTEREY/CARMEL - SANTA BARBARA - OXNARD

Day 3: Continue south along central California's scenic Pacific Coast Highway. This twisting, cliff-hugging route starts in Monterey and takes you through Big Sur where mountains plunge into the Pacific Ocean. Farther south, the landscape mellows to oak-studded hills as the road passes Hearst Castle and ends in Morro Bay. A short distance inland is the heart of the Central Coast, San Luis Obispo. From here, continue south to Oxnard passing through Pismo Beach, inland agricultural valleys of rolling countryside, and Santa Barbara, often described as the American Riviera. Driving Distance: 280 MI / 451 KM

OXNARD - MALIBU - SANTA MONICA - LOS ANGELES

Day 4: Today, travel further south through, yet another beautiful stretch of coast in Malibu, and the seaside town of Santa Monica. Arrive in Los Angeles with enough time to glimpse some of the glitz and glamour of the City of Angels. Check out the Hollywood Walk of Fame, TCL Chinese Theatre, formerly Grauman's Chinese Theatre, the Sunset Strip, Beverly Hills, and Rodeo Drive; some of the best sights Los Angeles has to offer. Driving Distance: 70 MI / 120 KM

LOS ANGELES

The afternoon is yours to explore more on your own or join an optional excursion to Universal Studios where you will learn all about how movies are made.

LOS ANGELES - ANAHEIM - SAN DIEGO

Day 6: This morning, make your way south to Anaheim, Orange County's headquarters for fun. Spend the day surrounded by icons and classic characters at the original Disneyland Park or at its companion park, Disney California Adventure Park. (optional, fees apply) Visit the nation's oldest theme park, Knott's Berry Farm, filled with old west history and thrill rides. (optional, fees apply) Or choose from one of Anaheim's many other fun-filled attractions before continuing further south to San Diego whose cool breezes, tranquil waters, and miles of world-renowned beaches welcome visitors from all over the world. Driving Distance: 131 MI / 211 KM

SAN DIEGO

Day 7: A full day to discover some of San Diego's attractions such as: Balboa Park, Old Town, SeaWorld, which is the largest park in the world devoted to marine life, Coronado Beach, the San Diego Zoo, and Seaport Village.

SAN DIEGO - LAS VEGAS

Day 8: Drive north past Lake Elsinore to the picturesque town of Temecula. Enjoy famed rolling hills and vineyards on your way to Las Vegas, one of the most popular adult playgrounds in the world. Driving Distance: 336 MI / 538 KM

LAS VEGAS (GRAND CANYON OPTIONAL)

Day 9 and Day 10: Two full days at leisure for you to either take a short drive to Lake Mead and Hoover Dam, or see one of the great natural wonders of the world, the spectacular Grand Canyon, on an optional day trip by air. In form, glowing color, and geological significance, the Grand Canyon of the Colorado River is unsurpassed. The canyon is 277 miles long, averages 10 miles in width from rim to rim and is 5,700 feet deep.

LAS VEGAS - ZION

Day 11: Leave the man-made wonder of Las Vegas and travel through the desert to the Colorado Plateau and the natural wonders of the National Parks. Travel through St. George and the charming town of Springdale before arriving at Zion National Park. You have a full afternoon to explore this magnificent park with its amazing canyons. There are trails to explore for every ability level. Driving Distance: 165 MI / 265 KM

ZION - BRYCE CANYON

Day 12: Travel to central Utah and visit the majestic hoodoos of Bryce Canyon. Nature's artistry has created rocks in various shades of red, formed by erosion into pinnacles and spires, even more stunning against the blue skies of the area. You may want to explore the canyon by walking or by horseback. In the summer months you may even be able to enjoy the local rodeo! Driving Distance: 90 MI / 144 KM

BRYCE CANYON - PAGE/LAKE POWELL

Day 13: In the morning, make sure to view the dazzling display of color and light of the sunrise at Bryce Point. The sun rising above the canyon ignites the red rock spires turning them into an ever-changing kaleidoscope of color. Continue south through Utah, passing through the charming western town of Kanab where many cowboy films have been made. Later, arrive in Page and visit the Glen Canyon Dam and magnificent Lake Powell with its crystal blue waters. In the afternoon or evening you may want to take a cruise on Lake Powell. Driving Distance: 155 MI / 249 KM

PAGE/LAKE POWELL - GRAND CANYON

Day 14: This morning, you may want to take the time to take a guided tour of the slot canyons of

Antelope Canyon before heading to the Grand Canyon. These canyons are known for their varying color of sandstone and are a photographer's dream. It is a short drive to the Grand Canyon, one of the natural wonders of the world. Spend your time walking along the rim of the canyon, participating in a ranger led talk or maybe take a helicopter flight above the canvon. Driving Distance: 136 MI / 218 KM

GRAND CANYON

Day 15: A full day at leisure to see one of the great natural wonders of the world, the spectacular Grand Canyon, on an optional day trip by air. In form, color, and geological significance, the Grand Canyon of the Colorado River is unsurpassed. The canyon is 277 miles long, averaging 10 miles in width from rim to rim and is 5,700 feet deep.

GRAND CANYON - LAS VEGAS

Day 8: Leave the grandeur of the Canyon behind as you head west today through Williams and Kingman, the heart of Historic Route 66 and one of Arizona's hidden treasures, to Hoover Dam. Considered the largest single public works project in the history of the U.S., Hoover Dam straddles the mighty Colorado River, which forms the border between Nevada and Arizona and brings much-needed water and power to the Southwest. Continue to Las Vegas, Nevada, a city that needs no introduction.

Driving Distance: 276 MI / 444 KM




NATIVE ANCESTRAL CITIES AND CULTURES

PHOENIX - ARRIVAL

Day 1: Welcome to Phoenix, a thriving desert metropolis boasting beautiful desert scenery and more than 300 days of sunshine a year. Upon arrival, pick-up your rental car and proceed to your hotel. Begin your exploration of Phoenix/Scottsdale with a hot-air balloon tour and gaze below at the splendor of the Sonoran Desert. With its abundant sunshine and natural beauty, Phoenix/Scottsdale is a golfer's paradise; there are more than 200 courses in the area, and golf enthusiasts will want to play on them for a day or two. The varied trails of the Desert Botanical Garden are a great opportunity for nature lovers who want to explore the flora and fauna unique to the Southwest desert. If Native American art and culture are your interests, head to the Heard Museum, which houses more than 44,000 objects. For spectacular mountain views, drive the Summit Road to Dobbins Lookout at South Mountain Park. Those looking for exercise and adventure can challenge themselves on two difficult summit trails at the rust-colored Camelback Mountain in the Echo Canyon Recreation Area. Shoppers will delight in bargains found at one of the area's outlet malls or the high-end shopping at Biltmore Fashion Park. Nearby, explore ancient pueblo structures and learn about prehistoric farmers at the Hohokam Pima National Monument and Casa Grande Ruins National Monument in the Gila Valley.

PHOENIX - GRAND CANYON

Day 2: An Ancestral Puebloan cliff dwelling dating to around 1200, Montezuma Castle National Monument includes a five-story structure, essentially a home for about 50 people, built by the indigenous



Sinagua people. Sedona, long considered a spiritual oasis because of the number of healers and artists living there, and Flagstaff on famous Route 66, often called the USA's "Mother Road," are must-stop destinations on the way to Grand Canyon National Park. Few places can top the stunning natural beauty of the awe-inspiring Grand Canyon, which is a mile (1.6 km) deep and up to 18 miles (29 km) wide. The more easily accessed South Rim is open year-round. Tour the park's landscapes by car, bus, mule, helicopter, raft or on foot.

Driving Distance: 363 MI / 584 KM

GRAND CANYON - MESA VERDE

Day 3: Experience the towering sandstone "sculptures" of Monument Valley Navajo Tribal Park, famous as the location for many Western movies, before visiting Canyons of the Ancients National Monument, which has more than 6,000 archaeological sites of the Puebloan and Native American cultures. Continue learning about ancient times with a visit to Mesa Verde National Park, famous for having some of the most wellpreserved Ancestral Puebloan cliff dwellings with the 150-room Cliff Palace, the largest in North America, as the most notable. Explore the park's museum collection of more than 3 million objects or hike to take in some of the most spectacular views of the canyons and landscape. Driving Distance: 442 MI / 711 KM

MESA VERDE - CHINLE

Day 4: First stop today is Chaco Culture National Historic Park, considered to be one of the most important ancient ancestral homes of both the Hopi and Pueblo people. Stop at the Navajo Nation to learn about art and culture at the Hubbell Trading Post National Historic site, then continue to Canyon de Chelly National Monument, where people have lived for nearly 5,000 years. GIANT TREES & ANCIENT FORESTS

SAN FRANCISCO - ARRIVAL

Day 1: Welcome to San Francisco, the land of fog and fabulousness. Upon arrival, pick-up your rental car and proceed to your hotel. It's certainly possible to walk up and down San Francisco's famous hilly streets, but why not hop aboard a cable car instead? You'll rest your legs and see the sights while enjoying one of the city's iconic experiences. Spend time at Fisherman's Wharf, a waterfront neighborhood and visitor destination that includes seafood restaurants, Pier 39 with its sea lions, Madame Tussauds Wax Museum, historic ships and other attractions. Climb up Telegraph Hill to take in panoramic city views from the top of Coit Tower and stroll down winding Lombard Street. If time allows, join a free walking tour across the Golden Gate Bridge. Dine on delicious ethnic cuisine in some of the city's diverse neighborhoods, including Chinatown, the largest Chinatown outside of Asia. Fifteen miles (24 km) north of the city, Muir Woods National Monument is literally a monument to trees - specifically an old-growth forest of coastal redwoods that are between 600 and 800 years old and stand about 250 feet (76 meters) tall. There are dozens of trails, but try the six miles (10 km) leading through Pinchot Grove and Cathedral Grove and along Redwood Creek. Plan your visit for a weekday and arrive in early morning to experience the forest at its guietest and most magical. Muir Woods is part of the Golden Gate National Recreation Area that spans three counties in the San Francisco Bav area. Take a ferry tour, or explore by bicycle from Sausalito. Extend the day and visit Point Reyes National Seashore, a short journey farther north, where you can hike in the hills or along the beach. Keep an eye out for whales and harbor seals.

SAN FRANCISCO - LASSEN VOLCANIC NATIONAL PARK







Walk the famous Strip lined with mega-resorts, place a bet at one of the many casinos, dine at world-class restaurants, catch the latest must-see show, shop designer boutiques, ride a roller-coaster, lay by the pool... the list goes on. With so much to do, 24 hours in a day hardly seems like enough.

LAS VEGAS - CALICO - LOS ANGELES

Day 12: This morning, take the opportunity to photograph the iconic Welcome to Las Vegas sign before making your way back to Los Angeles. Spectacular scenery surrounds you as you travel through the Mojave Desert, while a visit to Calico Ghost Town, an authentic Old West silver mining town, offers visitors the opportunity to share in its rich history and enjoy the natural beauty of the surrounding desert environment. Driving Distance: 287 MI / 462 KM

LOS ANGELES - DEPARTURE

SANTA FE - TAOS - DURANGO

Day 6: Depart Santa Fe for Taos whose landscape is a dramatic reminder that you are now surrounded by some of the most ancient land forms on Earth. Visit Taos Pueblo, the only living Native American community designated both a UNESCO World Heritage Site and a National Historic Landmark. The multi-storied adobe buildings of this village have been continuously inhabited for over 1,000 years. Continue to Durango, Colorado's year-round playground whose historic sites and landmarks are waiting to be discovered. Step back in time at the Diamond Belle Saloon whose bar still has a bullet hole in it from a gun fight.

Driving Distance: 271 MI / 462 KM

DURANGO - SILVERTON - DURANGO

Day 7: Today, you may wish to board the Durango & Silverton Narrow Gauge Railroad for an unforgettable journey back in time. Originally constructed in 1882, and in continuous operation for 131 years, the railroad's vintage steam locomotives let you relive the sights and sounds of yesteryear as you travel alongside the Animas River, one of the last free-flowing rivers in the entire western U.S. This route boasts some of Colorado's most striking canyon scenery and spectacular views. You'll pass fertile farmlands, old stagecoach roads, old mining camps, and be in the shadow of peaks reaching over 14,000 feet. It won't take you long to figure out this is much more than a train ride. (optional, fees apply)




Day 8: This morning, head west to Mesa Verde National Park, home to some of the most notable and best preserved cliff dwellings in the U.S. Mesa Verde, Spanish for green table, offers a spectacular look into the lives of the Ancestral Pueblo people who made it their home for over 700 years. Continuing west just past Cortez you'll drive through the "four corners", the only place in the U.S. where four states intersect at one point: Arizona, New Mexico, Utah and Colorado. Further west is Kayenta, Arizona, gateway to Monument Valley Navajo Tribal Park. This great valley is framed by scenic clouds that cast shadows on the desert floor, and boasts sandstone masterpieces that tower to heights of 400 to 1,000 feet.

Driving Distance: 219 MI / 452 KM

KAYENTA - GRAND CANYON - WILLIAMS

Day 9: Depart early today for Grand Canyon National Park, a natural wonder that you simply have to see to believe. Spend the day discovering the distinct South Rim of the canyon. Stop at one of the numerous outlooks, walk part of the Rim Trail or along the historic Hermit Road, visit a Photo Hot Spot or climb to the top of a stone Watchtower for panoramic views that extend over 100 miles on clear days. When you've had your fill, continue to the quaint mountain town of Williams where you will experience the personality of an authentic Western village. Driving Distance: 212 MI / 341 KM





SAN FRANCISCO - ARRIVAL

Day 1: Arrive at San Francisco International Airport, pick up your car and proceed to your hotel.

SAN FRANCISCO

Day 2: Today enjoy the sights and sounds of "The City by the bay". Hop a cable car if you so choose and drop to Fisherman's Wharf for a beautiful view of the Golden Gate Bridge and some of the tasty fresh seafood. Whilst there visit an artisan bakery where the local sourdough bread is made fresh daily. And, for chocolate lovers, no trip to The City is complete without a visit to the local chocolatiers, Ghirardelli's, whose founding location is now a public landmark and part of the National Register of Historic Places. Under the historic Clock Tower, you may wish to feast upon an ice cream Sundae with hot chocolate sauce, Ghirardelli's style. This evening, you may wish to stroll the Embarcadero or sample Dim Sum in Chinatown or see the twinkling city lights atop Twin Peaks (bring your jacket!).

SAN FRANCISCO - DRIVE THRU TREE PARK - CLOVERDALE - FT. BRAGG

Day 3: Today head north from the city and at the base of the first giant redwood grove, you may wish to drive your car through the base of a redwood tree at the Drive-Through Tree Park! (admission fee). Continuing north, you'll reach the Sonoma Marin Cheese Trail, comprised of farmsteads for local cheese makers. This area is known as the Normandy of California. Here you may wish to visit a farm where cheese is made and perhaps attend a cheese tasting or two. Some of the finest Goat, Brie, Swiss, Mozzarella's and more hail from these farms. Next you will drive through Cloverdale Wine Country where you may wish to stop and picnic at one of the many local vineyards or orchards. Perhaps you'd like to pick up a crisp local Cabernet Sauvignon or freshly bottled olive oil to compliment your sourdough bread from San Francisco for later this evening. After lunch your journey takes you past the historic Point Cabrillo Lighthouse, where you may wish to stop and explore, to the coastal city of Ft. Driving Distance: 154 MI / 247 KM

Day 4: Awaken at the seaside town of Ft. Bragg and perhaps consider a brisk morning walk along Glass Beach where the sand at this unusual beach is covered with interesting-shaped and colored rocks and stones. Time permitting, walk along the bluffs, home to a production mill of yore for special views. Continue north on the Shoreline Highway 1 through the moss covered trees lining the Pacific Coastline that will take you to California's Redwood Empire. At Redway, the world famous Avenue of the Giants section of the drive begins, a 31 mile drive with 51,000 acres of magnificent Redwood Trees, the tallest tree species in the world. At the many convenient services along the way, you may enjoy stops to picnic, hike, swim, fish, raft, bike ride or simply experience peace in the cool hush of this ancient forest. Then you dip again to the coastline city of Eureka, the largest coastal city between San Francisco and Portland which played a leading role in the West Coast lumber trade and where today Redwood Burl Artists abound. Here we invite you to experience artisan shops with tables, mantles, clocks, carvings and more made from the special burl wood. From Eureka we suggest you travel the Samoa Bridge which takes you across Humboldt Bay, Indian Island and Woodley Islands to your overnight destination, Arcata, home of the Redwoods Ziplining Canopy tour (fee applies). Arcata is also the home of Six Rivers Artesian Brewery, one of the first female owned breweries in California.

Driving Distance: 141 MI / 227 KM

ARCATA - REDWOOD NATIONAL PARK - COOS BAY

Day 5: You may wish to start your day in Arcata with a morning walk along the shores of Humboldt Bay at the Arcata Marsh & Wildlife Sanctuary known for pleasant walking trails and outstanding birding. Your journey north takes you through Redwood National Park where miles ahead wind gracefully through the majestic giants. Crossing the California border into Oregon, enter America's Wild River Coast. At Gold Beach, the mighty Rogue River meets the Pacific and is home to scenic jet boat and other river touring adventures (fee applies). Day 6: Your coastal adventure continues today through the spectacular Oregon Dunes National Recreation Area where wind-sculpted dunes tower to 500 feet above the sea. Formed by the ancient forces or wind, water and time, these dunes are like no others in the world and hold many special spots to spend the day exploring. Perhaps consider a picnic today, weather permitting. Your seaside drive continues alongside lighthouses, marinas and parks to the town of Lincoln City, named after the 16th USA President, Abraham Lincoln. Driving Distance: 125 MI / 201 KM

LINCOLN CITY - TILLAMOOK - PORTLAND

Day 7: Dip your toes this morning into the Pacific before starting your drive which takes you inland to

Tillamook and then on to Portland, the largest city of Oregon. In Tillamook, small creameries joined forces to produce a world-renowned cheese. Here you may visit the fascinating Tillamook Cheese Factory for an up-close look at the cheesemaking process and to try some tasty cheddar. Continue through the fairytale-esque Tillamook State forest with its evergreen trees covered in bright green moss to the city of Portland. Portland is known as being the most-walkable city in America. In this city, you will easily find some of the best local chocolatiers, bakeries, microbreweries, coffeemakers and independent food artisans, all within walking or a short public transit distance. **Driving Distance: 115 MI / 185 KM**

PORTLAND (COLUMBIA RIVER GORGE SCENIC AREA)

Driving Distance: 173 MI / 278 KM

SEATTLE

PACIFIC NORTHWEST WINE TRAIL

SAN FRANCISCO - ARRIVAL - NAPA VALLEY

Day 1: Arrive in San Francisco, pick-up your rental car and take the short drive to Napa Valley, which includes a trip across the famous Golden Gate Bridge. Stop for a photo in front of the iconic bridge at Battery East Vista above Fort Point National Historic Site. Once across the bridge, enjoy a second look at Golden Gate Bridge Vista Point in Sausalito before entering the quaint Mediterraneaninspired town. After lunch continue onto the town of Napa. In the heart of the wine region, downtown Napa offers a wealth of dining and nightlife options, as well as local arts and craft stores to explore. You can stay here or just outside of town in one of the many fabulous Napa Valley resorts. Driving Distance: 90 MI / 145 KM

NAPA VALLEY

Day 2: Begin your exploration of Napa Valley's fabulous vineyards in Yountville. Start your day at Domaine Chandon, one of the most beautiful locations for sipping wine in the valley. Depart Yountville for the short journey to St. Helena, passing such famous wine brands as Cakebread Cellars and Rutherford Estates along the way to V. Sattui Winery. V. Sattui features an artisan deli, offering a charcuterie selection from their own salumeria and more than 200 cheeses. It is well worth exploring the estate gardens, underground wine cellars and museum caves. After lunch, head back toward Napa for another must-visit for wine connoisseurs, the Opus One Winery in Oakville. (Appointments are required to visit Opus One.) For dinner don't miss The Restaurant at Auberge du Soleil, which is renowned as the first fine-dining establishment in Napa Valley and boasts 13 consecutive Michelin Star awards.

NAPA VALLEY

Day 3: Begin your second day in Napa Valley at one of wine country's true landmarks, the famous chateau at Domaine Carneros, inspired by the classic 18th century Chateau de la Marquetterie in Champagne, France (home of the legendary Champagne Taittinger). Enjoy a brunch of sparkling wine, caviar and smoked salmon from vour private table on the terrace overlooking gardens, a lake and the vineyards. Next, follow the lesser-trafficked Silverado Trail for a tasting at Luna Vineyards. Reservations are required. End your Napa Valley experience in vintage-luxury style with dinner aboard the Napa Valley Wine Train. Ride in 100-year-old railcars along a 150-yearold rail corridor on a 36-mile route Napa Valley Wine Train, California from downtown Napa to St. Helena and back, stopping at celebrated Napa Valley wineries along the way. To pair your elegant meal with panoramic views, choose the elevated Vista Dome car featuring special windows that get you closer to the landscape.

NAPA VALLEY - REDDING

Day 4: Depart Napa along the Silverado Trail, which winds its way northwest to Calistoga, home to famous mineral hot springs and historic mud baths. Visit the Old Faithful Gevser of California or the awe-inspiring Castello di Amorosa, a Tuscan-inspired castle and winery. Take the 10-mile, round-trip hike to the summit of Mount St. Helena (a 1,800-foot elevation gain), which offers breathtaking views of Napa Valley, the San Francisco Bay region and even Mount Shasta and Lassen Peak on clear days. Break up the rest of your journey to Redding with a stop at New Clairvaux Vineyard, located in the small town of Vina. The historic vineyard is a unique wine destination: It's home to Trappist-Cistercian monks, an order with a wine-making history that dates back nearly a thousand years. A visit to the tasting room is a must, but the peaceful grounds also include a church, bookstore and chapel. In Redding, a great place to have a steak dinner is Cattlemens' Steakhouse.

Driving Distance: 210 MI / 338 KM

REDDING

Day 5: A short distance from Redding, you will find Indian Peak Vineyards in the historic town of Manton. Visit the tasting room to sample the winery's full selection of wines, finishing with a dark chocolate truffle and signature "Donna's Dessert" wine. Lunch is also available most weekends. Time your summertime visit with a Friday or Saturday evening for live music and s'mores. Head back into Redding for a visit to Moseley Family Cellars, where you can both taste and learn about the wines. Make reservations for dinner at Moonstone Bistro, a hidden gem.

REDDING - ROGUE VALLEY

Day 6: Next, your wine tour route takes you to the beautiful Rogue Valley in the state of Oregon. Your first stop in Oregon will be Ashland, sitting at the base of the Cascade and Siskiyou mountain ranges and home to a vibrant arts scene, which includes the Oregon Shakespeare Festival. Just a short distance from town, visit the Irvine & Roberts Vineyards, open for wine tastings Wednesday through Sunday. Take in the spectacular views of the surrounding valley and mountains from the outdoor terrace, while enjoying pinot noir and chardonnay. Continue north to Paschal Winery, with its hilltop tasting room overlooking pear orchards and the local mountain ranges. Driving Distance: 160 MI / 258 KM

ROGUE VALLEY

Day 7: Continue to explore the beautiful Rogue Valley with a visit to Del Rio Vinevard Estate, located just outside small-town Gold Hill on the Rogue River. Its tasting room is situated in a historic hotel and includes an outdoor picnic area with vineyard views. Take a quirky side trip before heading back to Grants Pass to visit the House of Mystery at the Oregon Vortex. The house is situated on what is rumored to be a sort of "whirlpool of force." Back in Grants Pass, enjoy a tasting and lunch at Schmidt Family Vineyards. The food is prepared fresh and incorporates seasonal ingredients from the winery's gardens. Take time to savor a wine pairing from a selection of red, white, rose and dessert wines. After lunch, visit the fully-organic Wooldridge Creek Vineyard, Winery, Creamery & Charcuterie overlooking the Applegate River Valley. Sip hand-crafted wines while snacking on cheeses and cured meats, all produced on site. There's seating for every season too, whether in the gardens and patio, under the shade of trees or close to the fire. The farm is also home to dwarf goats, chickens, a mini donkey and a mini horse, among other pets. A great dinner choice is River's Edge Restaurant, located on the banks of the Rogue River and offering a menu of locally sourced ingredients. Arrive just before sunset and watch the sun go down over the river and surrounding hills.

ROGUE VALLEY - EUGENE

Day 8: Take a detour from wine tastings to visit Crater Lake National Park. Formed by a volcanic eruption and eventual collapse of the volcano more than 7,000 years ago, Crater Lake is the deepest lake in the USA and one of the deepest in the world. Rejoin your wine trail in the Umpqua Valley, and stop at Abacela Winery in Roseburg. which offers unique wines that include tempranillo, albarino and blanco dulce varietals, as well as delicious small plates served in a spectacular tasting room with gorgeous views. Continue your journey north to Eugene, located at the south end of the Willamette Valley on the banks of the Willamette River. This picturesque, lively city offers a mix of arts, culture, outdoors and dining. For an exceptional culinary experience, have dinner at Grit. located in the historic Shamrock House. Driving Distance: 240 MI / 387 KM

EUGENE

Day 9: Eugene has a diverse collection of wineries, and your day should begin with a visit to Silvan Ridge Winery, popular for its exquisite Willamette Valley pinot noir and pinot gris. The property includes a photo-worthy clock tower and amphitheater. A short trip from Silvan Ridge is Sarver Winery, which produces small lot runs of regional wines including pinot noir, pinot gris and chardonnay. Enjoy a tasting while taking in the spectacular surrounding valley. Head back to Eugene and explore the 5th Street Public Market, its locally owned stores and eateries. For a culture break, visit the Museum of Natural and Cultural History or the Jordan Schnitzer Museum of Art before taking the 30-minute trip to King Estate Winery for dinner. One of the largest organic vineyards in the world, this beautiful estate also has 30 acres of organic gardens and orchards, including a full acre of lavender. Arrive early to enjoy a tour and tasting before dinner. The stately on-site restaurant is focused on pairing local wines with local ingredients.

EUGENE - WILLAMETTE VALLEY

Day 10: Just north of Eugene in Junction City, you will find Pfeiffer Winery, a boutique winery and tasting room, specializing in small lots of high-end pinot noir and pinot gris that are only sold at the winery. The winery offers tasting experiences in its cozy Italian grotto-inspired tasting room, as well as in its water garden and tiki bar. A short distance away is Walnut Ridge Vineyard, housed in a unique French Colonial-style tasting room that features reclaimed timbers, gas lamps and a wood-burning fireplace. Enjoy wine and small plates on indoor or outdoor seating areas in the heart of the vineyard amid breathtaking vistas of the Cascade and Oregon Coast mountains. Continue into the heart of the Willamette Valley to Newberg for dinner at The Painted Lady, a charming farm-to-table fine dining restaurant that's tucked away in a Victorian house just steps from downtown. Driving Distance: 100 MI / 160 KM

WILLAMETTE VALLEY

Day 11: Your Willamette Valley tour continues in Dundee at Erath Winery, one of the pioneers of the Willamette Valley wine scene and a leading producer of pinot noir for more than 40 years. A tasting at Erath brings classic Oregon pinots together with views of the surrounding Jory Hills. For a tasty and laid-back lunch break, visit Red Hills Market. The market is also a restaurant. Across the street from Red Hills Market is the Argyle Tasting House, where you can enjoy intimate indoor or outdoor tastings of sparkling wine, riesling, chardonnay or pinot noir selections. Another nearby winery is The Four Graces, named after the original founders' daughters. The quaint tasting room is a historical farmhouse on the Foley Family Estate. In the evening, take a short drive to Dayton to dine at Joel Palmer House.

WILLAMETTE VALLEY - PORTLAND

Day 12: The last leg of your Willamette Valley tour starts at Sokol Blosser Winery just northeast of Dayton. Another of Oregon's pioneering wineries, its founders first planted pinot noir vines on a 5-acre plot in 1971. For your final winery experience, visit the Clubhouse at Domaine Serene to enjoy exquisite pinot noir and chardonnay, surrounded by the picturesque vineyards of the Winery Hill Estate. Drop in for a tasting, or schedule an intimate tour in advance. After lunch, depart the Willamette Valley for big-city Portland, and arrive in time to explore the rich culinary scene, which is renowned for its originality. Housed in a restored industrial building, Olympia Provisions Southeast started as the city's first salumeria but has expanded into a restaurant with an innovative take on rustic Spanish and Mediterranean cooking.

Driving Distance: 40 MI / 65 KM

DENVER - ARRIVAL

ROCK SPRINGS - JACKSON

Day 4: Depart Rock Springs and travel along the Wind River Gorge. Continue north over the

high chaparral of Wyoming and arrive in Jackson by early evening. Enjoy exploring the rustic Old West with a walk around the old-fashioned town square of Jackson.

LAS VEGAS - ARRIVAL

Day 1: Arrive at Las Vegas International Airport and proceed independently to your hotel.

LAS VEGAS

Day 2: Discover what else happens in Vegas by visiting Red Rock Canvon located just a few miles west of Sin City within Nevada's Mojave Desert. Red Rock Canyon features geologic beauty with red sky-high sandstone peaks, seasonal waterfalls, great boulders, and more. With over 20 different trails there is plenty for you to choose from to either enjoy the area by hiking the deep canyons or biking the one-way Scenic Drive. You can also stop by the Red Rock Canyon Visitor center for indoor and outdoor exhibits, desert Tortoise habitats, and hike recommendations.

LAS VEGAS - ZION NATIONAL PARK

Day 3: Leaving Las Vegas behind, you make your way toward southwest Utah to Zion National Park where ancient native people and pioneers walked the grounds. While visiting the park you will be able to take pictures of some of the most scenic canyon country in the United States, learn about the park's diverse wildlife, and see more than 1.000 species of plants. This afternoon pick up your half-day bike rental and follow the paved Pa'rus Trail to the top of the Canyon (included); avid bikers will enjoy getting an amazing overview of the park from the Zion Canyon Scenic Drive allowing you to pinpoint areas of interest you may want to revisit by foot. The scenic ride adds six miles to your biking adventure and provides you with the opportunity to get the most out of your time in the canyon.

Driving Distance: 159 MI / 256 KM

ZION NATIONAL PARK

Day 4: Today, you can hop off your bike, choose from a variety of hiking trails, and take on Zion by foot. Shuttles at Zion National Park enable hikers to get to their desired trail efficiently. Some of the trailheads include Chamberlain's Ranch, which is the primary trailhead for the Zion Narrows Top-Down hike, Birch Hollow, a popular canyoneering route, and East Rim, used by the majority of hikers looking to visit Observation Point, Weeping Rock, and Deertrap Mountain. Continue exploring and learn about the American Indian Culture and pioneer settlement at the Zion Human History Museum where you can watch informational videos, view exhibits, and buy maps to take a piece of history homes with you.

ZION - BRYCE CANYON NATIONAL PARK

Day 5: After your trip to Zion, explore another one of Utah's unique destinations at Bryce Canyon National Park. Bryce Canyon is famous for its spires of rocks called hoodoos, four main view points, and series of natural amphitheaters or bowls. Three of the best hikes you can experience in the area include Navajo Loop, considered the most popular trail among visitors, Fairland Loop, where you can take pictures of the hoodoo architectures, and Sunset Point, providing you with bird-watching fun and views over Silent City. Day 6: Continue your journey along Utah's scenic Byway 12 nestled between Bryce Canyon National Park and Capitol Reef in south-central Utah, follow the winding road through memorable landscapes, ranging from the remains of ancient sea beds to one of the world's highest alpine forests, and from astonishing pink and russet stone turrets to open sagebrush flats. Capitol Reef filled with cliffs, canyons, domes, and bridges, invites you to discover plants, animals, geology, and learn about the environmental factors that make this destination diverse. Enjoy the afternoon hiking the Fruita area, also known as "the Eden of Wayne County," and encounter the 133-foot-long Hickman Natural Bridge. You can also choose to add an optional excursion giving you a scenic horseback ride to experience Capitol Reef National Park from a new angle. Driving Distance: 93 MI / 150 KM

CAPITOL REEF - MOAB

Day 7: On this day you head on over to Moab where visitors from around the world flock to witness the red rock landscape of Arches National Park and cool waters of the Colorado River. You will find relaxing small-town hospitality in the city of Moab with perfect weather for events, festivals,

Driving Distance: 144 MI / 232 KM

MOAB

Day 8: With a variety of trails for beginner, intermediate, and advanced cyclists, Moab is perfect for a full day on the road. Moab's trails feature Dead Horse Point State Park neighboring the Canyonlands National Park, great for riders of all skill levels, Hurrah Pass, a scenic dirt road ride with view of canyon walls, and Monitor Merrimac with amazing dinosaur tracks and bones. The area is full of amazing day-hikes if you prefer to explore by foot allowing you to get an up-close experience of what makes Moab one of the most unique destinations in Utah. 

VAIL/BRECKENRIDGE

Day 11: On this day, enjoy more of the Vail Mountain by expanding your hiking knowledge by taking on some of the area's epic trails. You will have the chance to enjoy the wildflowers, capture a picture of the stunning views of the surrounding mountain ranges, and catch a glimpse of the wildlife. Take the Eagle Bahn Gondola (optional) up and follow the wooded Fireweed trail to Mid-Vail, challenge yourself on the Berrypicker trail, and enjoy spectacular views on the Grand Escape trail. To add to your adventure, visit Epic Discovery featuring zip lines, a mountain coaster, and more (optional).

VAIL - COLORADO SPRINGS

Day 12: Continue your journey with a stop in Breckenridge, a quaint Mining Town and popular destination for outdoor enthusiasts, then drive on to the Hossier Pass, the continental divide, before crossing Wilkerson Pass with views of the flatland





and a beautiful mountain backdrop. Arrive to the eastern foot of the Rocky Mountains at Colorado Springs and make your way to nearby North Cheyenne Cañon Park on the southwest side of town. At Cañon Park you can choose to bike or hike over 20 miles of hiking and biking trails featuring prairie-to-peak ecosystems. Day 13: As your adventure comes to an end, make the most of this final full day in Colorado Springs. Spend some time at the Garden of the Gods where you can enjoy free guided nature walks or a self-guided hiking program by visiting their Visitor and Nature Center. Afterwards, explore the Broadmoor Seven Falls and hike to Inspiration Point, named after American poet, writer and activist Helen Hunt. At Seven Falls you can also check out their shop for gifts and goodies or admire the Rockhounds at The Eagles Nest gallery featuring quality minerals and fossils. End your day by dining at one of Colorado Springs restaurants that range from a high-end experience to a country outdoor farm-to-table supper.

COLORADO SPRINGS - DENVER

Day 14: Leave the mountains behind and embark on the comfortable drive to Denver with an optional visit to the U.S. Airforce Academy conveniently located along the way. In Denver, explore the historic downtown dating back to the Old West era, visit the mansion of famed Titanic survivor Molly Brown or join a foodie tour to savor this urban American metropolis with 200 local breweries (optional).

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



WYOMING'S WIND RIVER COUNTRY

DENVER - ARRIVAL

Day 1: Welcome to Denver. With the impressive Rocky Mountains as a backdrop, Denver effortlessly blends the city's Old West heritage with today's modern skyscrapers and urban energy. Upon arrival, pick-up your rental car or take the new airport rail line into the heart of downtown. Time permitting, explore some of the city's must-sees, including the gold-domed State Capitol building, Larimer Square, City Park, or Denver's most scenic attraction - Red Rocks Amphitheatre. From fossil hunting to yoga at 6,450 feet, concerts are only the beginning of the fun at this iconic amphitheater and park.

DENVER - ROCKY MOUNTAIN NATIONAL PARK - CHEYENNE

Day 2: A short distance from Denver, enter Rocky Mountain National Park where you'll feel like you're on top of the world. And if you thought the journey to the park was beautiful, just wait until you experience the 'Highway to the Sky.' From here it's on to Wyoming where the Wild West comes alive. One of the most sparsely populated states in the U.S., Wyoming is a land of rugged landscapes, rich tribal legend, cowboy towns, an astounding diversity of wildlife and some of the world's greatest wilderness areas. Your first stop is Cheyenne, Wyoming's capital city that embodies the spirit of the Old West, See Old Number 4004 - the world's largest steam locomotive and one of the eight remaining Big Boys on display throughout the country; visit Cheyenne Depot, one of the last grand 19th century depots remaining from the transcontinental railroad, or take a trolley tour which provides a great introduction into the city and the Wild West.

Driving Distance: 157 MI / 253 KM

CHEYENNE - CASPER

Day 3: Today, embark on a scenic drive to Casper that encompasses numerous points of interest. Visit Fort Laramie National Historic Site - the largest and best known military post on the Northern Plains before its abandonment in 1890, and Register Cliff - the first night camp west of Fort Laramie for Oregon Trail travelers. Continue to Casper, a city steeped in western history, Old West culture and the legacy of pioneers who forged their way through the mountains and plains on their way to Oregon and California. A visit to the National Historic Trails Interpretive Center is a great place to start your exploration of Casper's frontier history.

Driving Distance: 179 MI / 288 KM

CASPER - THERMOPOLIS - CODY

Dav 4: En route to Cody, experience a powerful sense of place created by nature in Thermopolis, home of the world's largest mineral hot spring. Here you may want to enjoy the hot springs, cooling ponds, a swinging foot bridge across the Big Horn River, hiking paths and the chance to see wild buffalo. Located just 54 miles from the East Entrance of Yellowstone, living legend Buffalo Bill's Cody offers a little something for everyone. Celebrate the spirit of the American West at the Buffalo Bill Center of the West. Visit the Irma Hotel which once housed Annie Oakley and Calamity Jane. Step back in time at Old Trail Town. Enjoy an evening of entertainment at Dan Miller's Cowboy Music Review and watch broncs, bulls, steers, cowboys and cowgirls at Cody's nightly rodeo (June through August). Driving Distance: 214 MI / 344 KM

CODY - YELLOWSTONE

Day 5: Today, take an unforgettable journey into the world's first national park and nature's wonderland - Yellowstone. Here, the Earth is in action with geysers, mountain ranges, rivers, waterfalls and ancient volcanoes. The iconic spots - Old Faithful, Mammoth Hot Springs, Grand Prismatic Spring and Yellowstone Canyon - will be familiar from photographs, but seeing them in person is a humbling experience. They're not just as good as you've heard - they're better. In addition to superb scenery, the park is one of the world's principal wildlife preserves. Home to eagles, grizzly and black bears, buffalo, elk and much more, you're bound to see wildlife wherever you go.

Driving Distance: 161 MI / 259 KM

YELLOWSTONE

Day 6: Spend the day experiencing more of Yellowstone's natural wonders. Marvel at a

volcano'shidden power rising in colorful hot springs, mud-pots and geysers. Explore mountains, forests and lakes to watch wildlife and witness the drama of the natural world unfold, and get active with a walk along park trails and boardwalks.

YELLOWSTONE - GRAND TETON - JACKSON HOLE

Day 7: Leave the wonder of Yellowstone behind as you make your way to Grand Teton National Park, an exquisite mountain landscape where jagged peaks tower more than a mile above the Jackson Hole valley. Rising above a scene rich with extraordinary wildlife, pristine lakes and alpine terrain, the Teton Range dominates the park's skyline and stands as a monument to the people who fought to protect it. Be sure to stop at the Snake River Overlook made famous by Ansel Adams, where views of the Snake River flowing along the mountains puts the size of the Tetons into perspective. JACKSON HOLE - DUBOIS

Day 8: Your destination today is Dubois. Sitting in a valley, between the Absaroka and Wind River mountain ranges, Dubois' wooden boardwalks, pioneer architecture and rich history welcome visitors like a warm embrace. Stop at the Crowheart Butte interpretive sign (a Native American historical site) and drive the Trail Lakes road to Indian petroglyphs and a wildlife viewing area. Or, visit the National Bighorn Sheep Interpretive Center, home of the world's largest herd of Rocky Mountain Bighorns and a wildlife experience for all. Driving Distance: 76 MI / 122 KM

DUBOIS - LANDER - RIVERTON

Day 9: This morning en route to Riverton, visit the Wind River Wild Horse Sanctuary in Lander to see real wild mustangs up-close by taking a tour. The Sanctuary's Visitor Center hosts an interpretative display on the importance of the horse in the culture and traditions of Native Americans, as well as history of wild horses in North America. Once in Riverton, be sure to check out the Northern Arapaho Experience located in the lobby of the Wind River Hotel & Casino. This cultural room allows visitors to take a peek into the rich world of the Arapaho and experience the different styles of dance Arapaho men and women continue to practice. Driving Distance: 99 MI / 159 KM

RIVERTON - RAWLINS

Day 10: Today the choice is yours. You can arrange a Wind River Indian Reservation tour at the Wind River Hotel & Casino, or head straight to Rawlins. Located in Wyoming's Railroad Country, Rawlins is home to Wyoming Frontier Prison - the supposedly haunted museum and former state penitentiary that has been relatively untouched since it closed a little over 30 years ago. Get a glimpse into Rawlins' colorful past with a walking tour of downtown, a nationally designated historic district rich in 19th century architecture. Native American Indians, wagon trains, railroads and the Old West can all be found in Rawlins.

Driving Distance: 123 MI / 198 KM

RAWLINS - LARAMIE

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



GEOLOGICAL WONDERS

SALT LAKE CITY - ARRIVAL

Day 1: Welcome to Salt Lake City, a beautiful and vibrant destination that combines unparalleled access to natural recreation, remarkable history and warm hospitality. Upon arrival, pick-up your rental car and proceed to your hotel. Temple Square is Salt Lake City's main attraction, dedicated to the city's founding religion, the Mormon Church. See renowned architecture, or take a trolley tour to capture great photos of the four-hectare square and other city sites. Stroll the free botanical gardens and arboretum at Red Butte Garden. Experience Utah's famous powdery snow at Wasatch National Forest, or venture to the high-speed bobsled ride at Utah Olympic Park, where you might see Olympic athletes training. A visit to Great Salt Lake in the summer is a must; the water is so salty, you can float right on top.

SALT LAKE CITY - GRAND TETON - JACKSON HOLE

Day 2: Travel north to Grand Teton National Park. Located in northwest Wyoming, the park is home to the Teton Range, Grand Teton peak and the valley known as Jackson Hole. Locally known as the 'mountains of the imagination', the area offers clear blue lakes, a diverse array of wildlife and encompasses over 200 miles (322 km) of trails for hiking, biking or snowmobiling.

Driving Distance: 300 MI / 482 KM

JACKSON HOLE - YELLOWSTONE

Day 3: The John D Rockefeller Memorial Highway links Grand Teton National Park to Yellowstone National Park. Stretching more than 3,500 square miles (9,605 square km) and three states, Yellowstone National Park, the USA's first national park, sits atop a volcanic hot spot that creates impressive geothermal activity. Bring a lunch, grab a seat and eat while waiting for the next eruption of Old Faithful, a geyser that spews hot water approximately 17 times a day. While there, stop in the historic Old Faithful Inn, believed to be the world's largest log structure, which was built in 1904 from local materials. While exploring the park, stay on the marked boardwalks and trails to see other natural wonders, such as hot springs, geysers and pools. You're likely to encounter wildlife - including wolves, elk, bison, bear and moose - during hikes or mountain bike rides on one of the park's many backcountry trails. This park is so vast and has so much to see that one night is not sufficient, so plan on a longer stay. **Driving Distance: 70 MI / 112 KM**

YELLOWSTONE - TWIN FALLS


Day 4: Travel into Idaho to Craters of the Moon National Monument and Preserve in the Snake River plain. The volcanic wonderland encompasses of enormous lava flows, a testament to violent eruptions more than 2,000 years ago. Just outside Twin Falls, Hagerman Fossil Beds National Monument contains the most prehistoric horse fossils in the USA as well as many other animals, including mastodon, saber-toothed cats and bears. 

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

MOUNT RAINIER - MOUNT HOOD

Day 6: Part of the Pacific Ring of Fire, the Cascade Range is home to Mount St. Helens National Historic Monument and Mount St. Helens (or Louwala-Clough to native people), an active volcano that last erupted in 1980 and is known for its ash explosions and pyroclastic flows. CRATER LAKE - COOS BAY

Day 8: Head to the Siskiyou Mountains and Oregon Caves National Monument and Preserve, where you'll explore the caves, known as the 'Marble Halls of Oregon'. Inside the chilly caves - 44 degrees Fahrenheit (7 degrees Celcius) that formed as rainwater from forests eroded the marble below, learn about the geology and see fossils, spectacular formations and bats. From the caves, return to the breathtaking Oregon Coast and the Pacific Ocean.

Driving Distance: 200 MI / 321 KM

COOS BAY - PORTLAND

Day 9: Follow the ever-changing Oregon Coastal Highway, exploring quaint towns and seascapes, before entering the Willamette Valley, considered Oregon's Wine Country, known worldwide for its pinot noir. More than 300 wineries operate in the region, and this is a perfect place to stop on your way back to Portland for some wine tasting and lunch. Look for wineries with on-site restaurants. Driving Distance: 223 MI / 358 KM



Day 3 and Day 4: Depart Seattle's music scene to go outdoors and explore Olympic National Park, a diverse park spanning many different ecosystems, from the glaciated peaks of the Olympic Mountains, to ancient rainforests and the shores of Lake Crescent and the Pacific Ocean. The park is an outdoor enthusiast's paradise, and a definite multi-night destination not to be missed as part of your journey.

Driving Distance: 111 MI / 178 KM

OLYMPIC NATIONAL PARK AREA - PORTLAND

Day 5 and Day 6: Rejoin the quest to hear great music in Portland, known as "America's Indie Rock Mecca," where the music scene thrives. Bands emerging from the city include The Dandy Warhols, Blitzen Trapper, the Decemberists and The Shins. Catch local favorites playing at the Crystal Ballroom, The Doug Fir and The Roseland Theater. As well as being home to several record stores of all sizes. Portland also hosts many music events and festivals, including Concerts in the Park, MusicFestNW and PDX Pop Now. Enjoy the counterculture character of Portland at its many microbreweries, downtown food truck scene and the Willamette River waterfront. Craving a classic night? Take in a performance by the Oregon Symphony or the Portland Opera. Driving Distance: 162 MI / 260 KM

PORTLAND - COOS BAY

Day 7: Take a detour to the explore Oregon Wine Country in the Willamette Valley, known internationally for its exceptional pinot noir. More than 550 wineries operate in the region, and this is a perfect place to stop on your way to the spectacular Pacific Coast. At the Red Hills Market in Dundee, eat a meal of locally sourced food: afterward, go across the street to the tasting room at the Argyle Winery. Follow the Oregon Coastal Highway, exploring quaint towns and seascapes, before arriving in Coos Bay, home to the Oregon Coast Music Festival, where you can hear classical concerts featuring musicians from around the USA and Canada. While here, enjoy local seafood and beautiful beaches. Driving Distance: 223 MI/ 358 KM

COOS BAY - SAN FRANCISCO

Day 8 and Day 9: Arrive in San Francisco and bask in the history of this city, which was the heart of the 1960s hippie subculture. During the 1967 "Summer of Love," over 100,000 people converged on the Haight-Ashbury neighborhood. their start, must-visit music venues include Club Deluxe for great Jazz, Bottom of the Hill for local Indie and Hip-Hop artists and Feinstein's at the Nikko for shows with Broadway flair. Driving Distance: 601 MI / 967 KM

SAN FRANCISCO - CENTRAL COAST

Day 10: After a fun stay in San Francisco, relax on a drive south on Highway One along the California coast through Monterey, home to the Monterey Jazz Fest in September, one of the world's longest-running Jazz festivals. Plan your stay to be part of the incredible event, or continue south to spend the night in one of the many Pacific Ocean towns, such as Morro Bay, San Simeon or Cambria.

Driving Distance: 112 MI / 180 KM

CENTRAL COAST - LOS ANGELES

Day 11 and Day 12: Continue your journey along the breathtaking California Coast, stopping in Santa Barbara for lunch, before arriving in Los Angeles, the business hub of the music industry, and home to Capitol Records and A&M Records. On the drive, sing along to Beach Boys tunes or listen to Dick Dale's surf music guitar riffs. A multiyear host of the Grammy Awards ceremony at the Staples Center, Los Angeles also features some iconic venues like the Troubadour, Greek Theatre and Hollywood Bowl. The famed Sunset Strip in West Hollywood continues to attract music fans to Whiskey a Go Go, which once hosted the Doors and Led Zeppelin; the Viper Room, the one-time home of the Pussycat Dolls; and the Roxy, a legendary stage where new artists kick-start their careers. The City of Angels is a must-stop destination for any music enthusiast, and definitely a multi-night stay is in order to indulge in what this diverse city offers. Los Angeles is home to many stars, and a visit to celebrity hangouts like the Ace Hotel, Chateau Marmont or Wolf Gang Puck's restaurant at Hotel Bel-Air could result in a celebrity sighting. Stagecoach, also in April, focuses on Country music, and stars have included Shania Twain, Willie Nelson, Brooks and Dunn, and Carrie Underwood. If you cannot plan a visit to coincide with a festival, Palm Springs still has great live music venues, including Agua Caliente Casino Resort Spa, The Purple Room Supper Club and the McCallum Theatre. Driving Distance: 109 MI / 175 KM

PALM SPRINGS - LAS VEGAS

Day 14 and Day 15: Drive north for four hours to Las Vegas, known as the "Entertainment Capital of the World." Although synonymous with mega casinos, Las Vegas has been the home to a veritable who's who in the history of the music industry. Legends that have performed, or had residencies in, Las Vegas include Elvis Presley, Sonny and Cher, Dolly Parton, The Rat Pack, Barbra Streisand and Liberace. Current residencies include Celine Dion, The Who, Elton John, Britney Spears and Cher performing at such iconic venues as the Colosseum at Caesars Palace, The AXIS at Planet Hollywood and Park Theater at Monte Carlo. Touring artists make stops at The T-Mobile Arena and the MGM Grand Garden Arena. In addition to great headlining acts, Las Vegas' resorts also feature some of the best lounge entertainment in the world. Stay more than one night, because there is so much to see and do.

MARITIMES EXPLORER

HALIFAX - ARRIVAL

Day 1: Arrive in the port city of Halifax and transfer independently to your hotel. Halifax is a quintessential Maritime destination and cultural hub of Atlantic Canada, offering visitors a vast scope of things to do and places to explore. Allow yourself some time exploring the beautiful waterfront area.

HALIFAX - PEGGY'S COVE - HALIFAX

Day 2: We suggest to begin your morning with a drive to beautiful Peggy's Cove, and visit Canada's most photographed lighthouse, perched atop granite boulders. It is worth visiting the Halifax Citadel National Historic Site, located on top of a hill overlooking Halifax. You may explore the history of the fortress and the soldiers stationed there. Each day the Citadel comes alive with the sounds, displays and colour re-enactments of the kilted 78th Highlanders and the Royal Artillery. If later time allows, we recommend to explore Halifax's Titanic connection and the many fine shops along the harbor front. Driving Distance: 61 MI / 99 KM

HALIFAX - BADDECK, CAPE BRETON

Day 3: We recommend to travel to the northernmost part of Nova Scotia, cross over the Canso Causeway and enter beautiful Cape Breton Island. Continue on to Baddeck and visit the Alexander Graham Bell National Historic Site. At this National museum, see one of the largest collections of his photographs and personal mementos. Explore the work of this creative genius through displays and one of the largest collections of his photographs and personal momentos (admission not included). Driving Distance: 309 MI / 497 KM

BADDECK, CAPE BRETON

Day 4: We recommend to enjoy a drive on the Cabot Trail, the East Coast's answer to California's Pacific Coast Highway. On this scenic drive see stunning seascapes of giant cliffs and high mountains as they tumble down into the ocean from high above. It is likely that you will spot wildlife as you make your way along the Cabot Trail. On the eastern end, whales can often be seen from your car as you drive the high cliffs along the shore.

Driving Distance: 208 MI / 335 KM

BADDECK, CAPE BRETON - CHARLOTTETOWN, PRINCE EDWARD **ISLAND (VIA CAR FERRY)**

Day 5: Return to mainland Nova Scotia and take the Northumberland Ferries Limited (free of charge) to Prince Edward Island then continue to Charlottetown.

Driving Distance: 360 MI / 358 KM

CHARLOTTETOWN

Day 6: Known as the Birthplace of Canada, you can visit a replica of the Confederation Chamber at The Confederation Centre of the Arts, Canada's Memorial to the Fathers of Confederation. It is worth exploring Prince Edward Island, featuring carpets of bright green grass leading to bright

red cliffs. At Cap-Egmont we recommend to view the amazing Bottle Houses; these are three buildings that are made out of more than 25,000 glass bottles. You may also visit the Anne of Green Gables House, immortalized in the famous Prince Edward Island-based novel of the same name. Charlottetown is the home of the longest running seasonal musical in the world "Anne of Green Gables the Musical".

CHARLOTTETOWN - HOPEWELL ROCKS - FUNDY NATIONAL PARK - CAPE ENRAGE - SAINT JOHN

Day 7: Cross the Confederation Bridge into the province of New Brunswick to begin your exploration along the Fundy Coastal Drive, starting with the Hopewell Rocks, proudly boasting the best place to experience the highest tides in the world (up to 14 m / 48 ft.), where 160 billion tones of seawater flow, rising and falling twice a day, every day. Voted one of the Top 50 destinations to "discover, explore and experience" by Natural History Magazine, New Brunswick's side of the Bay of Fundy is the unspoiled, serene adventure travel mecca of Atlantic Canada and home to one of the planet's best collections of migratory whales

and birds. Include visits to Hopewell Rocks with lunch, Cape Enrage, village of Alma, and Fundy National Park. Arrive in the city of Saint John, Canada's oldest incorporated city and the only city on the Bay of Fundy. Saint John has a Loyalist heritage that goes back centuries. Today, Saint John is a vibrant port city full of urban adventure on the edge of nature.



SAINT JOHN - ST. ANDREWS BY-THE-SEA

Historic Uptown Saint John is a perfect for urban exploring on foot. Discover quaint alleyways, old-school pubs, and teeny tiny art galleries or stroll the waterfront - envisioning all the seafaring history that has unfolded there. Depart for nearby St. Andrews by-the-Sea, a celebrated Canadian seaside resort, founded in 1783 by the United Empire Loyalists. This coastal town

This enchanting coastal hideaway has attracted royalty, celebrities and world travelers over the centuries... and now it's your turn!

ST. ANDREWS BY-THE-SEA - HALIFAX

Day 10: Enroute to Halifax, stop in the city of Moncton to experience the mysterious Magnetic Hill & have lunch at Magnetic Hill Wharf Village, drop into the Magnetic Hill Winery or try one of New Brunswick's top experiences; Shediac Bay Cruises' lobster educational cruise, located in the town of Shediac, known as "the lobster capital of the world". A perfect way to bid farewell to your Canadian Maritime exploration!



DESTINATION ST. JOHN'S

Breaching Whale

ST. JOHN'S - ARRIVAL

Day 1: Welcome to St. John's, the easternmost city in North America. It's the provincial capital of Newfoundland and Labrador, a lively port with great food, and music galore. Downtown is delightfully picturesque with intriguing architecture. You'll find boutiques, coffee bars, pubs and restaurants offering local and international fare. After a meal, follow your ears to some of the many music venues. There'll be something to suit your taste.

ST. JOHN'S

Day 2: Get ready for epic vistas and chat with the friendly folk. Signal Hill National Historic Site provides expansive views of the city and coast, and it is topped by Cabot Tower, where Marconi received the first wireless message. You'll learn of the earth's geological showcase at The Johnson Geo Centre, and The Fluvarium explores the secret life of a river, the watershed and its ecosystems. This is a city of churches, too, and both the Roman Catholic and Anglican cathedrals are named for St. John the Baptist.

ST. JOHN'S - CAPE SPEAR LIGHTHOUSE **NATIONAL HISTORIC SITE - ST. JOHN'S**

Day 3: Be immersed in the heritage garden and learn of varied plant species that grow in The Botanical Garden at Memorial University offering insight into the flora and fauna of the entire province. Next it's off to The Rooms, named for traditional fishing premises, and here gathered together as the museum, art gallery and archives. The very rich history and lively cultures of thousands of years are explored in exhibits and documents. On everyone's bucket list is standing on the most easterly point in North America, at Cape Spear Lighthouse National Historic Site. The lighthouse here dates from the 1840s, and the vista is as far as the eye can see.

ST. JOHN'S - THE AVALON PENINSULA - IRISH LOOP - ST. JOHN'S

Day 4: Today we visit Ferryland, site of an early 17th-century Colony of Avalon now being excavated by archaeologists. Then we hop on a tour boat to the Witless Bay Ecological Reserve and


go to meet whales and seabirds. Your entire trip is on the Avalon Peninsula - awarded "Top Coastal Destination In The World" by National Geographic.

ST. JOHN'S - CAPE ST. MARY'S ECOLOGICAL RESERVE - TRINITY - CLARENVILLE

Day 5: Drive southwest of St. John's to Cape St. Mary's Ecological Reserve also know as "the Cape". One of Newfoundland and Labrador's major seabird colonies. It is one of the best and most accessible places in the world to see nesting seabirds (gannets). Continue to Trinity, a picturesque town rich in history, friendly people and steadfast authenticity. The town offers beautifully restored fishing rooms and saltbox houses, historic buildings, and toprated dining experiences. Nearby you'll get a chance to hike along the coast on one of the provinces most popular trail, the Skerwink Trail - sea stacks, rocky beach overlooking the Trinity lighthouse. Or take a boat tour and see some of breathtaking coastline from a different perspective as you watch whales, birds, and icebergs.

CLARENVILLE - CAPE BONAVISTA

Day 6: Start your morning by visiting the oldest standing wooden church, Church of the Most

Holy Trinity in Trinity, Newfoundland built in 1833 with the tower added in 1880. From here, travel to Cape Bonavista where the Italian Explorer Giovanni Caboto or John Cabot as he is locally known first discovered North America in 1497. His first words were "O buono vista!" When translated in English, this phrase means "Oh happy sight!", which then became the town of Bonavista, the historic site of Cabot's landing.

BONAVISTA PENINSULA

Day 7: Make sure to visit Elliston's visitor center and Elliston's puffin viewing site which offers the closest view of puffins from land in North America. Enjoy a chance to walk the cliffs and stunning coastal views. Overnight in Bonavista.

ST. JOHN'S

Day 8: Spend the day in the historic port city of St. John's and maybe take time to explore the beautifully restored one room school and church dating back to the year 1879 or stroll the Memorial University's Botanical Garden. For lunch or dinner, you might want to try one the award winning restaurants by the sea. On your last full day in Newfoundland and Labrador you should not miss out on taking a walk through Downtown offering a wide variety of specialty shops, boutiques and galleries.

Great sites to visit include Miette Hot Springs, Medicine Lake, and Maligne Canyon.

JASPER NATIONAL PARK - LAKE LOUISE - CANMORE

Day 6: You'll proceed along the Icefields Parkway today, meandering through a landscape of peaks and glaciers before pausing to admire the picturesque alpine waters of Peyto Lake and Moraine Lake. The sparkling turquoise colors and the impressive glacier at Lake Louise are not to be missed. Take a moment to stop at the inspiring Columbia Icefield, where you may even be moved to embark on an unforgettable ride by "snowcoach" over the glacier's surface. Driving Distance: 177 MI / 284 KM







ANCHORAGE - ARRIVAL

SEWARD - TALKEETNA

Day 4: This morning, head back north towards Anchorage and the small town of Talkeetna, a charming pioneer town offering great views of Denali (Mt. McKinley). In addition to mountain views, Talkeetna is home to the convergence of three major glacial rivers, which make for great excursions. This evening we recommend taking a zip-line tour or exhilarating jet boat river tour, and en route to Talkeetna we recommend taking a detour through the Anton Anderson Memorial Tunnel, one of the longest vehicle tunnels in North America. Driving Distance: 238 MI / 383 KM

TALKEETNA - DENALI

Day 5: While you may never join the ranks of climbers who have summited Denali (Mt. McKinley), this morning, weather permitting, we recommend taking a flight-seeing tour among and above the Alaska Range. From the air, nature presents itself on a scale beyond your wildest imagination. We also recommend adding a glacier landing to get a sense of how immense these peaks really are. Afterwards, depart Talkeetna for the beautiful drive to Denali National Park and Preserve, the third largest park in the U.S. and the crown jewel of the Alaska Range. More than a mountain, Denali is six million acres of wild land bisected by one ribbon of road. Travelers along this road will see the relatively low-elevation taiga forest that gives way to high alpine tundra and snowy mountains, culminating in North America's tallest peak, Denali (Mt. McKinley). Driving Distance: 152 MI / 245 KM

DENALI

Day 2: Today, travel into the heart of Denali, a place where life continues as it has for thousands of years, without interference by man. The only road in the park, 92 mile long Denali Park Road, parallels the Alaska Range and travels through low valleys and high mountain passes. Along its route, beautiful landscapes appear at every turn, wildlife of all sorts can often be spotted and "The Mountain" can be seen as early as Mile 9 if the normally cloudy skies permit. During the summer, private vehicles can only drive the first fifteen miles of the road. Beyond Mile 15, the road turns to gravel and traffic is primarily restricted to buses. We therefore encourage you to take either the hop-on, hop-off park shuttle bus or a tour bus as this is the way to experience the park to a greater degree.

DENALI - ANCHORAGE

Day 7: Should you want to explore Denali beyond the Park Road before returning to Anchorage, we recommend treating yourself to an unforgettable experience – river rafting on the glacially-fed Nenana River. 


